
SURVEY METHOD

This survey was conducted online within the United States from January 15-16, 2019 among **1,540 registered voters** by The Harris Poll. Results were weighted for age within gender, region, race/ethnicity, marital status, household size, income, employment, education, political party, and political ideology where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Propensity score weighting was also used to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online.

Pollsters Mark Penn, Prof. Stephen Ansolabehere, and Dritan Nesho supervised the poll.



Approve Trump on... (Strongly or Somewhat Approve)




































Who do you think will bear the most responsibility for the shutdown?

























Do you agree or disagree that presidents should have the authority to make new policy or change existing policy without involving Congress?



If the president and Congress disagree on policy, would you find it acceptable or unacceptable for a president to pursue his policy goals through unilateral action so that Congress is not involved?








Which of the following are necessary to achieving the American Dream? (Multiple Selection)





5G AND AI TECHNOLOGIES GENERATED THE HIGHEST EXCITEMENT AMONG THOSE AWARE OF CES


Which of the technology innovations in display at this year's Consumer Electronics Show are you <u>most</u> excited about?





How strongly do you agree or disagree that technological innovation can address issues in the following industries?







Should your car be able to share information with other cars to avoid accidents, potholes or other dangers?






