SURVEY METHOD

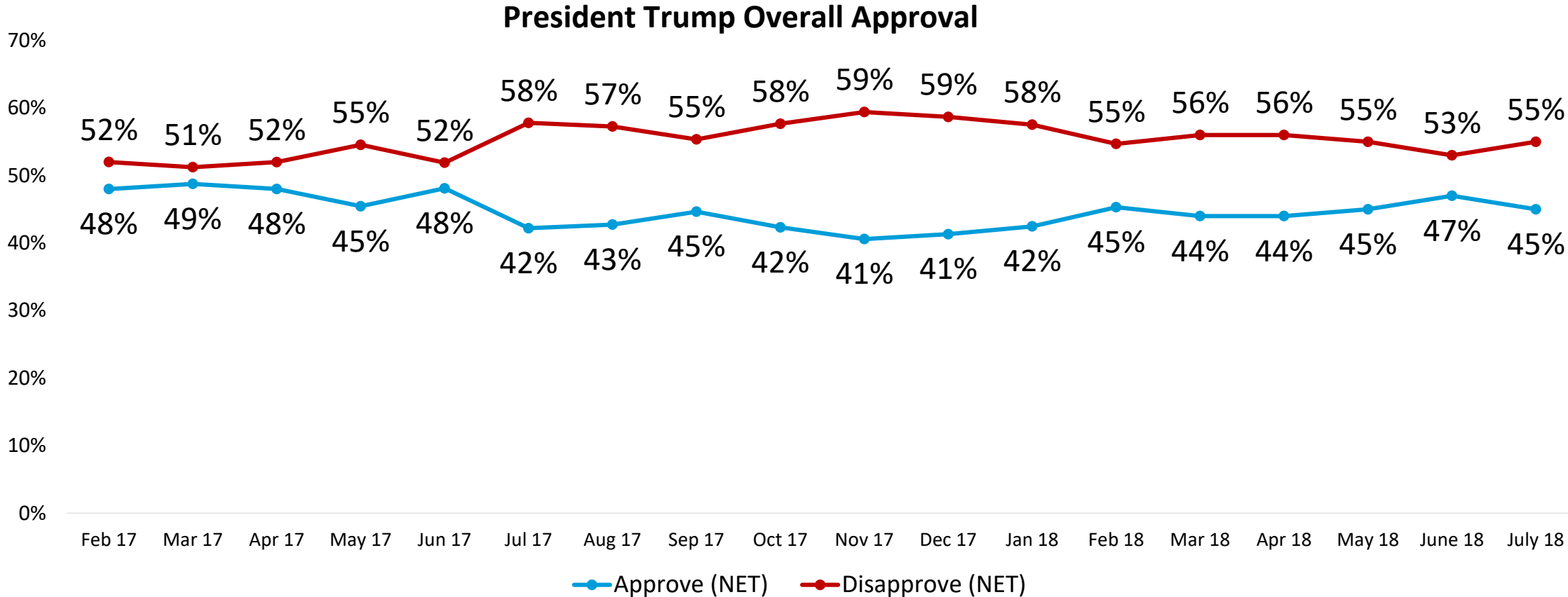
This survey was conducted online within the United States from **July 24-25, 2018** among **1,323 registered voters** by The Harris Poll.

Results were weighted for age within gender, region, race/ethnicity, marital status, household size, income, employment, education, political party, and political ideology where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Propensity score weighting was also used to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online.

Pollsters Mark Penn, Prof. Stephen Ansolabehere, and Dritan Nesho supervised the poll.

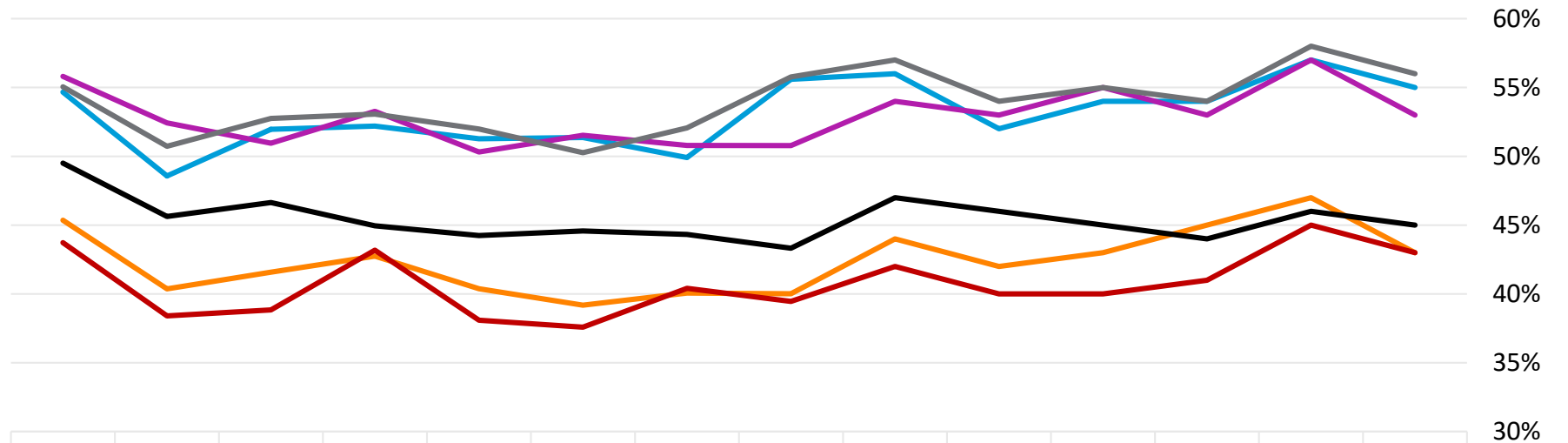

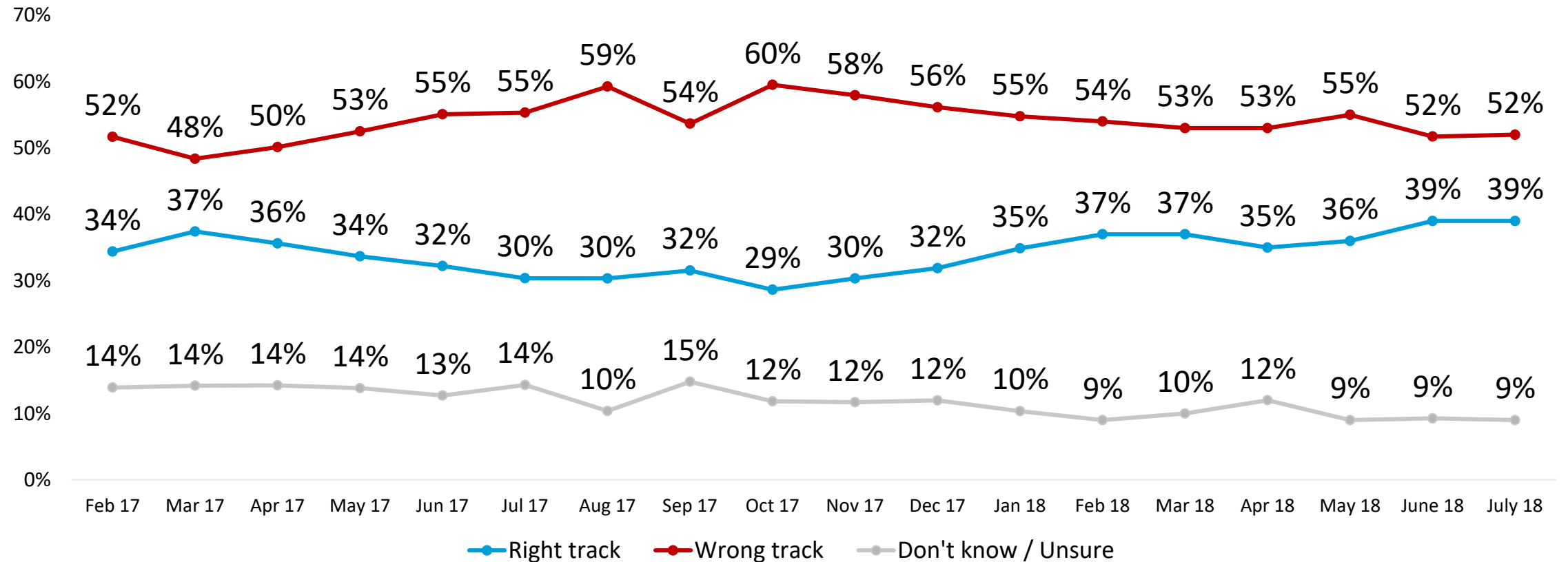

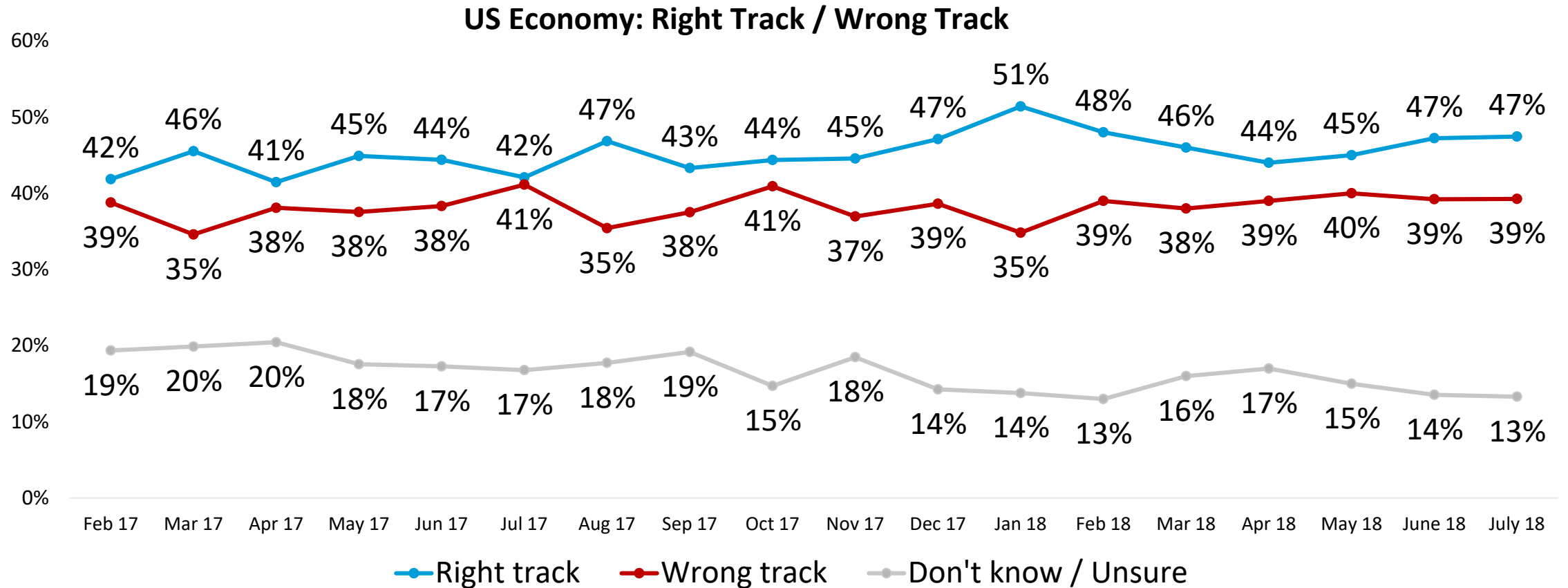
County: Right Track / Wrong Track

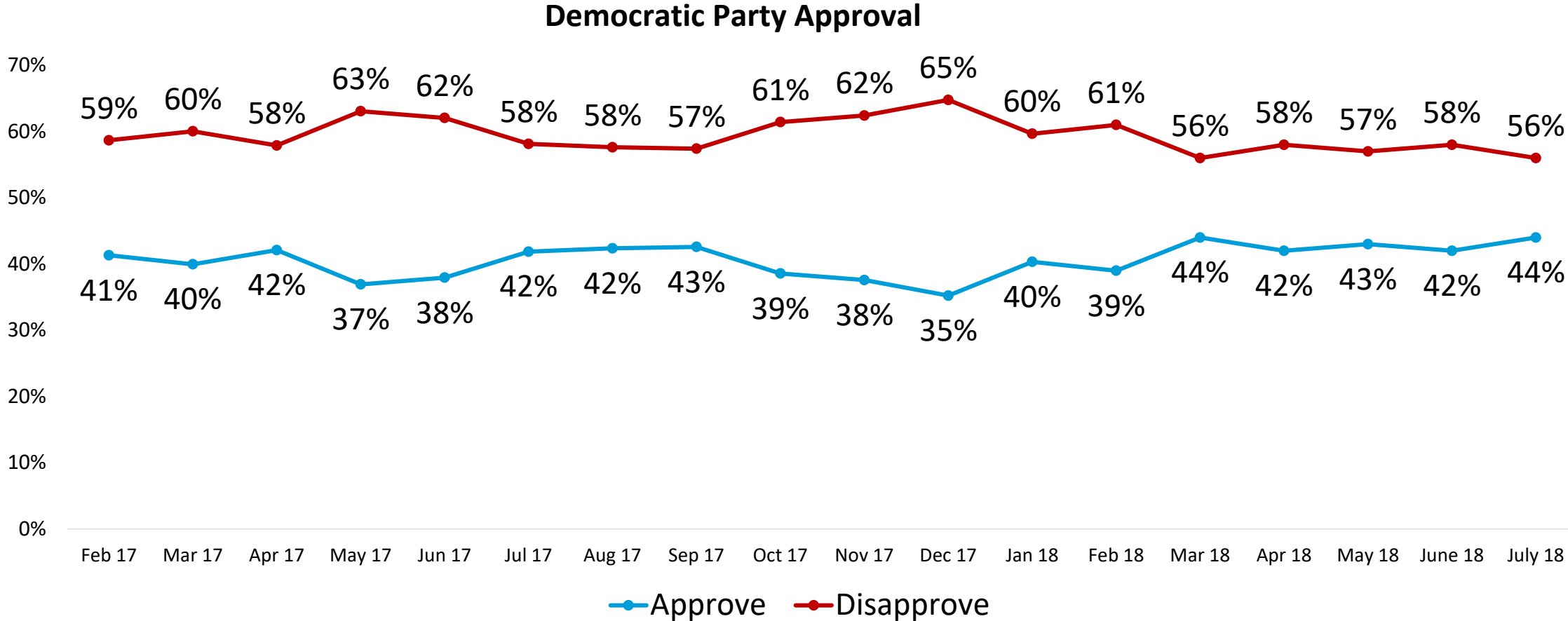

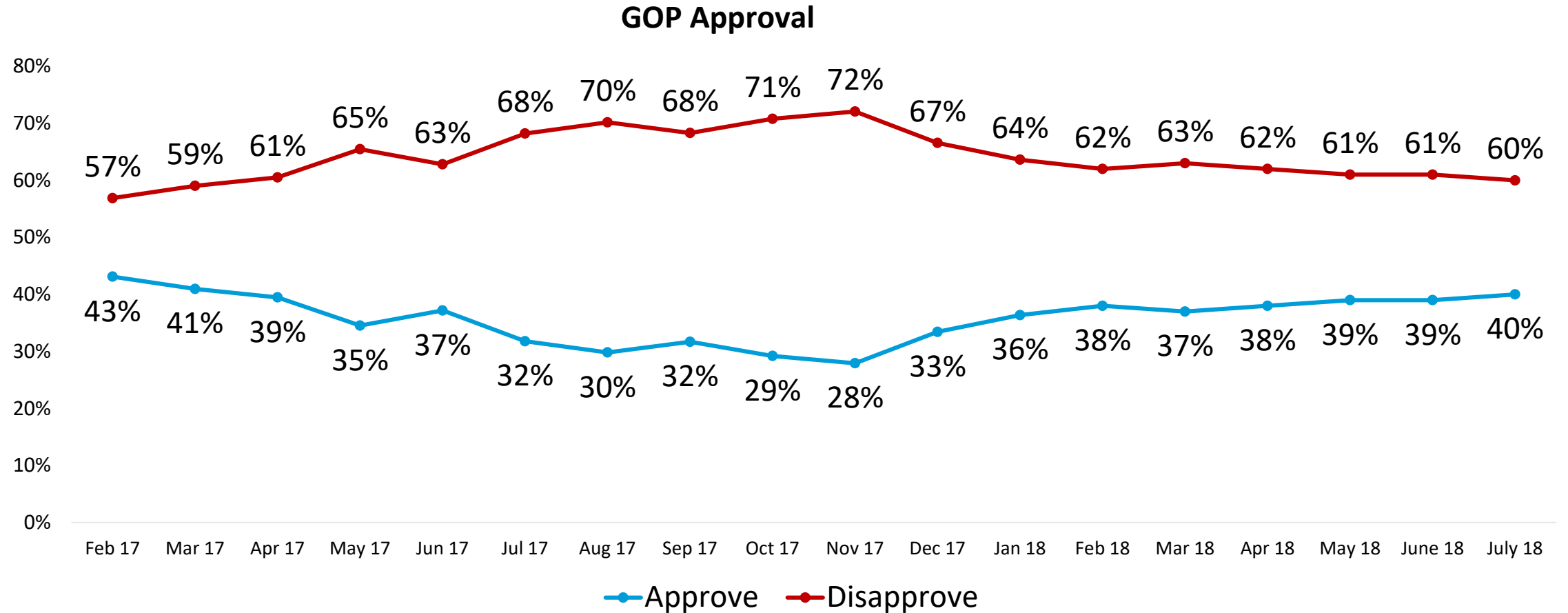

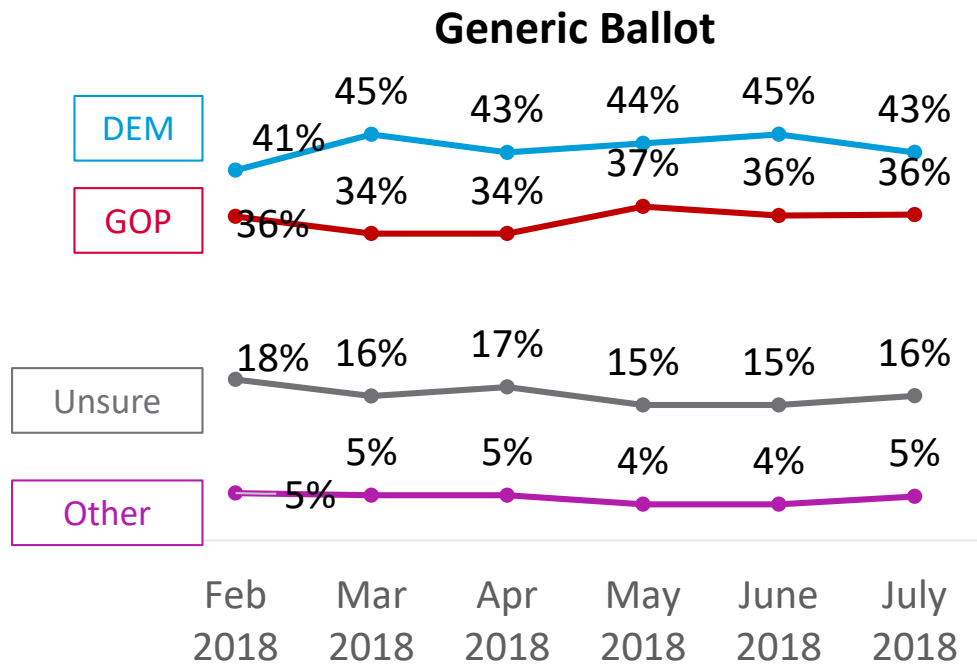

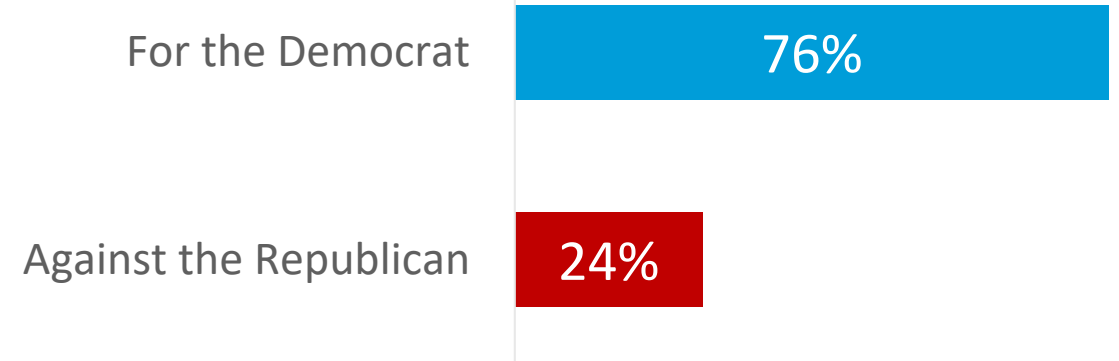

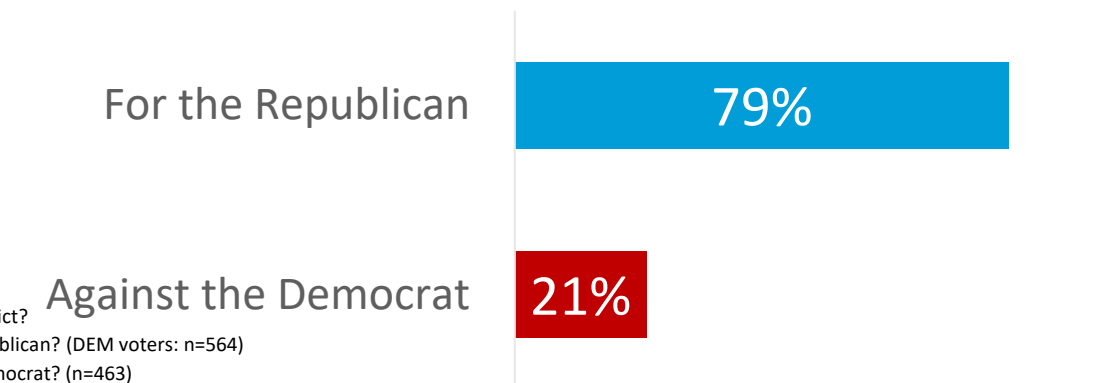

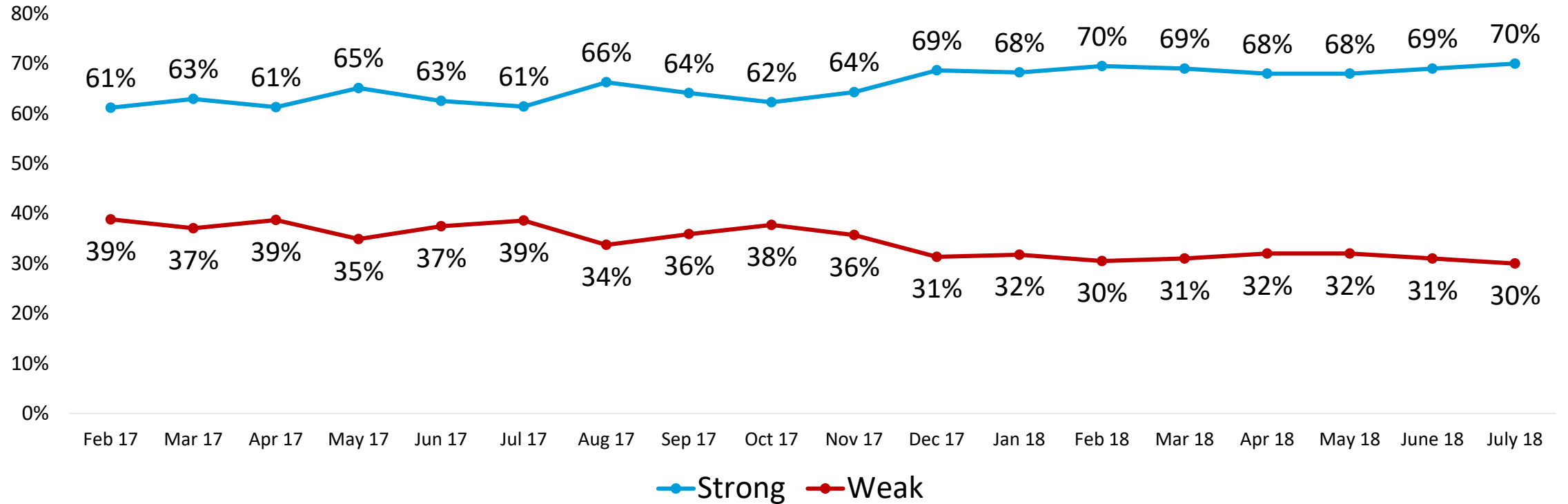

How strong do you think the U.S. economy is today?

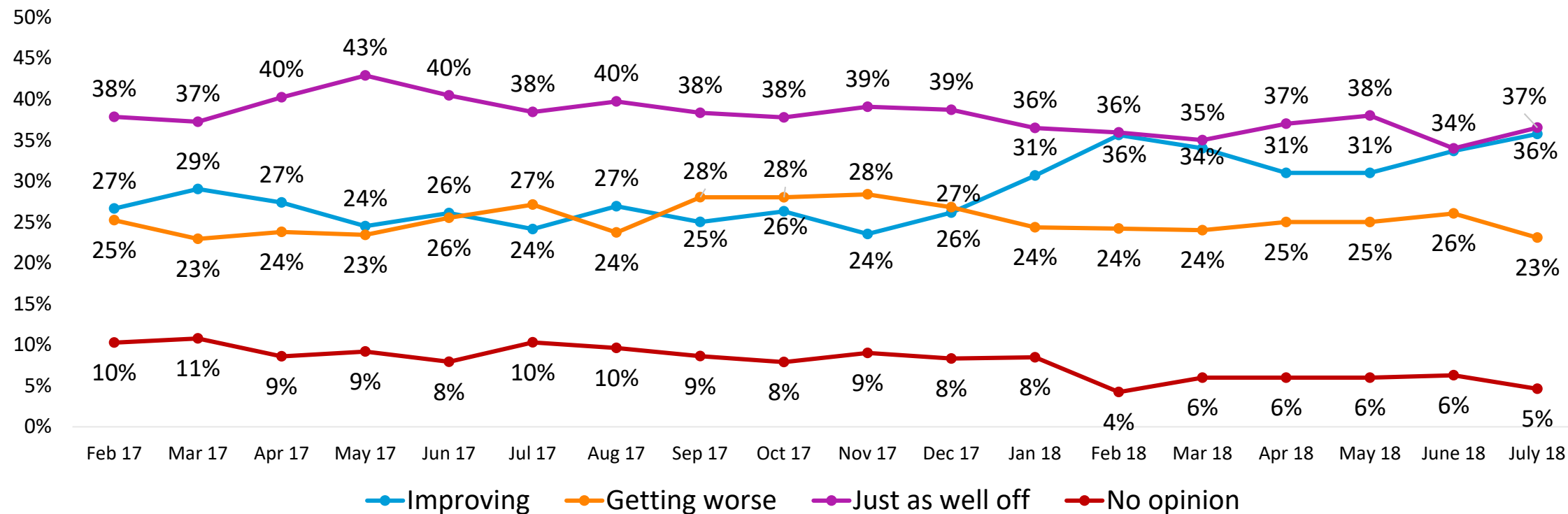

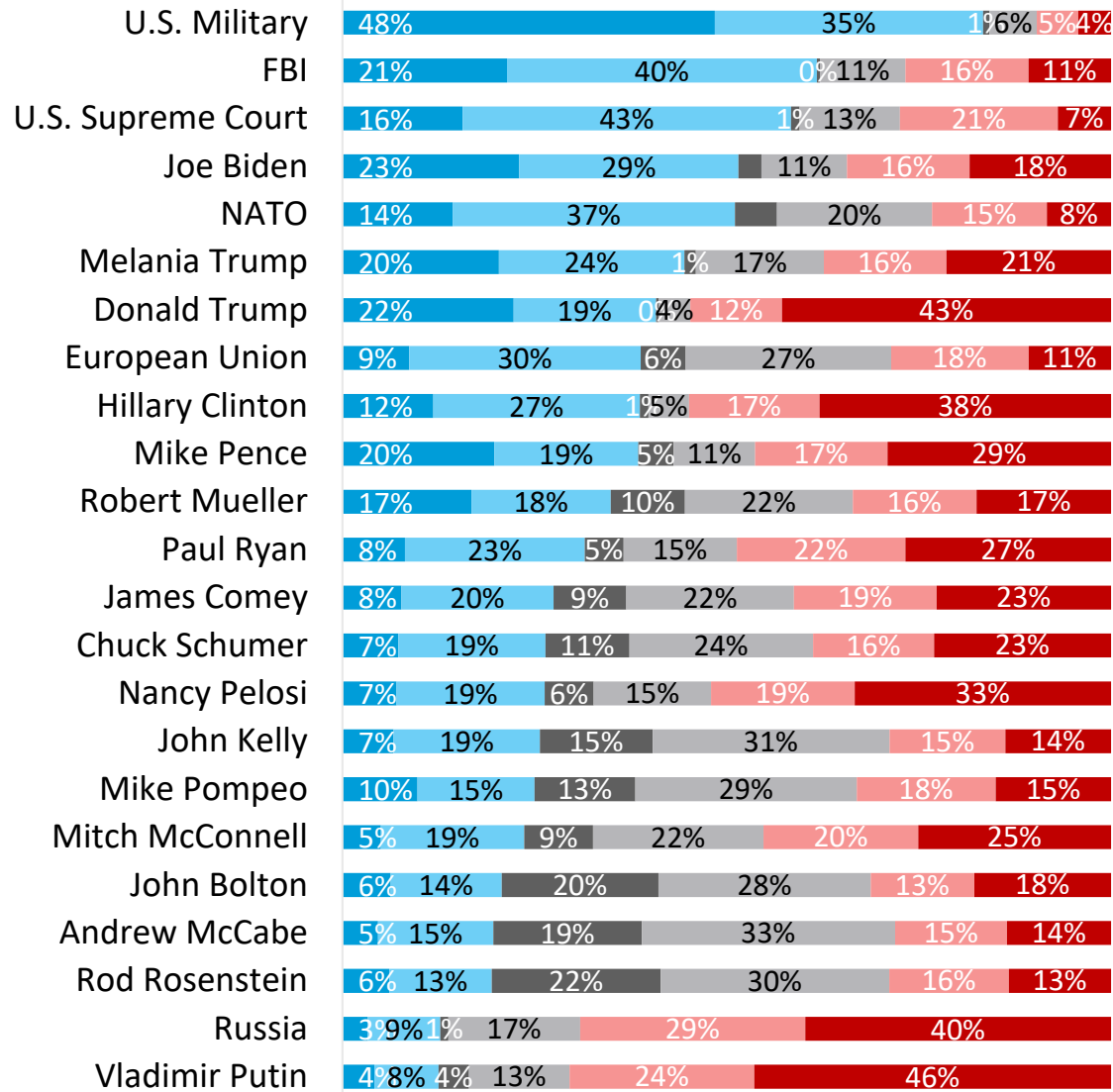
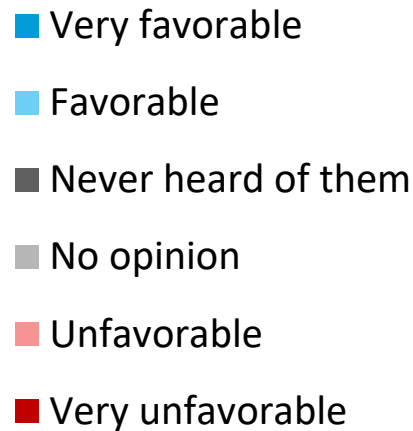

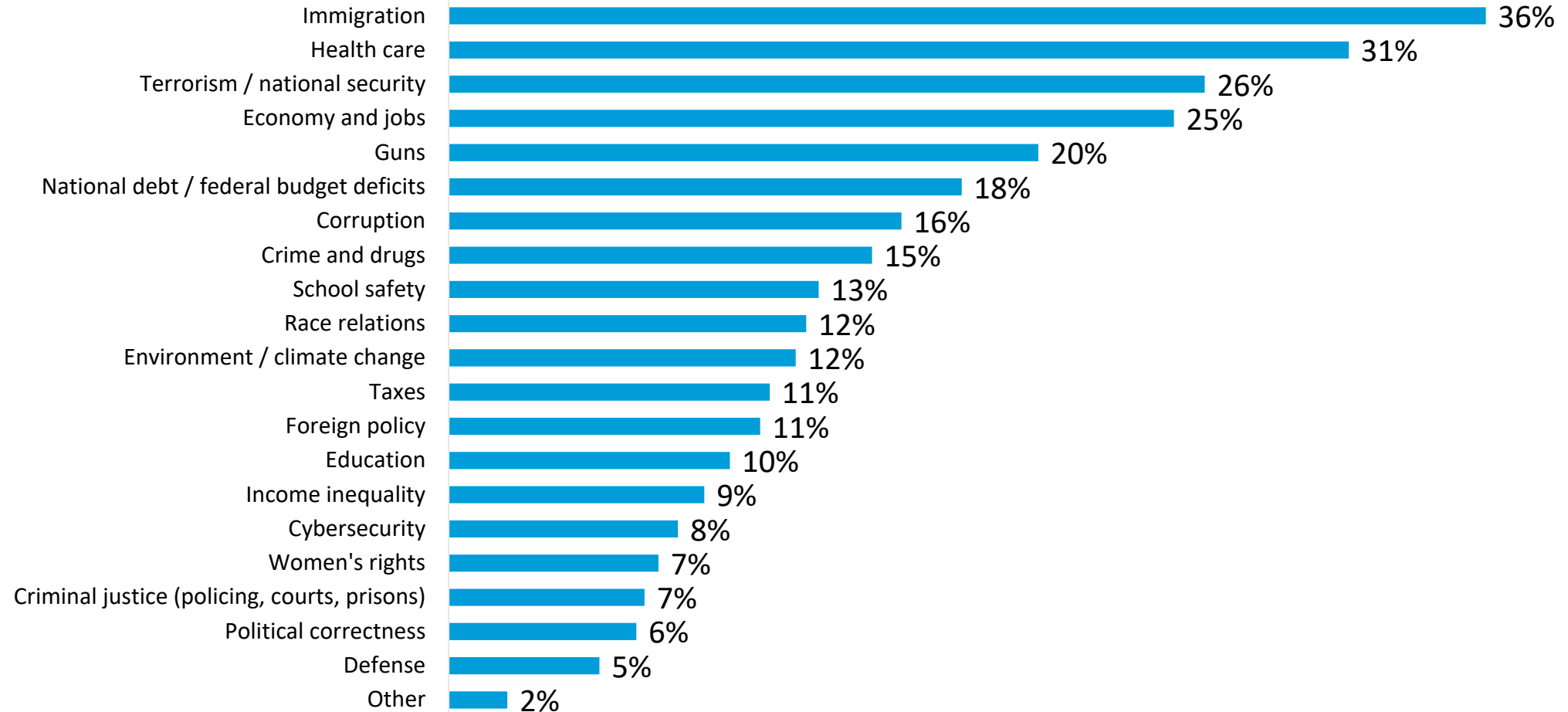

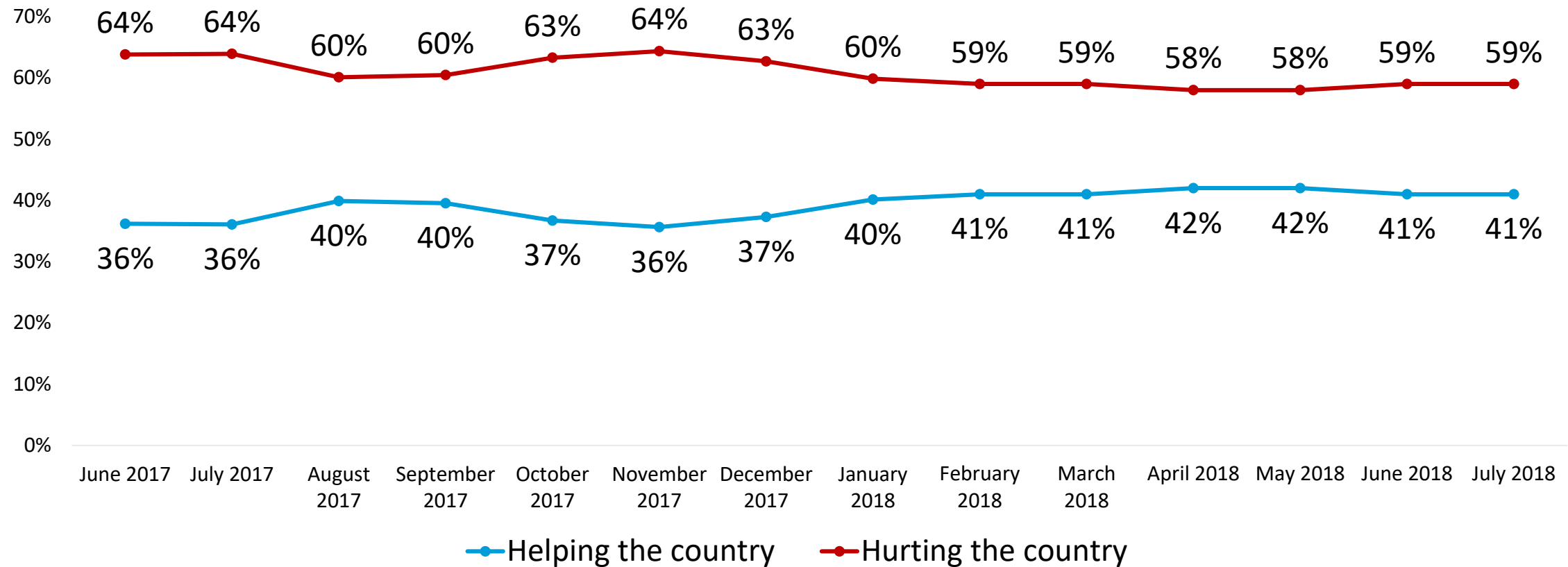

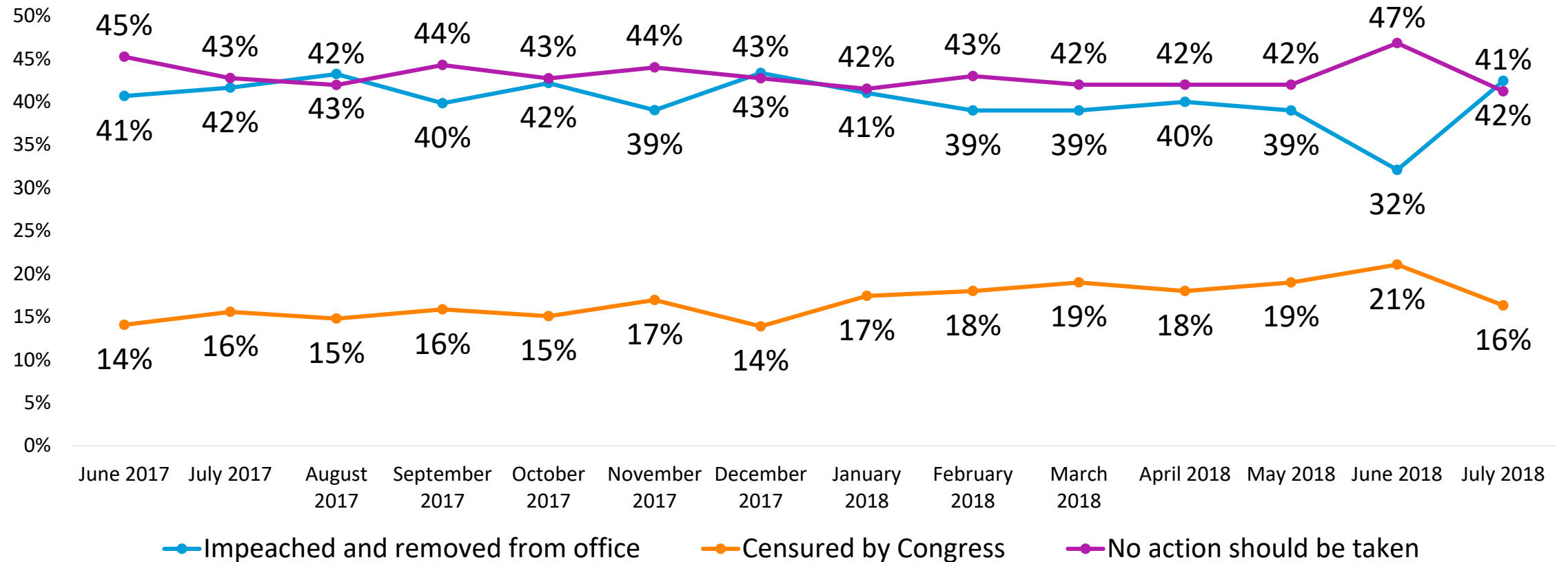

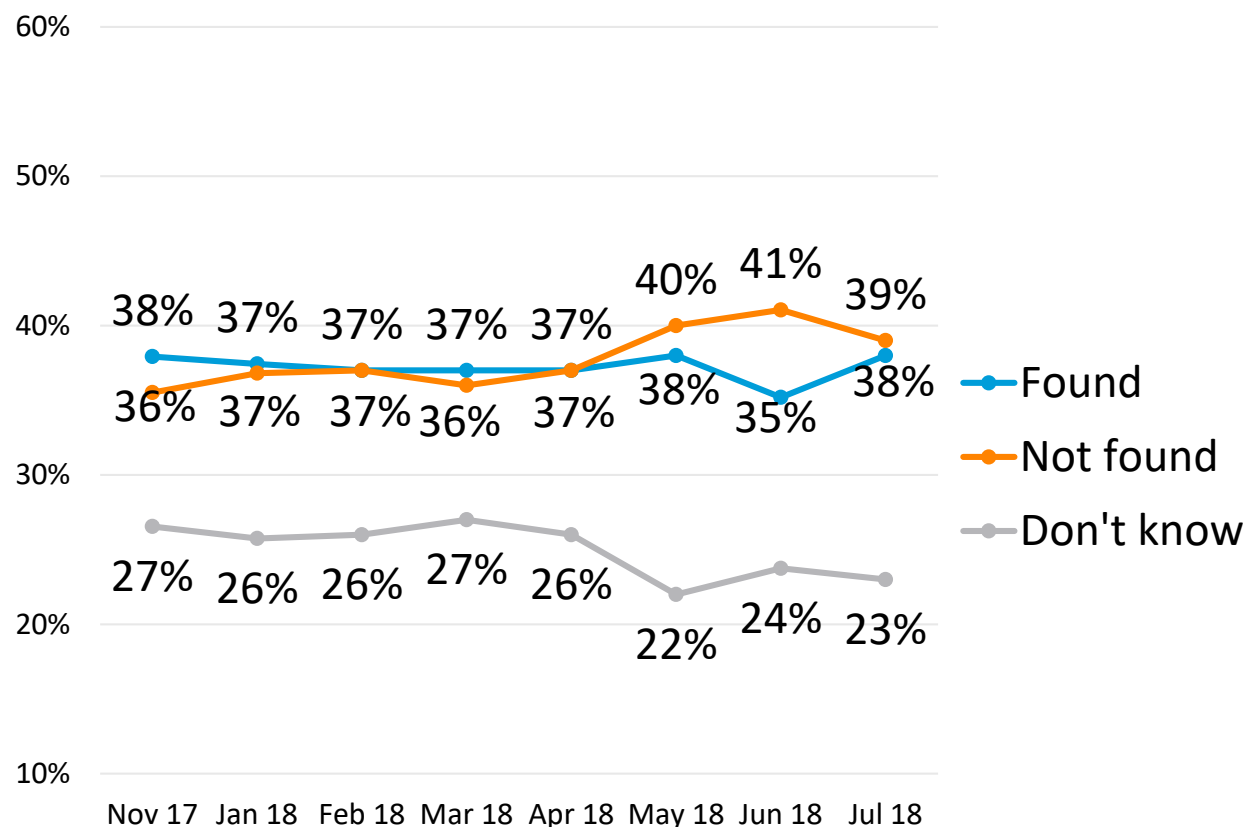

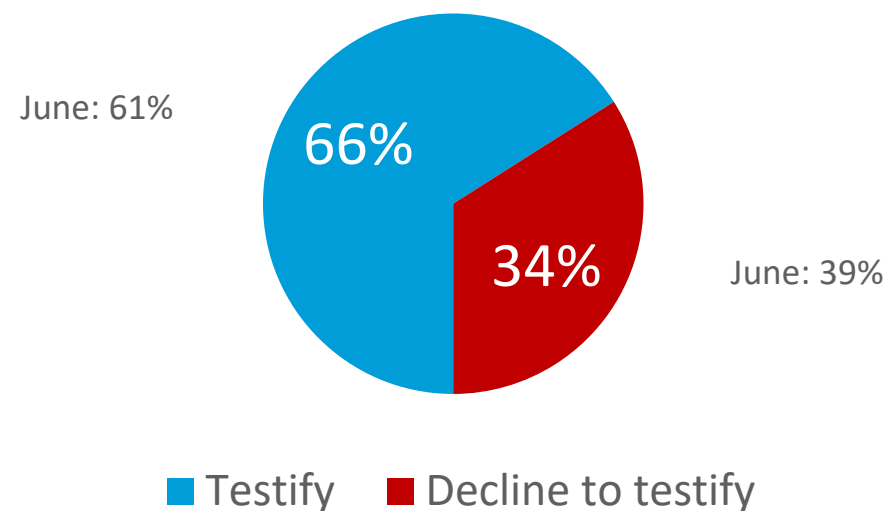

Do you think President Trump should testify or decline to testify in front of Robert Mueller?



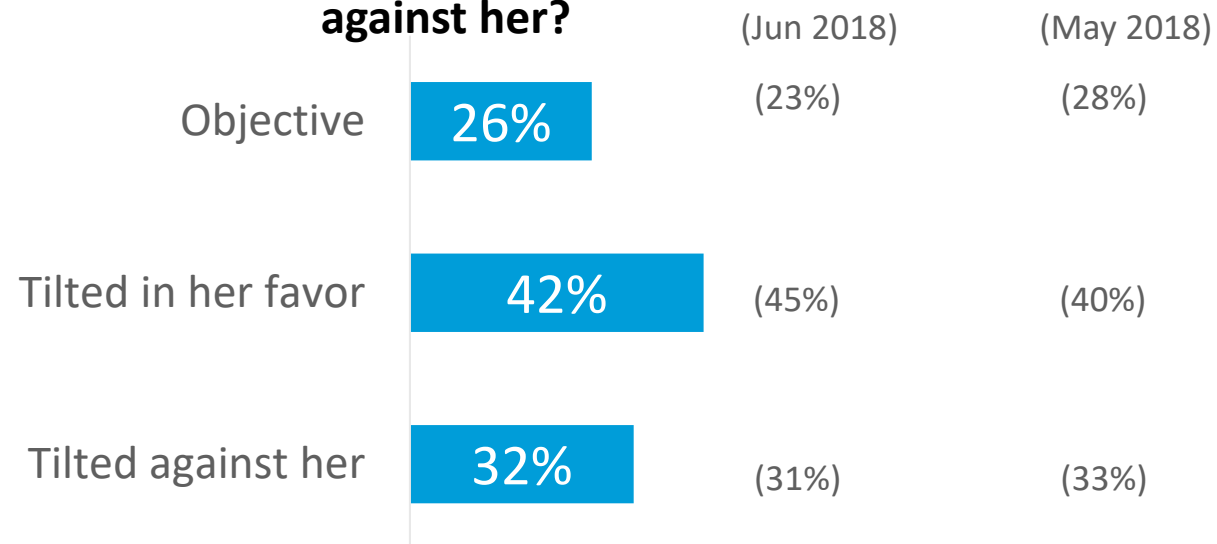

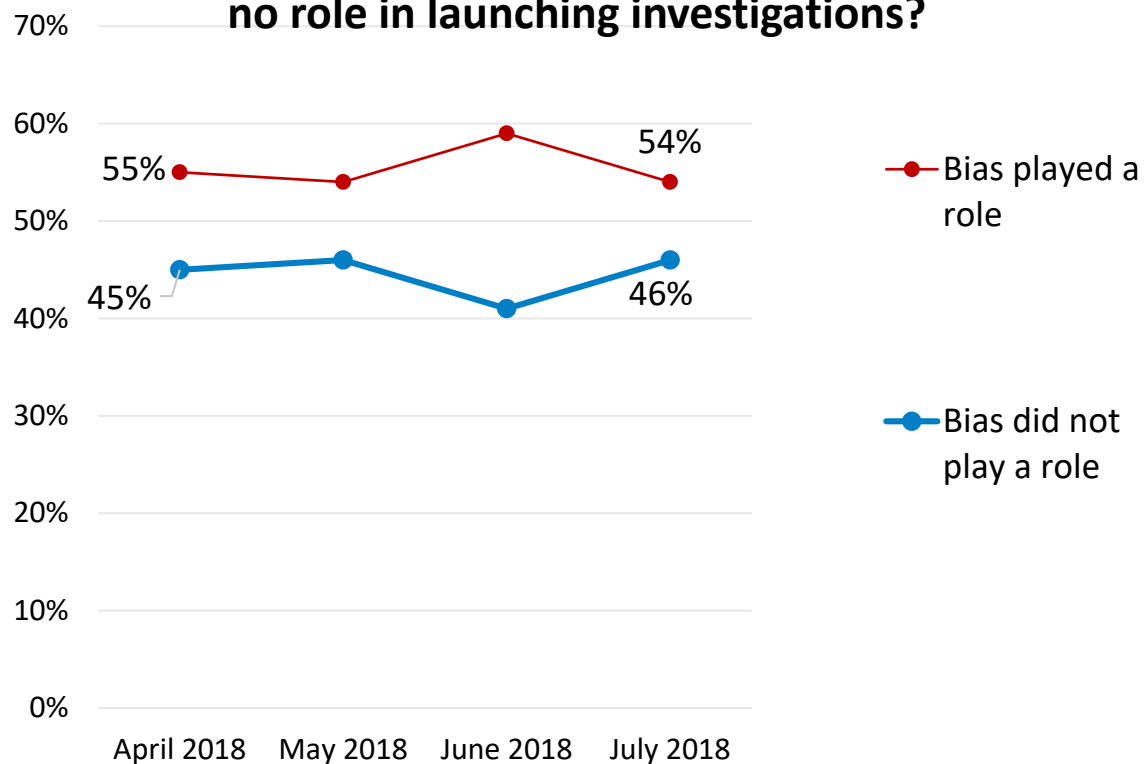

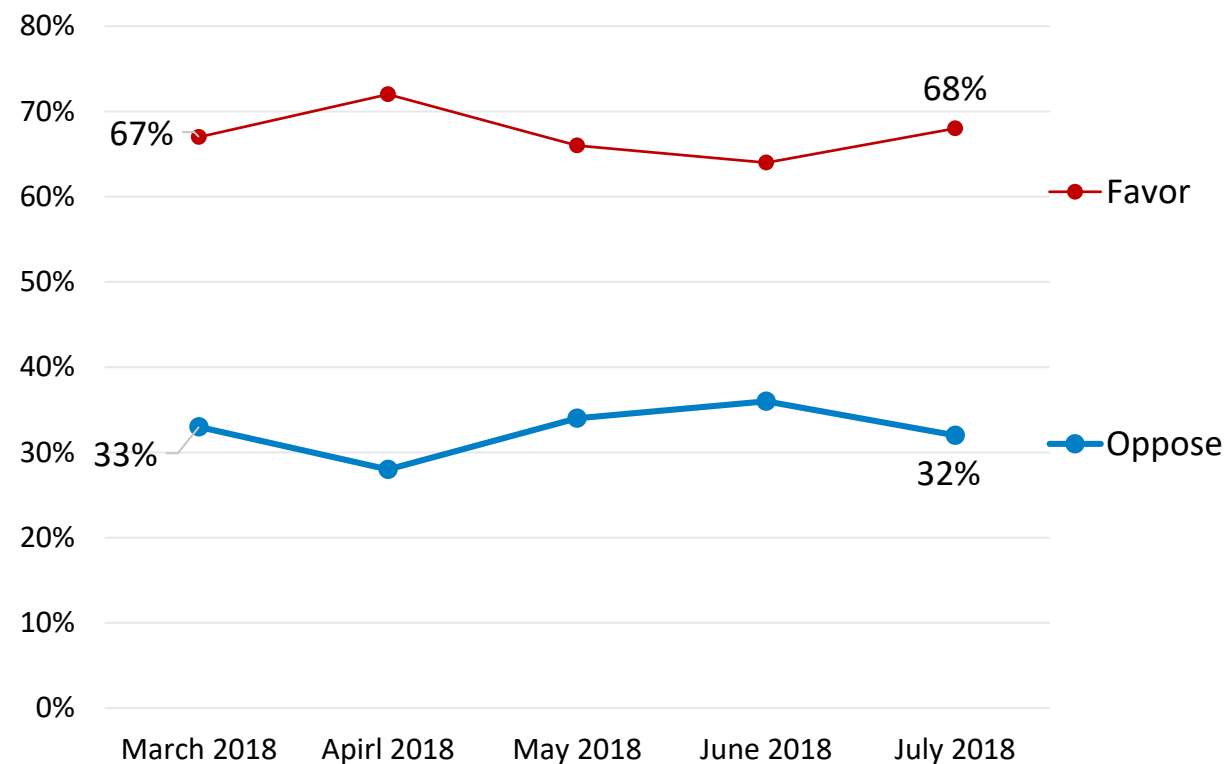

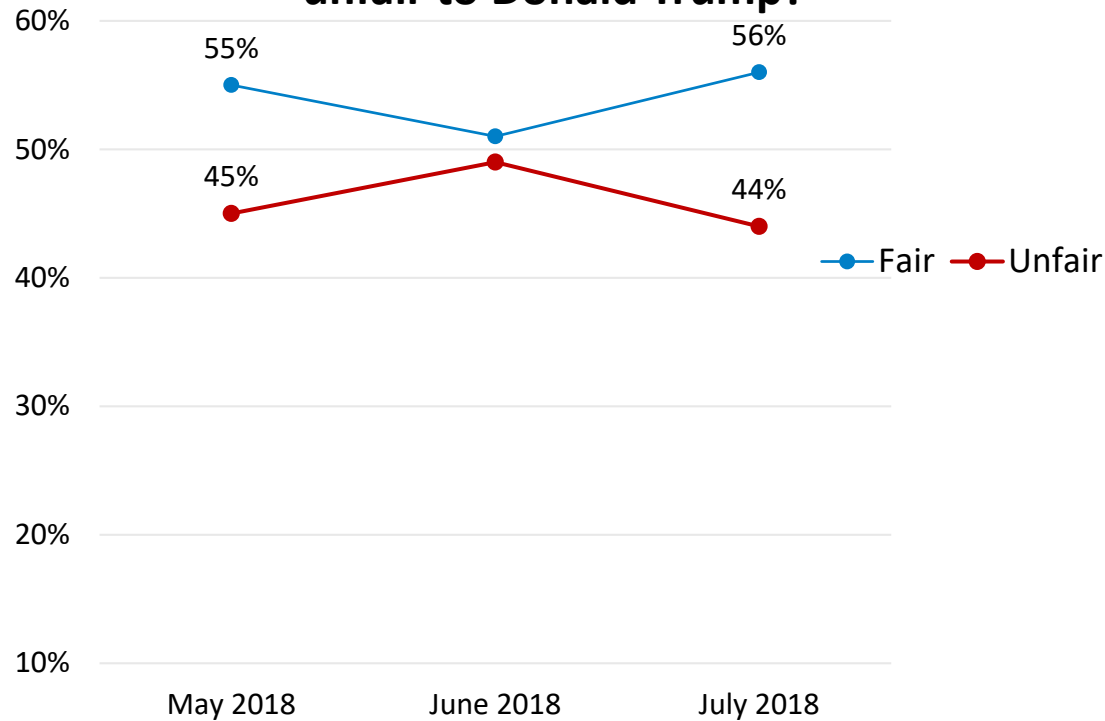

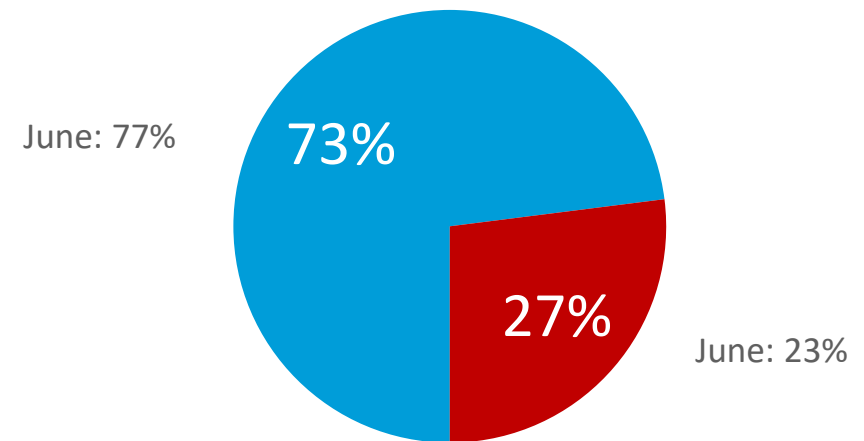

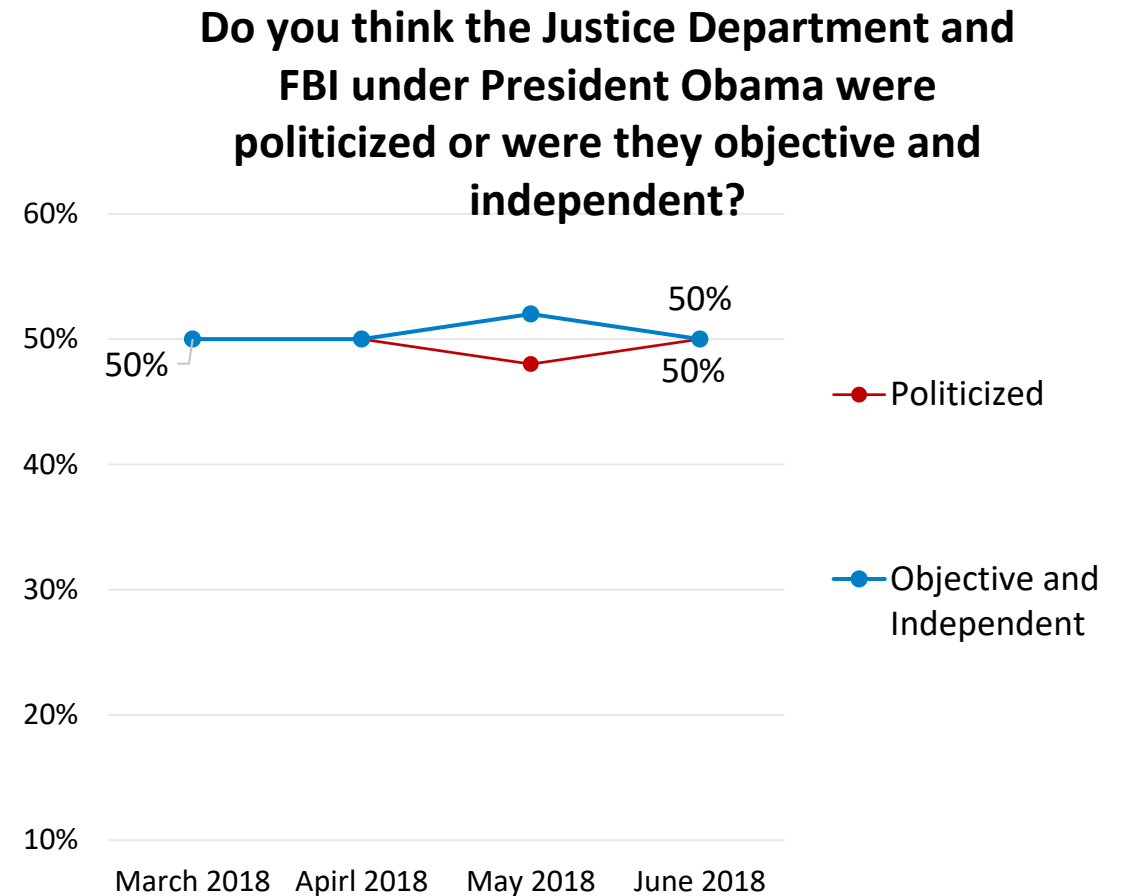

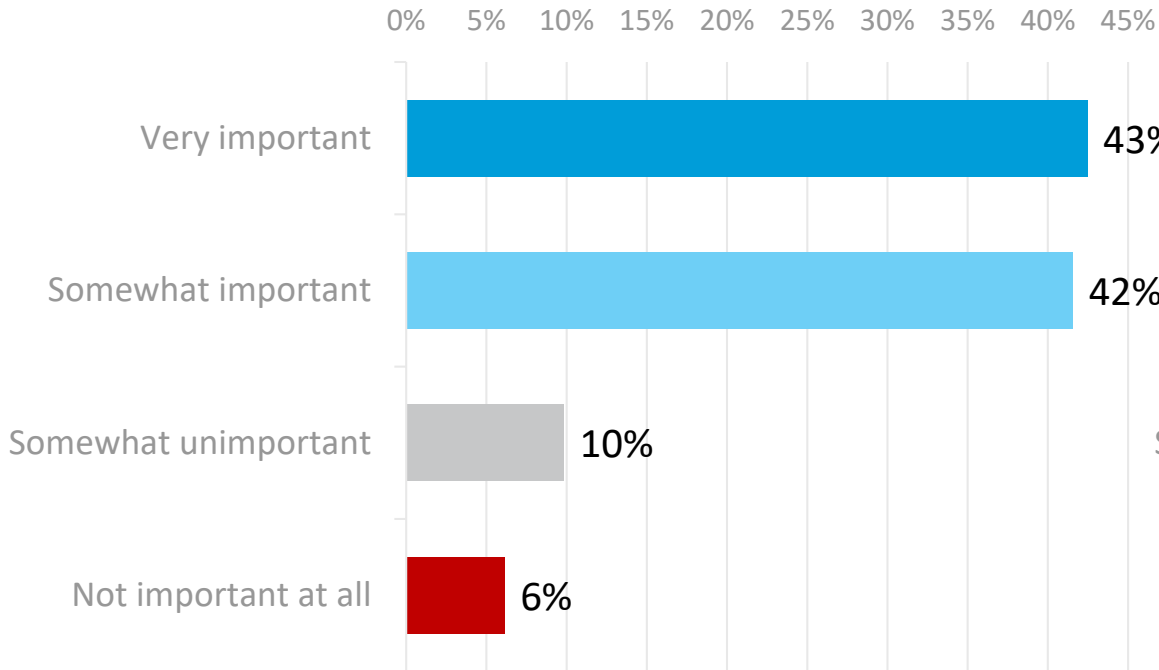

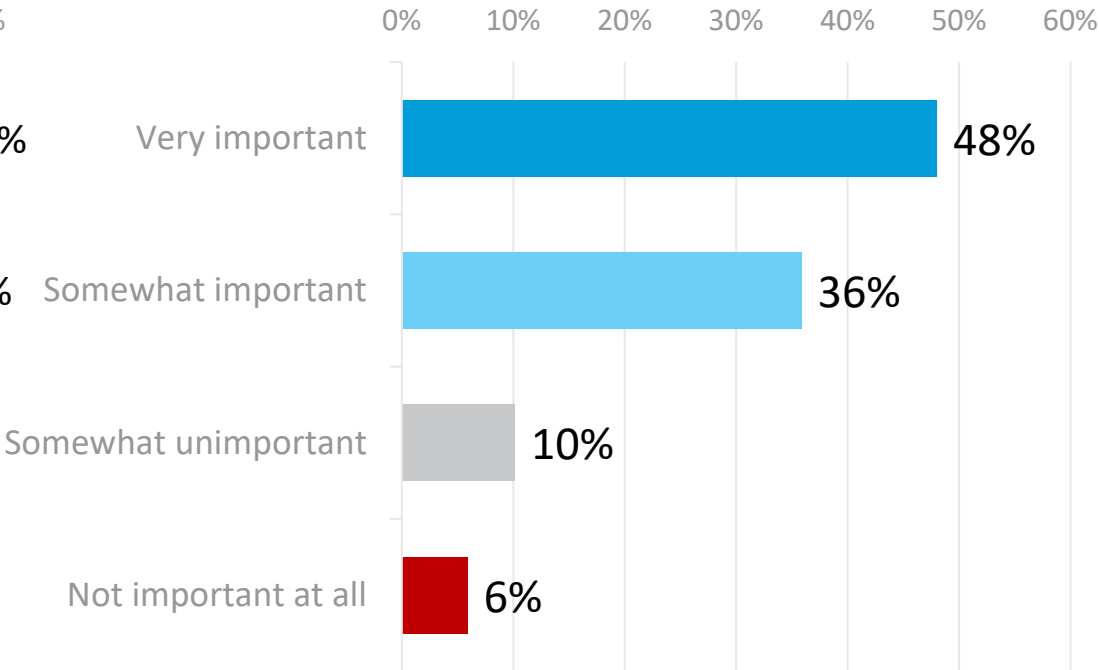

How important is NATO to the United States' national safety and security?



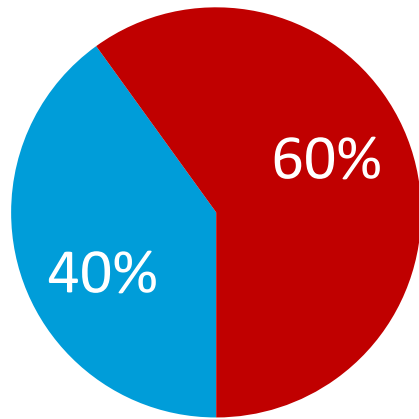
How important is it for the United States to be a member of NATO?

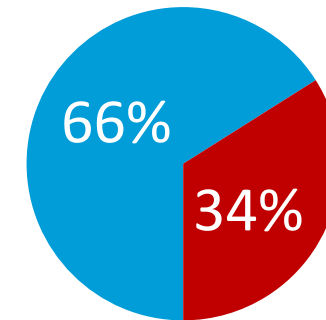

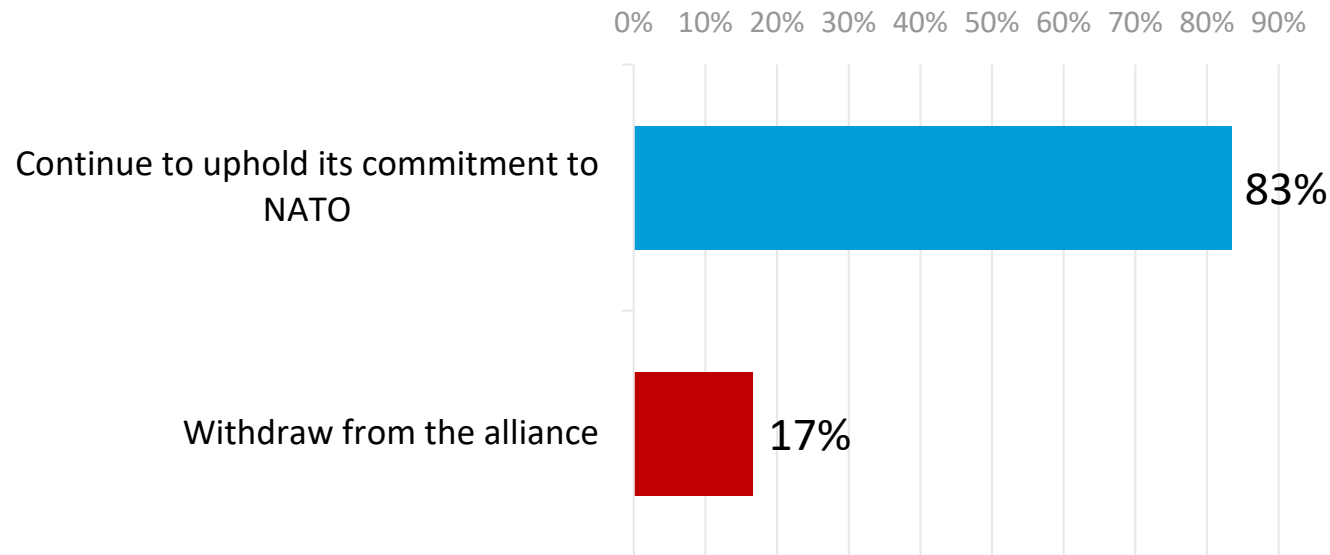

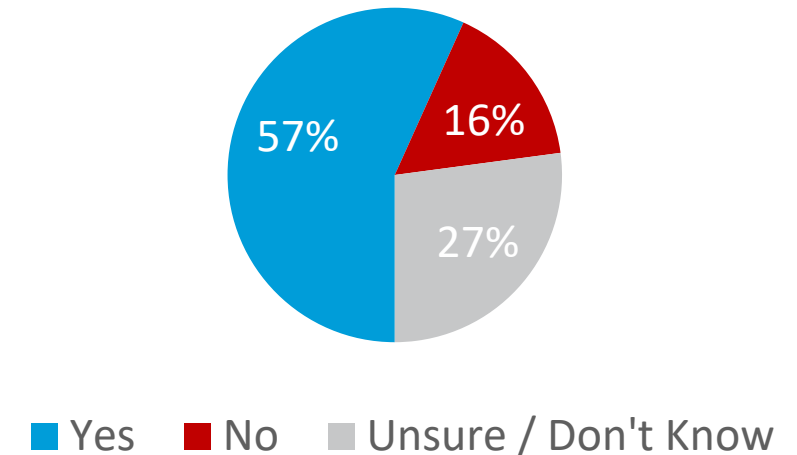

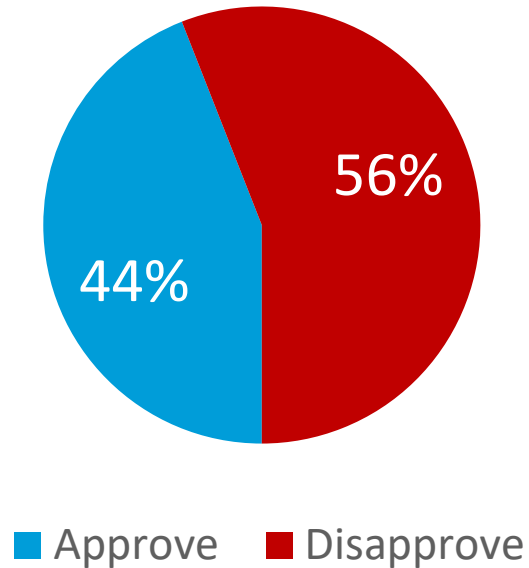

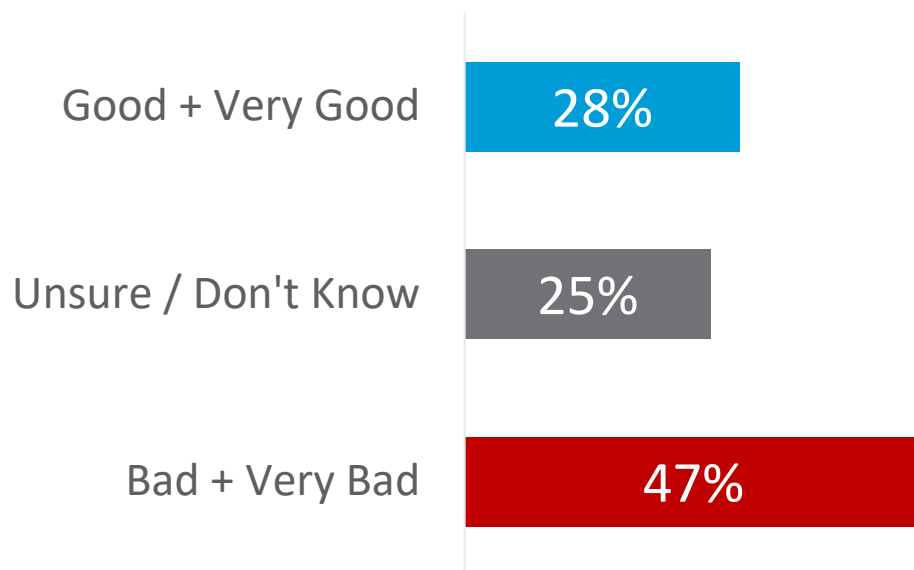

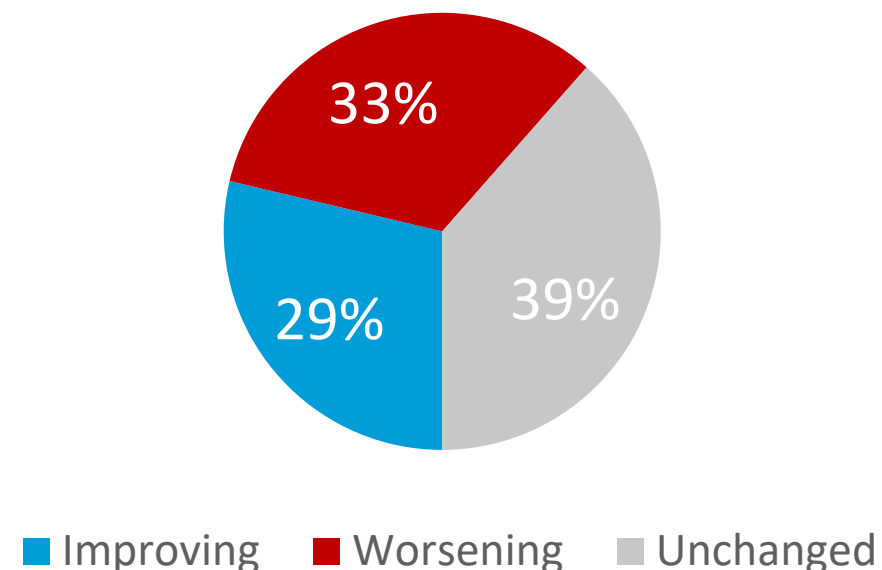

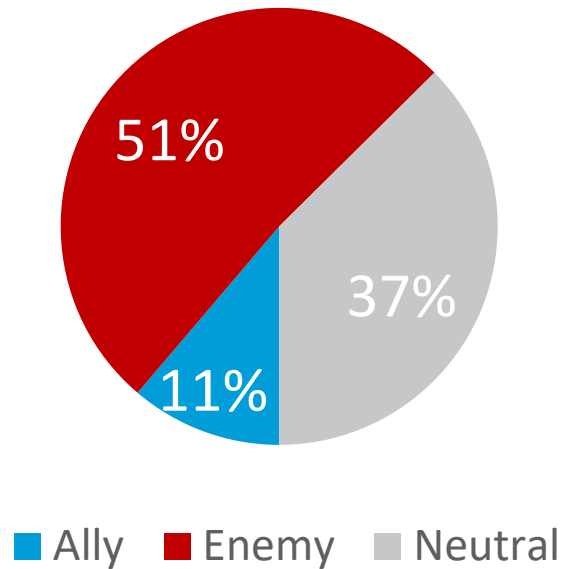

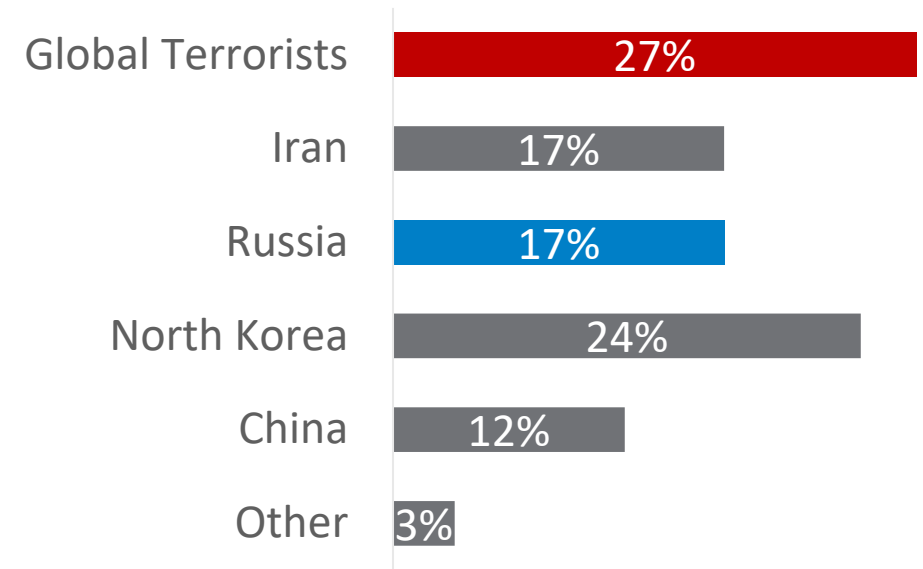

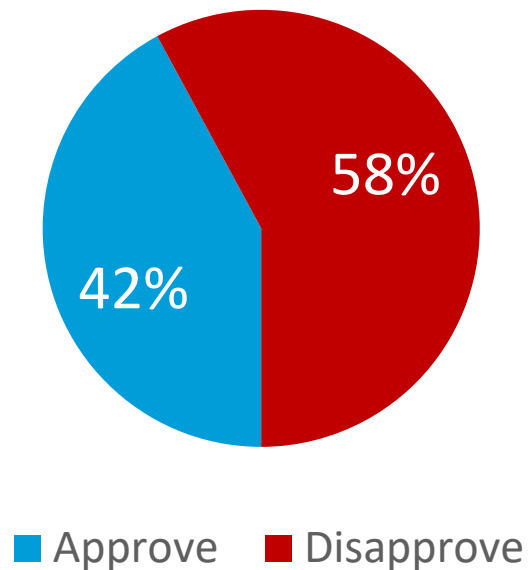

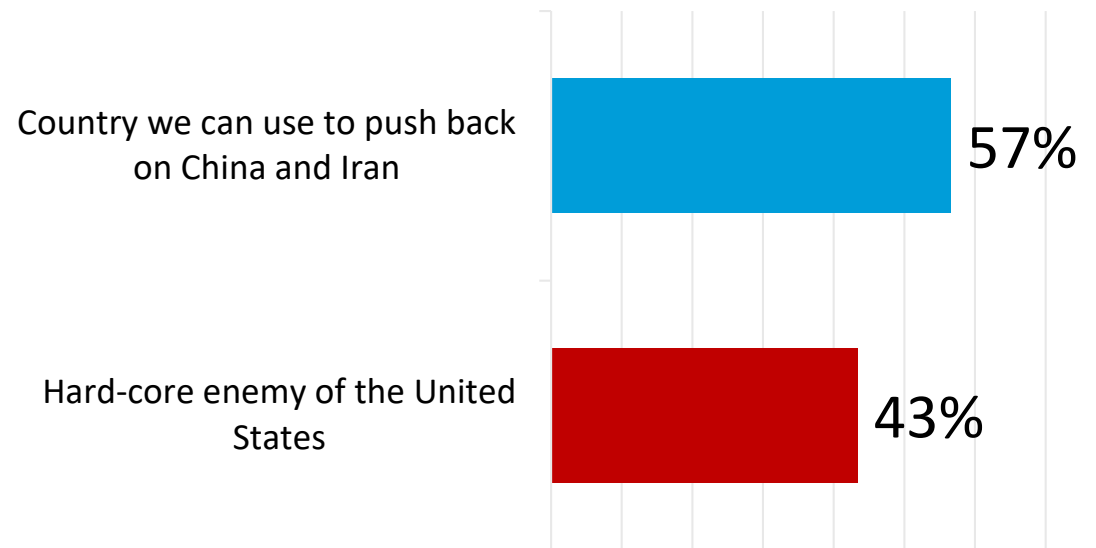

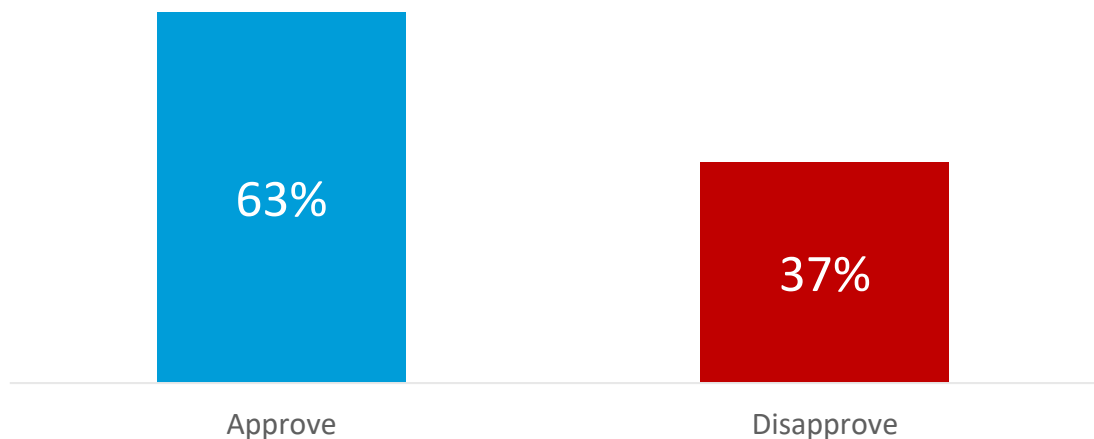

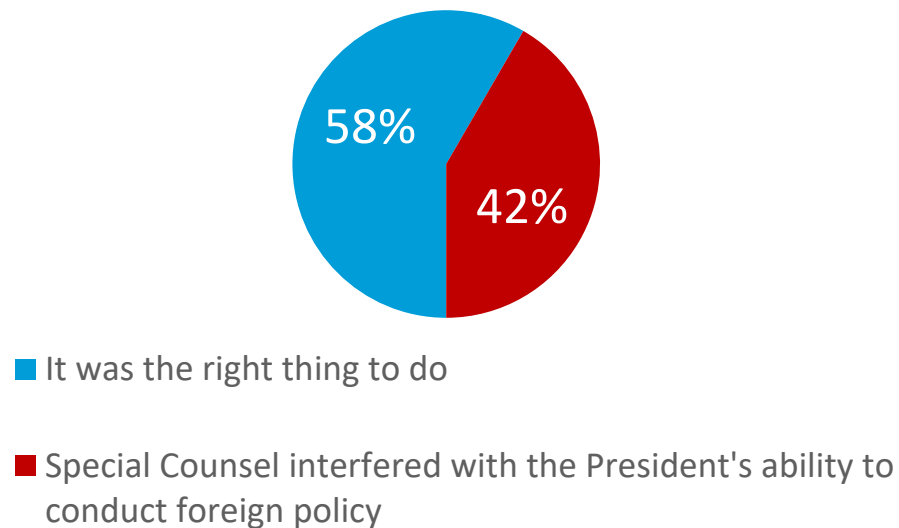

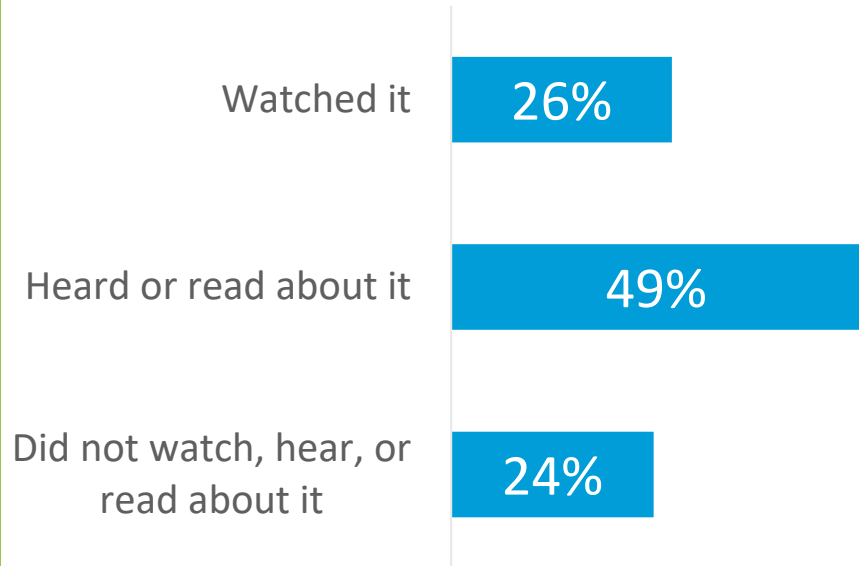

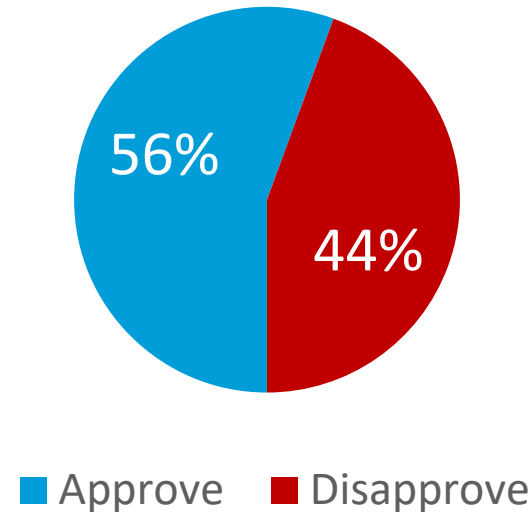

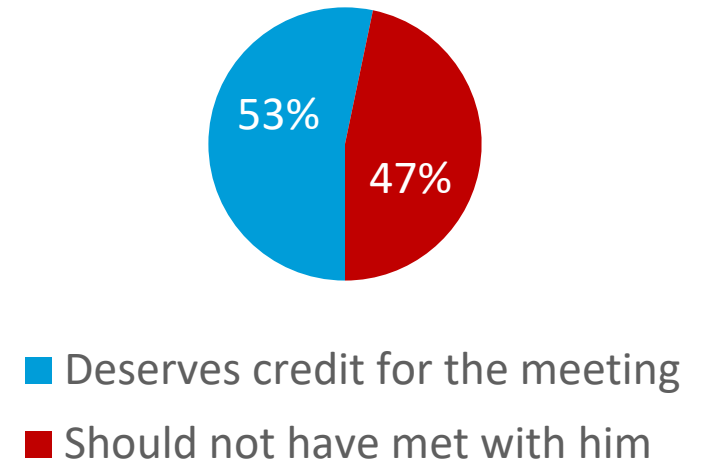

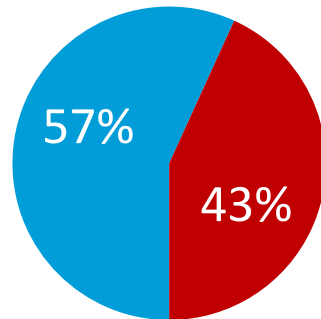

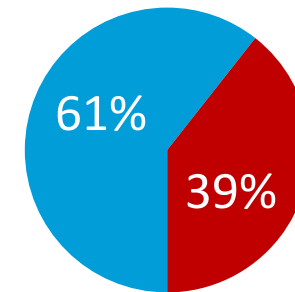

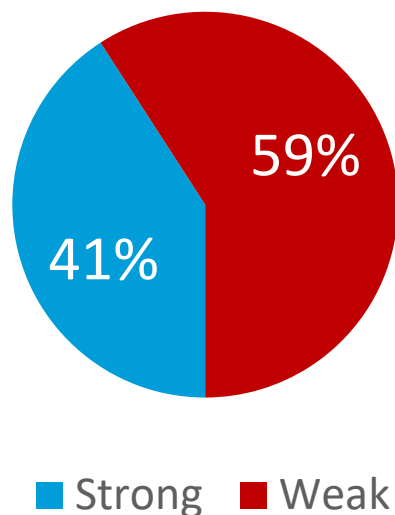

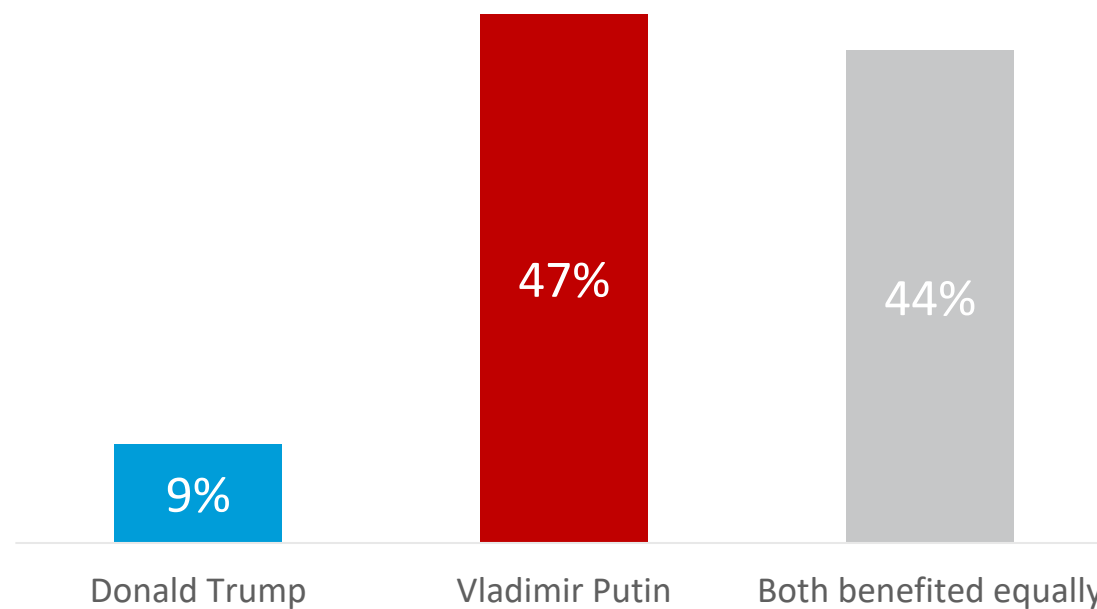

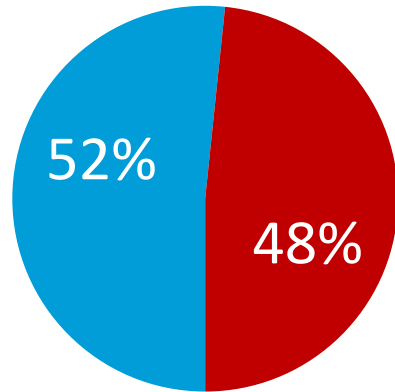

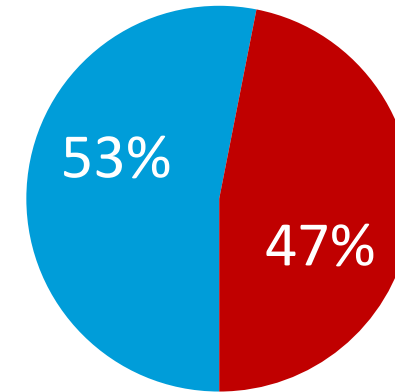

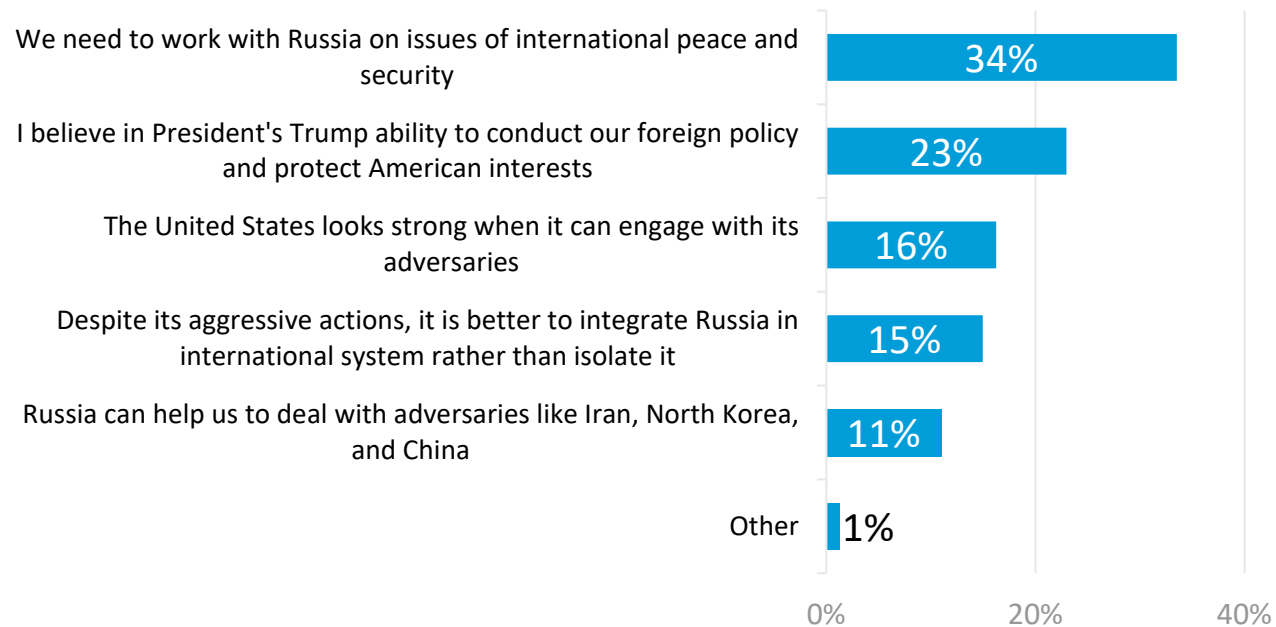

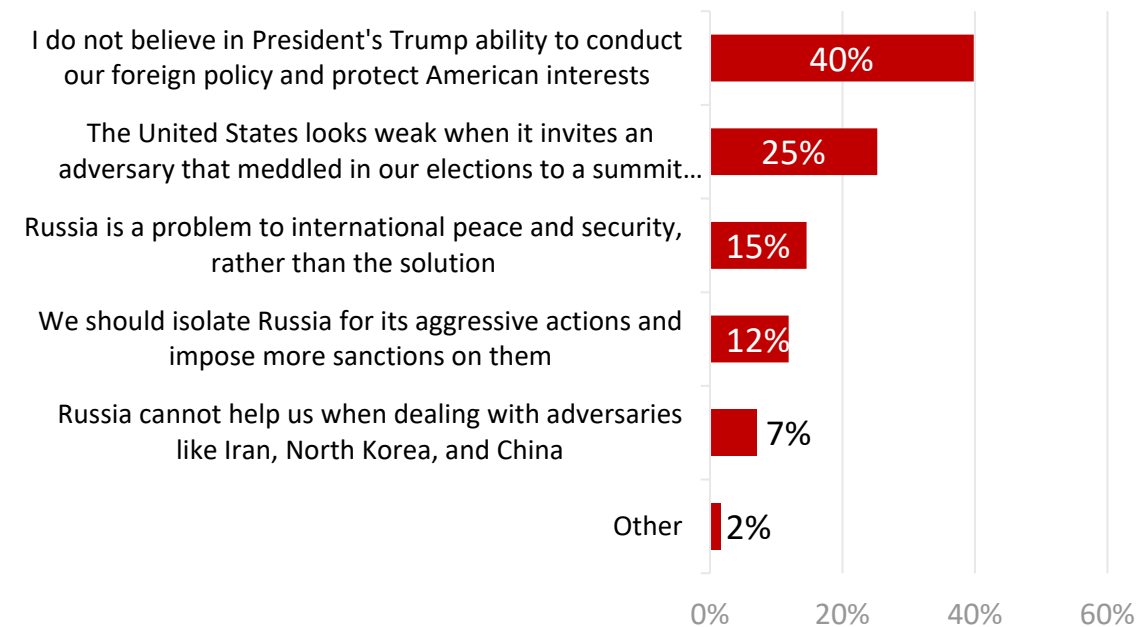

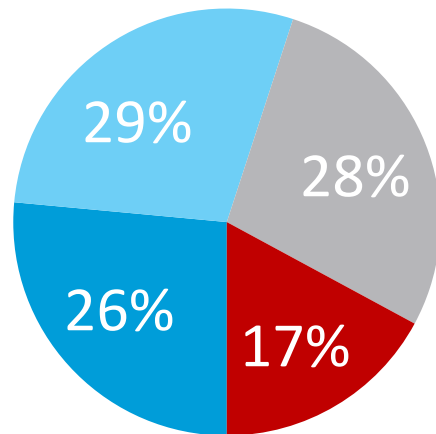

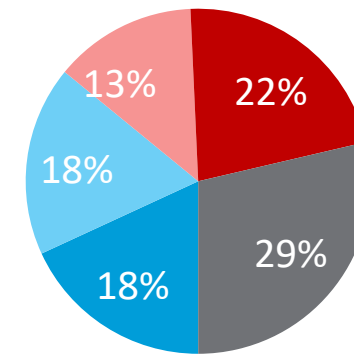

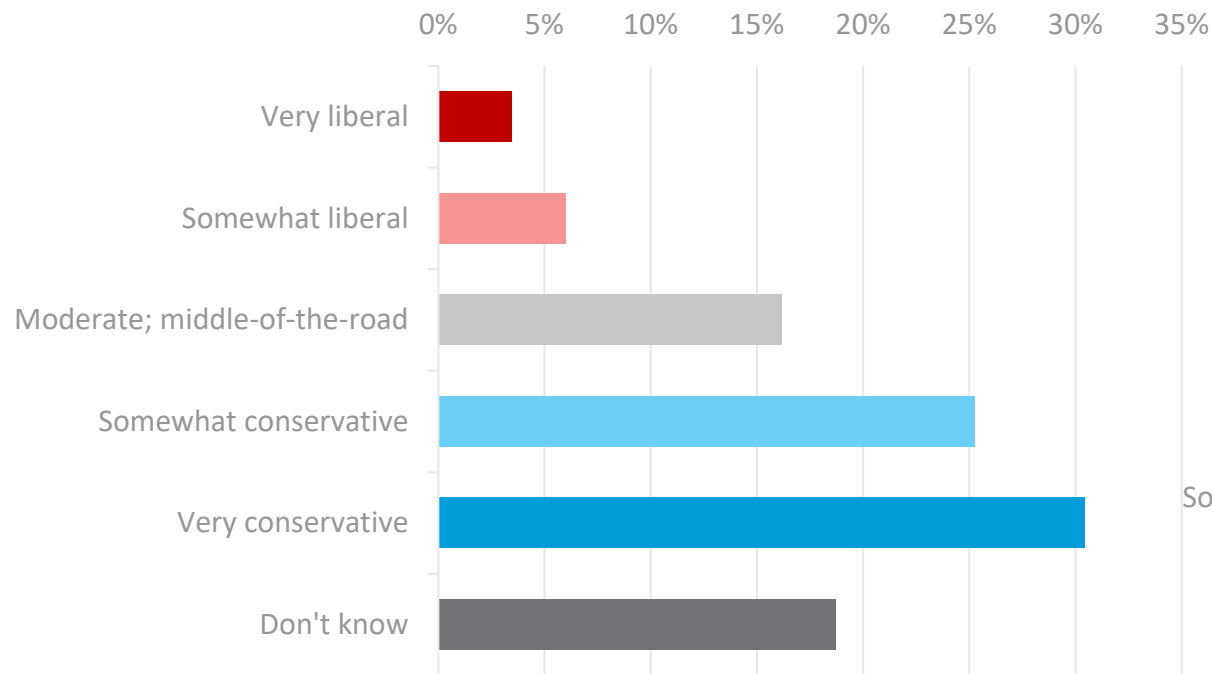

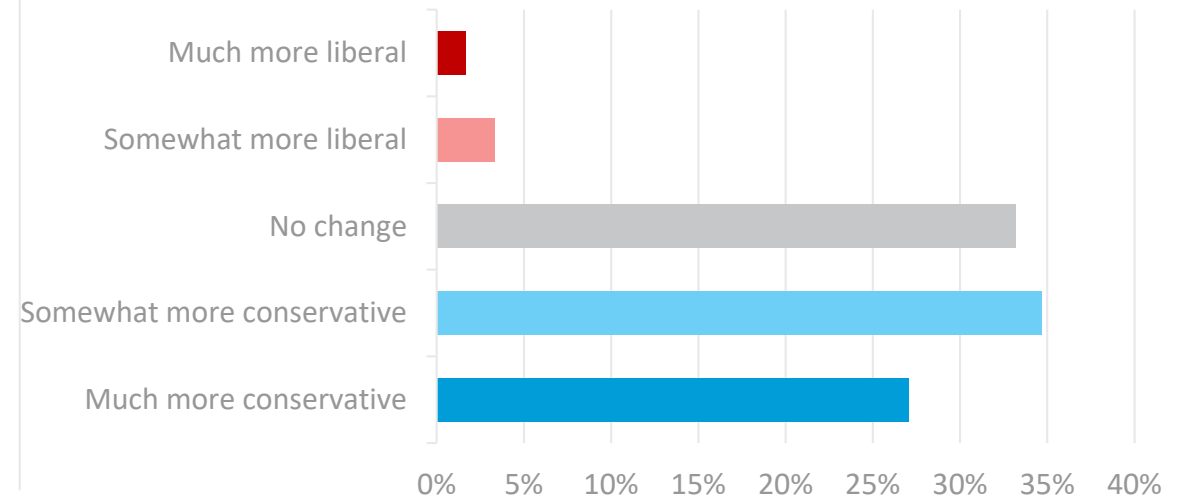

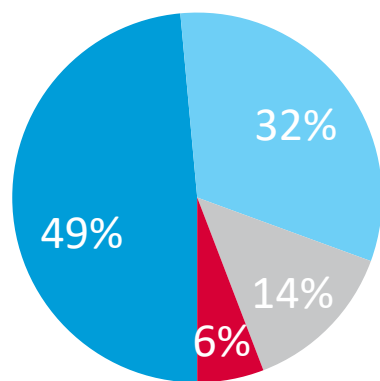

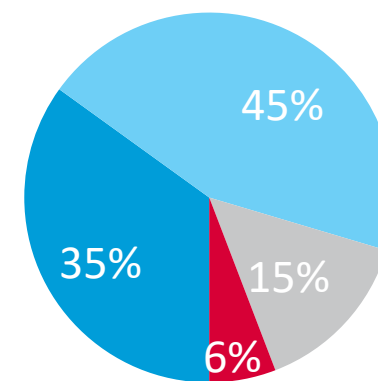

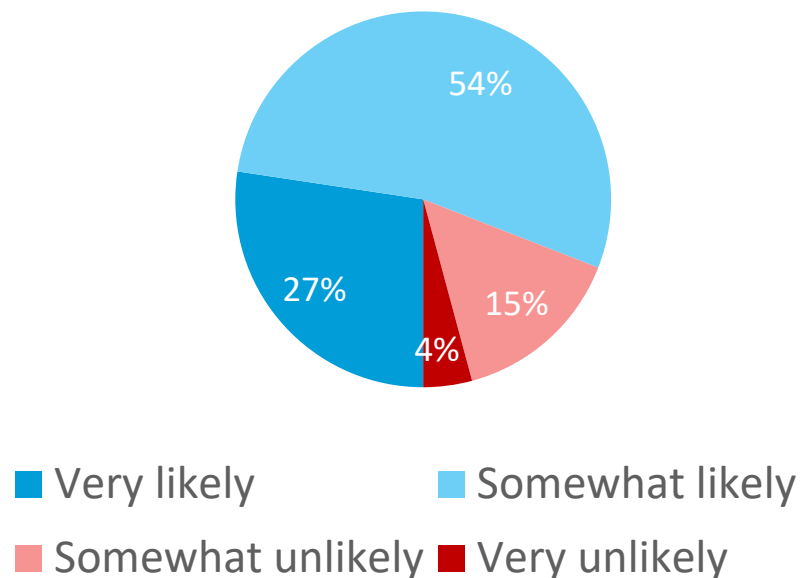

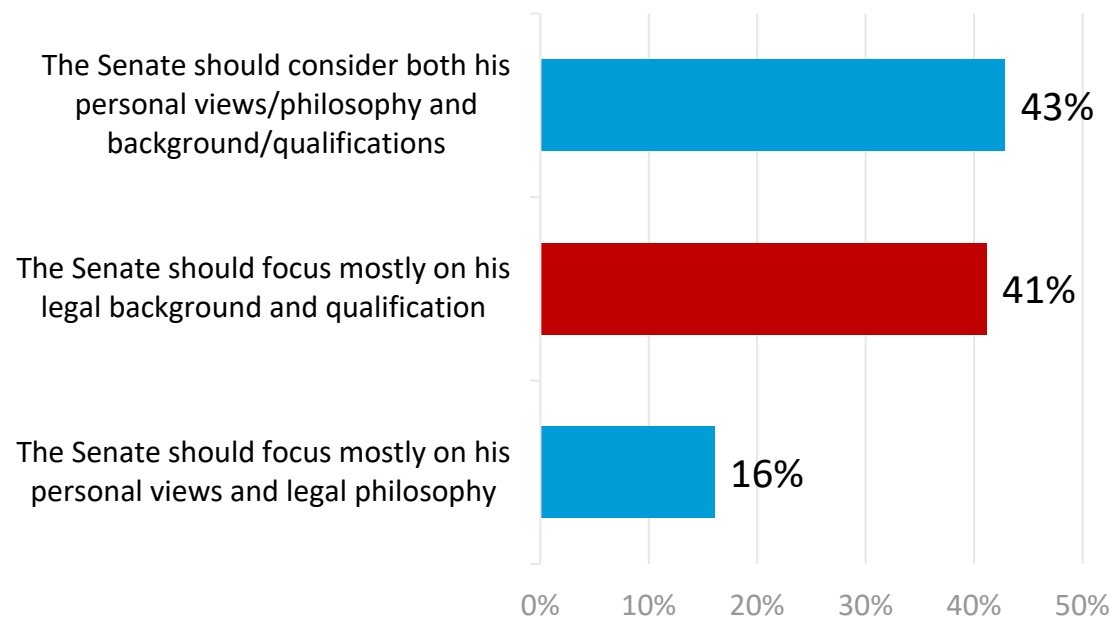

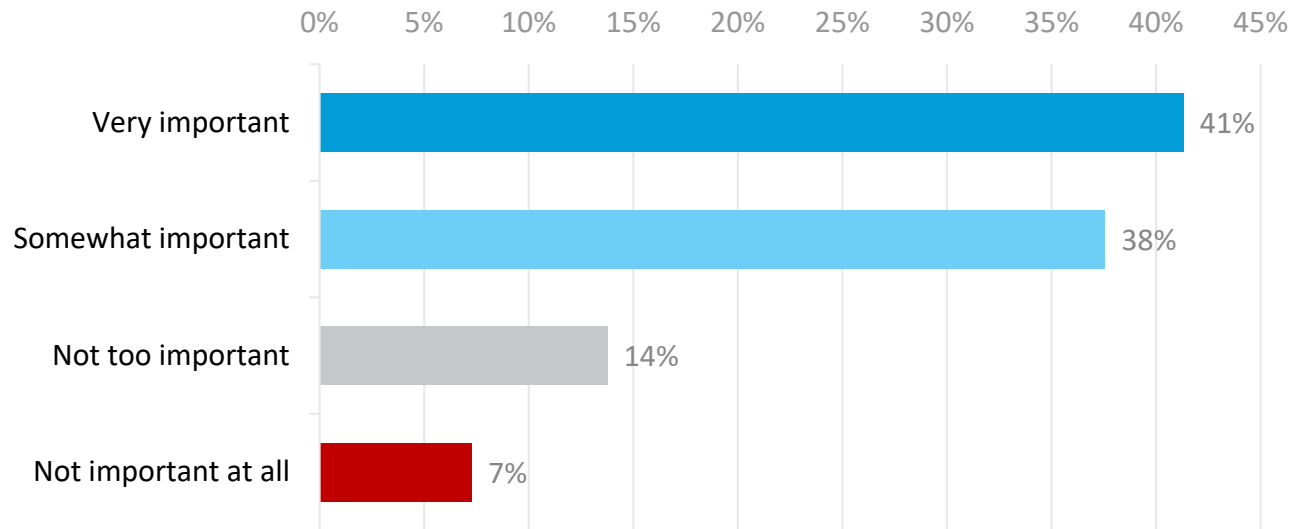

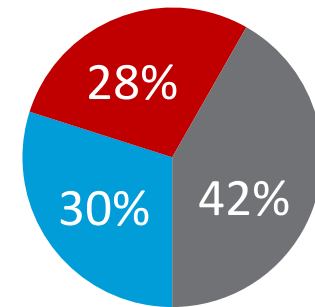

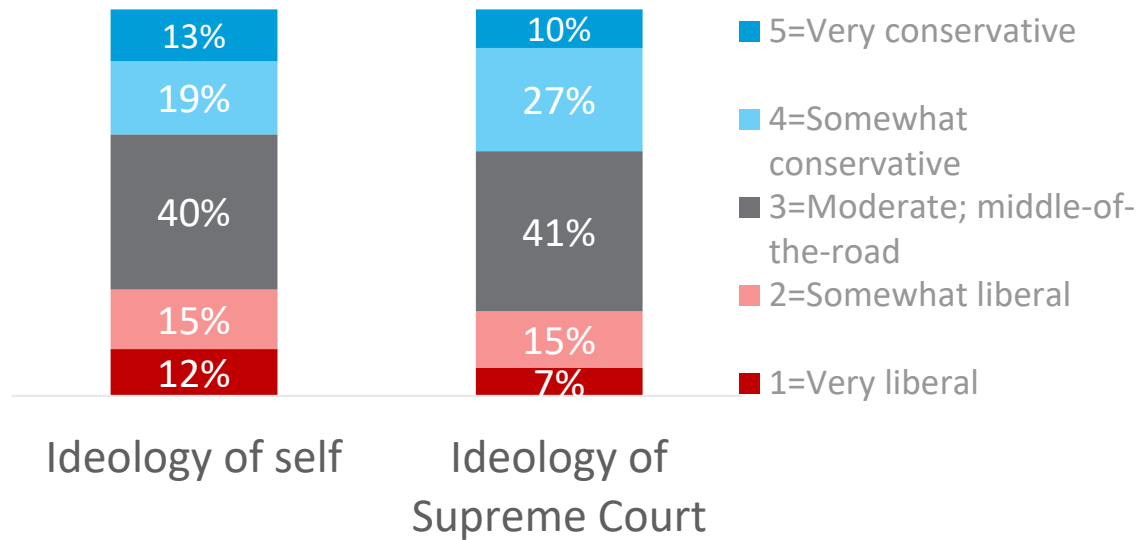

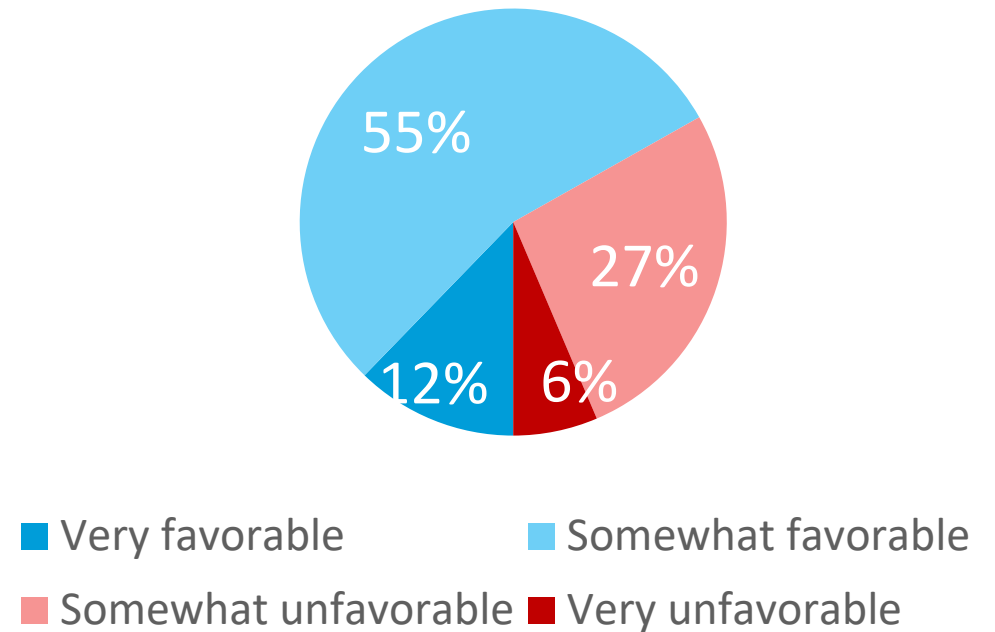

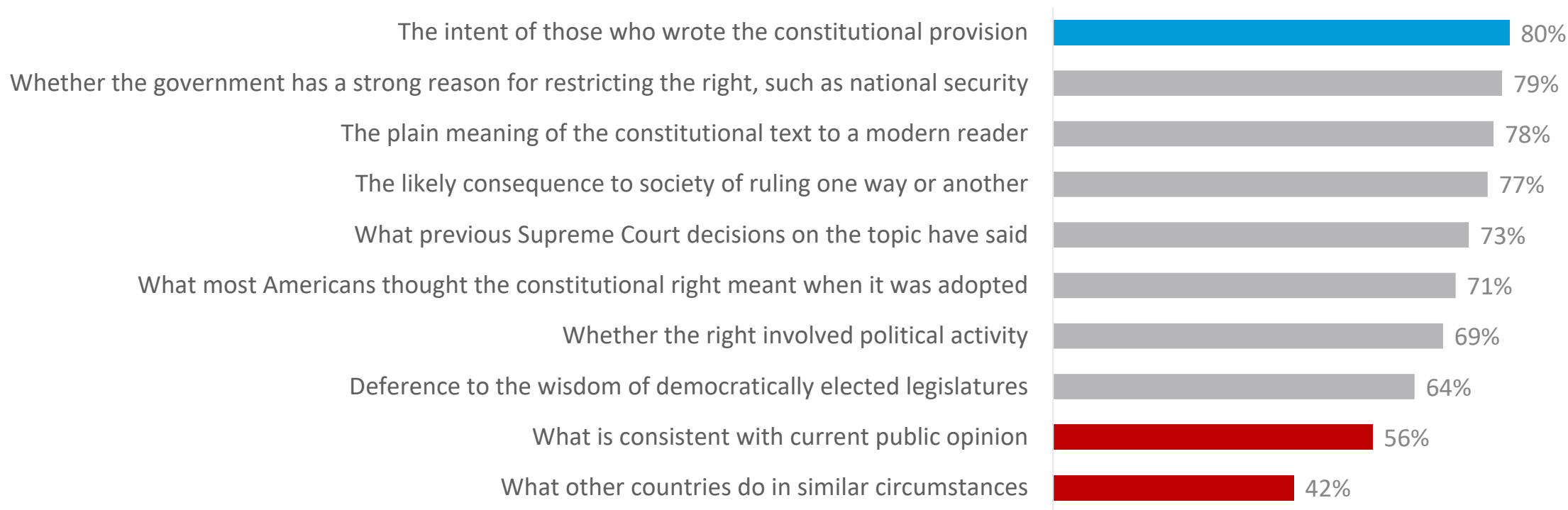

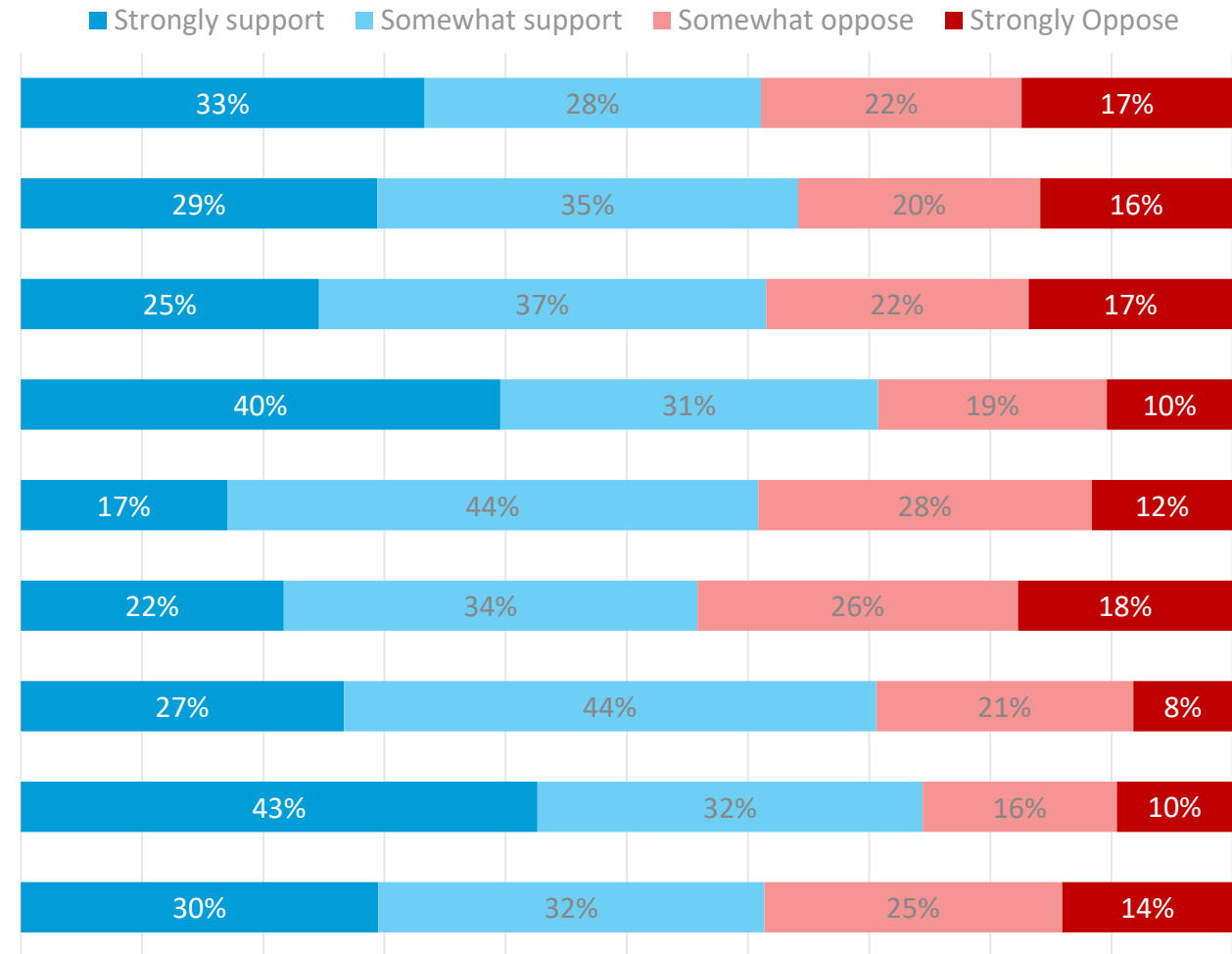

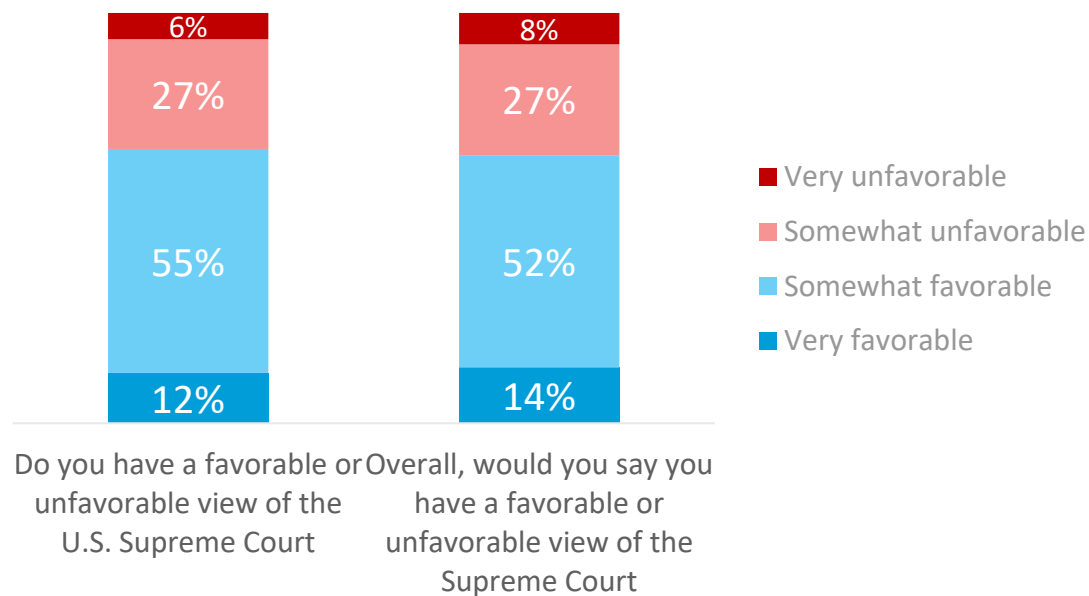
Support or Oppose Court Ruling**



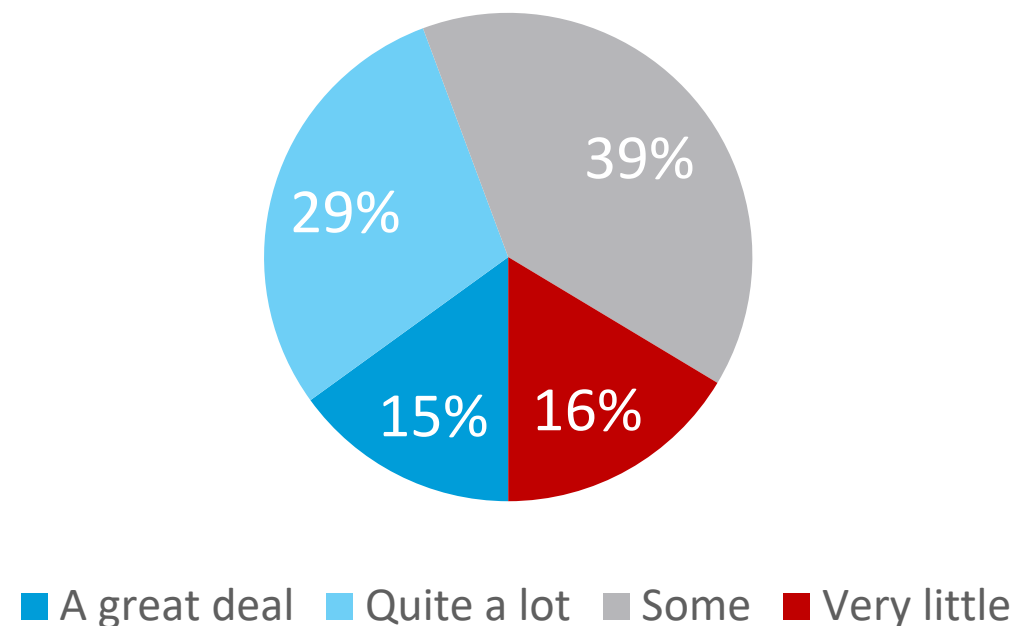
