SURVEY METHOD


This survey was conducted online within the United States from June 24-25, 2018 among 1,448 registered voters by The Harris Poll.

Results were weighted for age within gender, region, race/ethnicity, marital status, household size, income, employment, education, political party, and political ideology where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Propensity score weighting was also used to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online.

Pollsters Mark Penn, Prof. Stephen Ansolabehere, and Dritan Nesho supervised the poll.




























Do you think current border security is adequate or inadequate?






Do you think increased illegal immigration reduces wages to workers, increases them, or has no effect on wages to workers?









Do you think that people who illegally cross into the country should be prosecuted for illegally entering or not?














Who do you think was to blame for the recent separations of children and parents at the border - the administration or the parents?







What do you think is the best way to deter illegal immigration?
























Do you support or oppose the United States suspending military exercises with South Korea as a good will gesture and concession for getting the negotiations about North Korea's denuclearization started?











Do you approve or disapprove of the administration's order to impose a 25 percent tariff on imported steel and a 10 percent levy on imported aluminum?





















Do you support or oppose the United States using the threat of tariffs on products from G7 ally countries if they don't take steps to reduce U.S. trade deficits with their countries?




What do you think the likely outcome of the President using tariffs as a negotiating tactic will be?























Inspector General Report Finding	Heard About	Top 2 Concern
The report finds that former FBI director James Comey departed from policy and practice by making a public announcement revealing that Clinton would not be charged in the case. It calls Comey "insubordinate" and says the announcement violated protocol and "usurped" the authority of the Attorney General in making it, who should have made the decision on the announcement.	72%	36%
The report finds that Comey "made a serious error in judgment" by publicly notifying Congress, just days before Election Day, that the FBI had discovered additional Clinton emails and would reopen the investigation.	67%	33%
The report found that the big decisions in the Clinton case were not motivated by political bias. Of the decision not to charge Clinton, the inspector general "found no evidence that the conclusions by the prosecutors were affected by bias or other improper considerations; rather, we determined that they were based on the prosecutors' assessment of the facts, the law and past department practice."	59%	26%
The report found no evidence Comey's public statement about the closing of the case nor his notification to Congress was influenced by "an effort to influence the election" or "political preferences" respectively.	59%	14%
The report surfaces politically biased text messages by a handful of FBI employees, including counterintelligence agent Peter Strock, who was responsible for leading the Clinton email probe and opening the Trump-Russia investigation. The report found that the communications, many derogatory of Trump, were "deeply troubling" and "cast a cloud" over the handling of the Clinton email investigation.	61%	32%
The inspector general singles out an August 2016 text exchange in which Strzok tells Lisa Page, an advisor to deputy-FBI Director Andrew McCabe, "we'll stop" then-candidate Trump from being elected. The report says the text is "not only indicative of a biased state of mind but, even more seriously, implies a willingness to take official action to impact the presidential candidate's electoral prospects."	53%	30%
Some of the same agents in the Clinton investigation were also involved in the early months of the FBI's investigation into Russian election interference. Investigators were particularly skeptical of Strzok, saying they couldn't be confident his personal decision to prioritize the Russia investigation over the Clinton probe "was free from bias" because of the nature of his text messages.	51%	28%












Do you believe the investigation of Hillary Clinton and the Clinton foundation was objective, was tilted in her favor, or was tilted against her?



Do you think former FBI director James Comey acted properly or improperly in the investigation of Hillary Clinton's email server?




Do you think the actions of the FBI and CIA in the Hillary email case and Trump Russia case need to be investigated or not?





If the Special Counsel Has Found No Collusion...




Do you think President Trump should testify or decline to testify in front of Robert Mueller?





VOTERS ARE SPLIT ON WHETHER THE MEDIA IS FAIR TO PRESIDENT TRUMP


Do you think the media has been fair or unfair to Donald Trump?




Do you think that the Special Counsel investigation has acted appropriately towards people like Michael Flynn or act inappropriately?



Do you favor or oppose appointing a special counsel to investigate potential abuses at the FBI?


