SURVEY METHOD

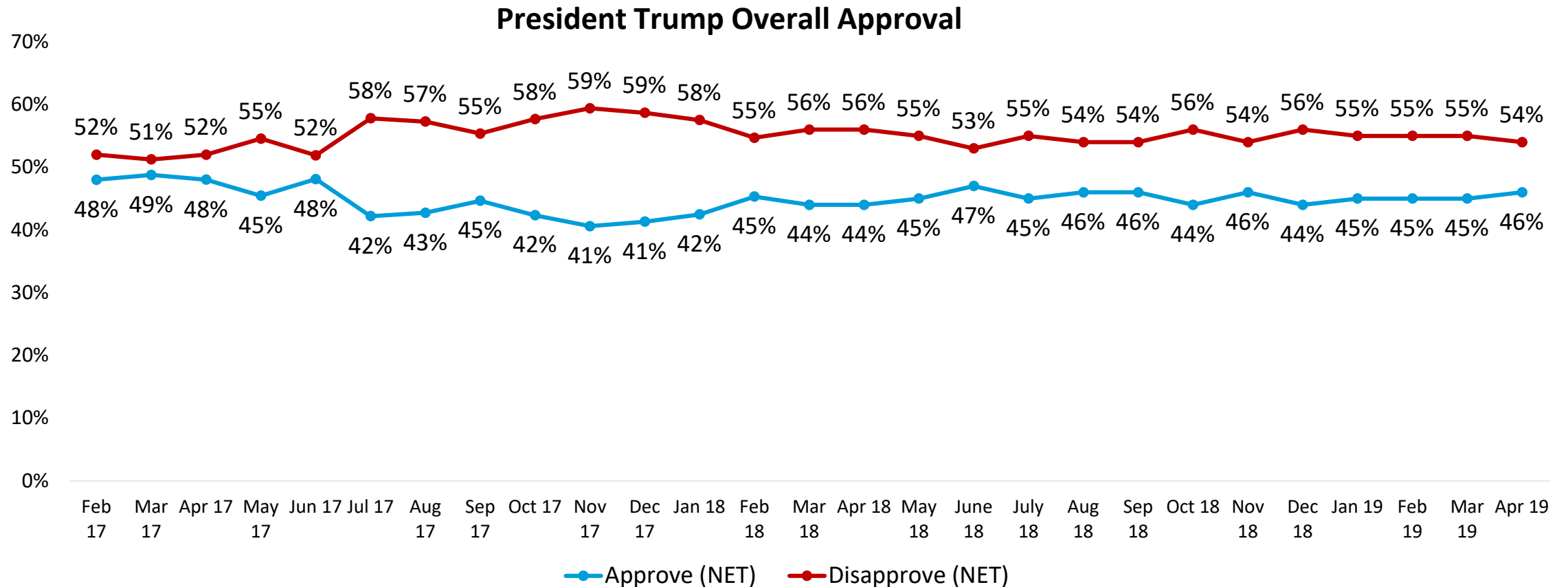
This survey was conducted online within the United States from **April 30 – March 1, 2019** among **1,536 registered voters** by The Harris Poll.

Results were weighted for age within gender, region, race/ethnicity, marital status, household size, income, employment, education, political party, and political ideology where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Propensity score weighting was also used to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online.

Pollsters Mark Penn, Prof. Stephen Ansolabehere, and Dritan Nesho supervised the poll.

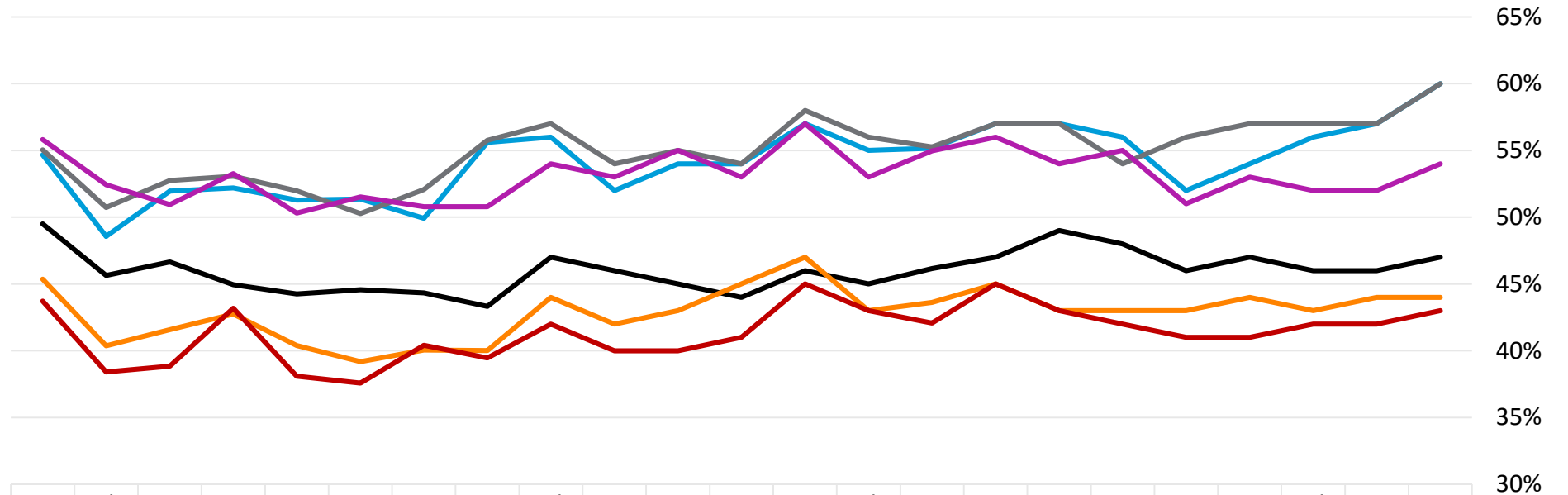

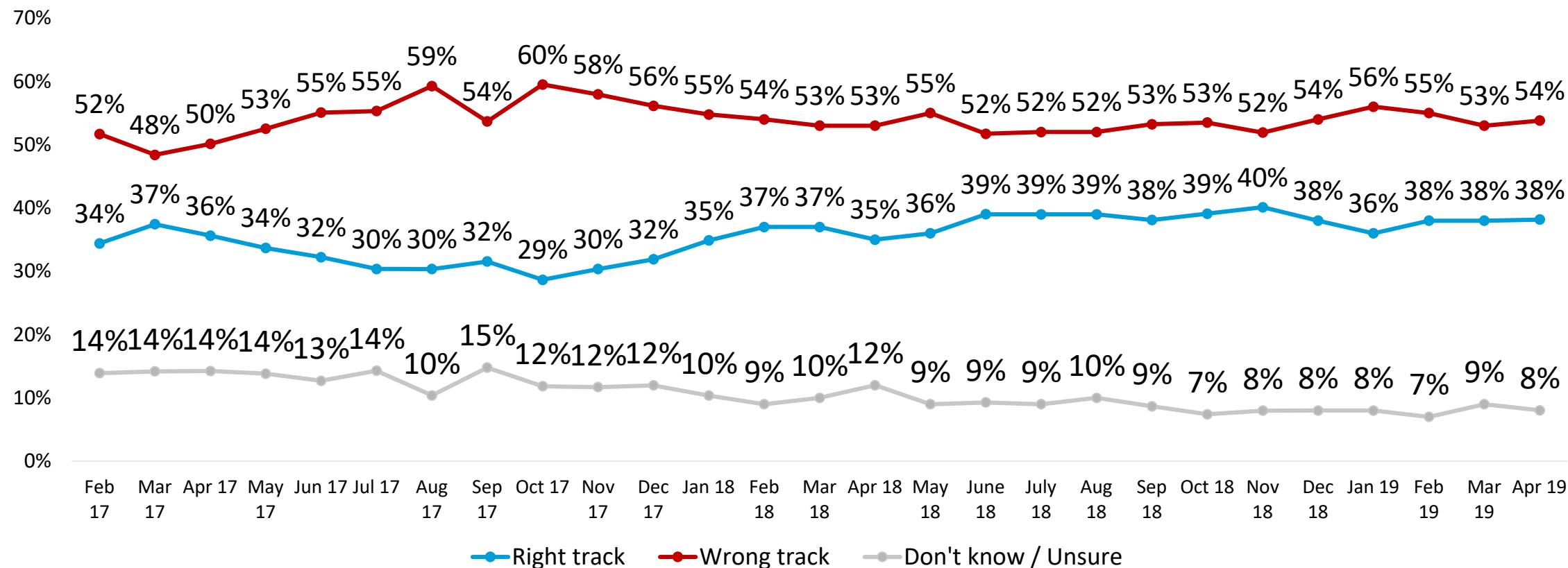

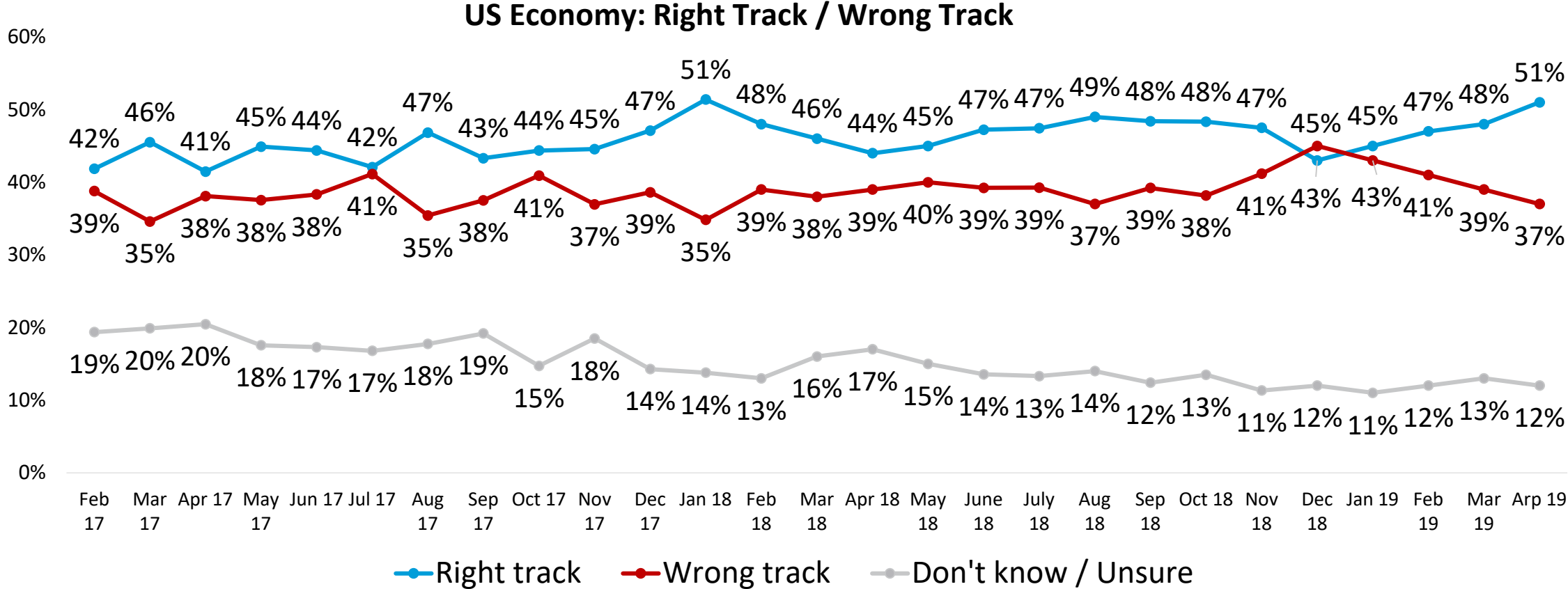

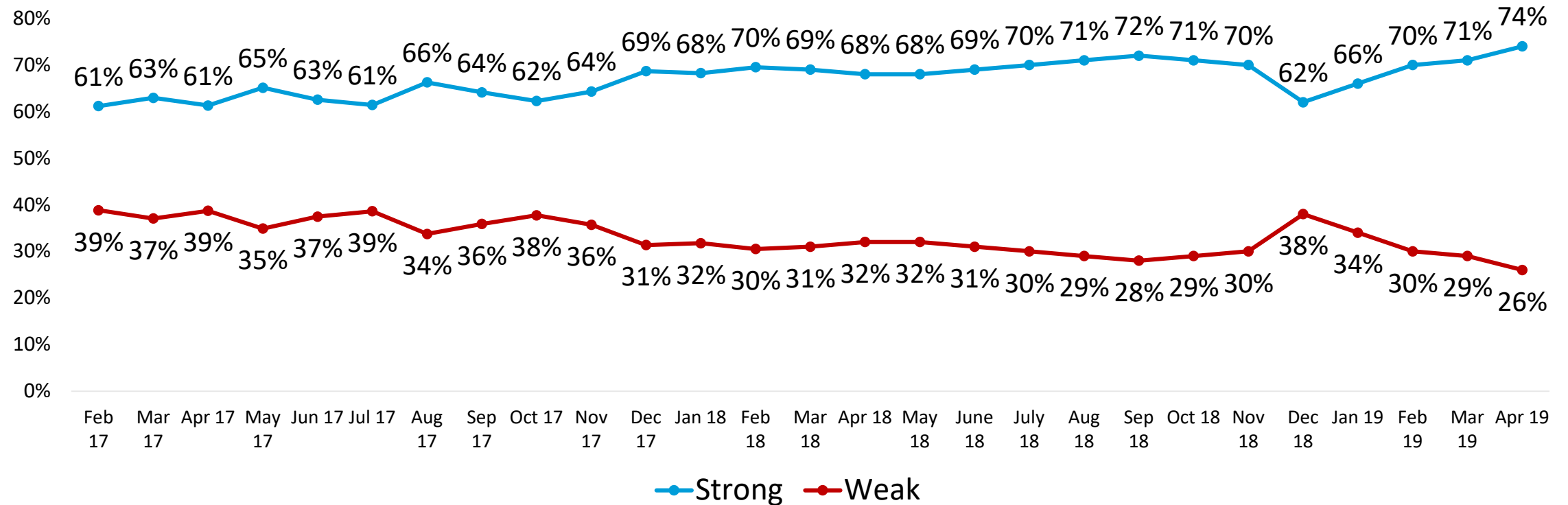

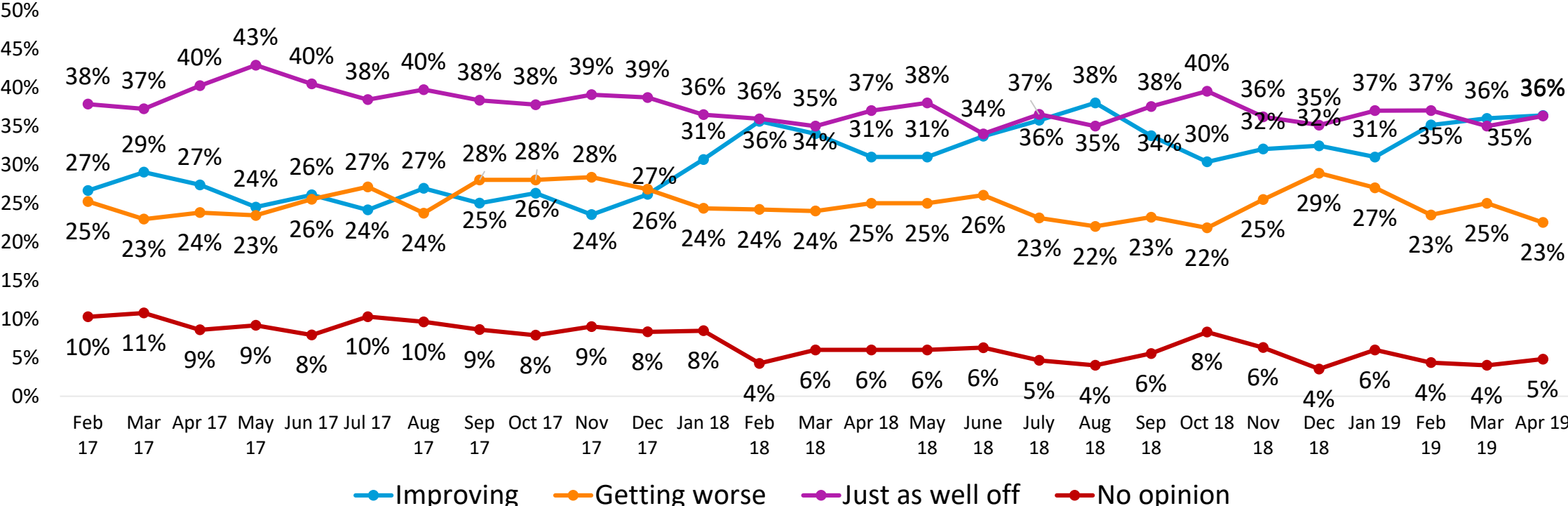
How strong do you think the U.S. economy is today?

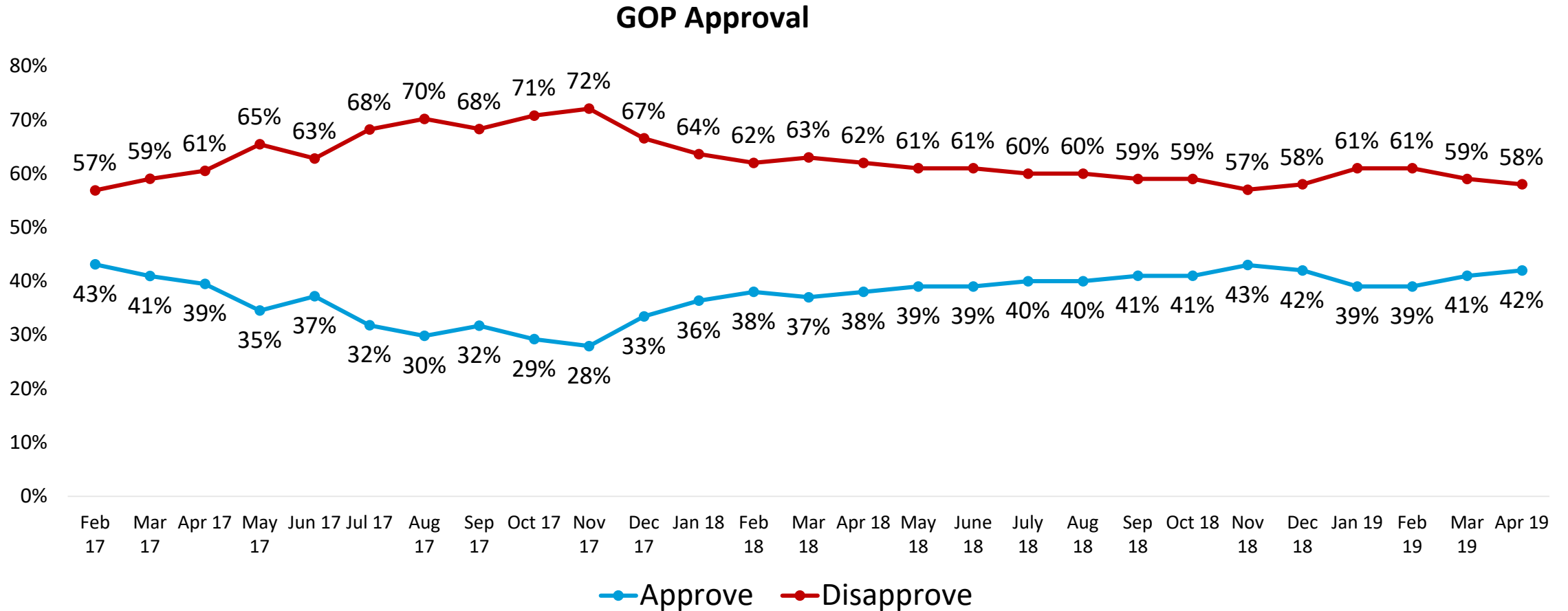

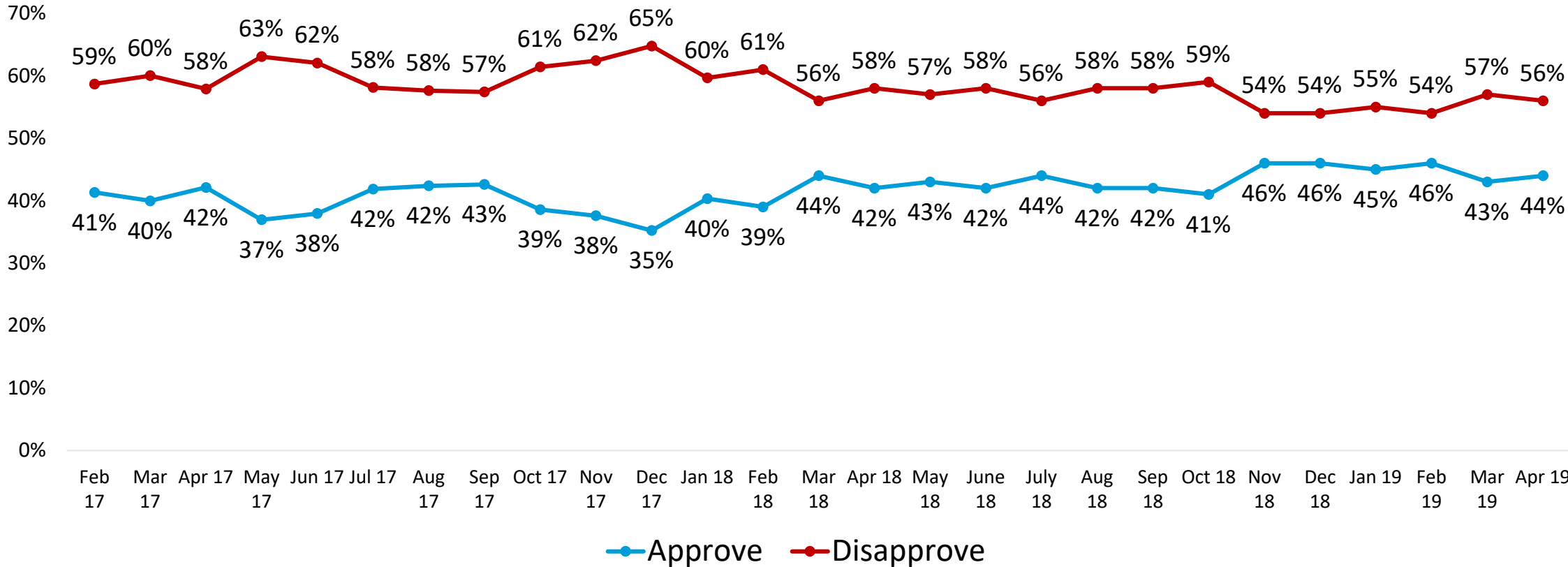

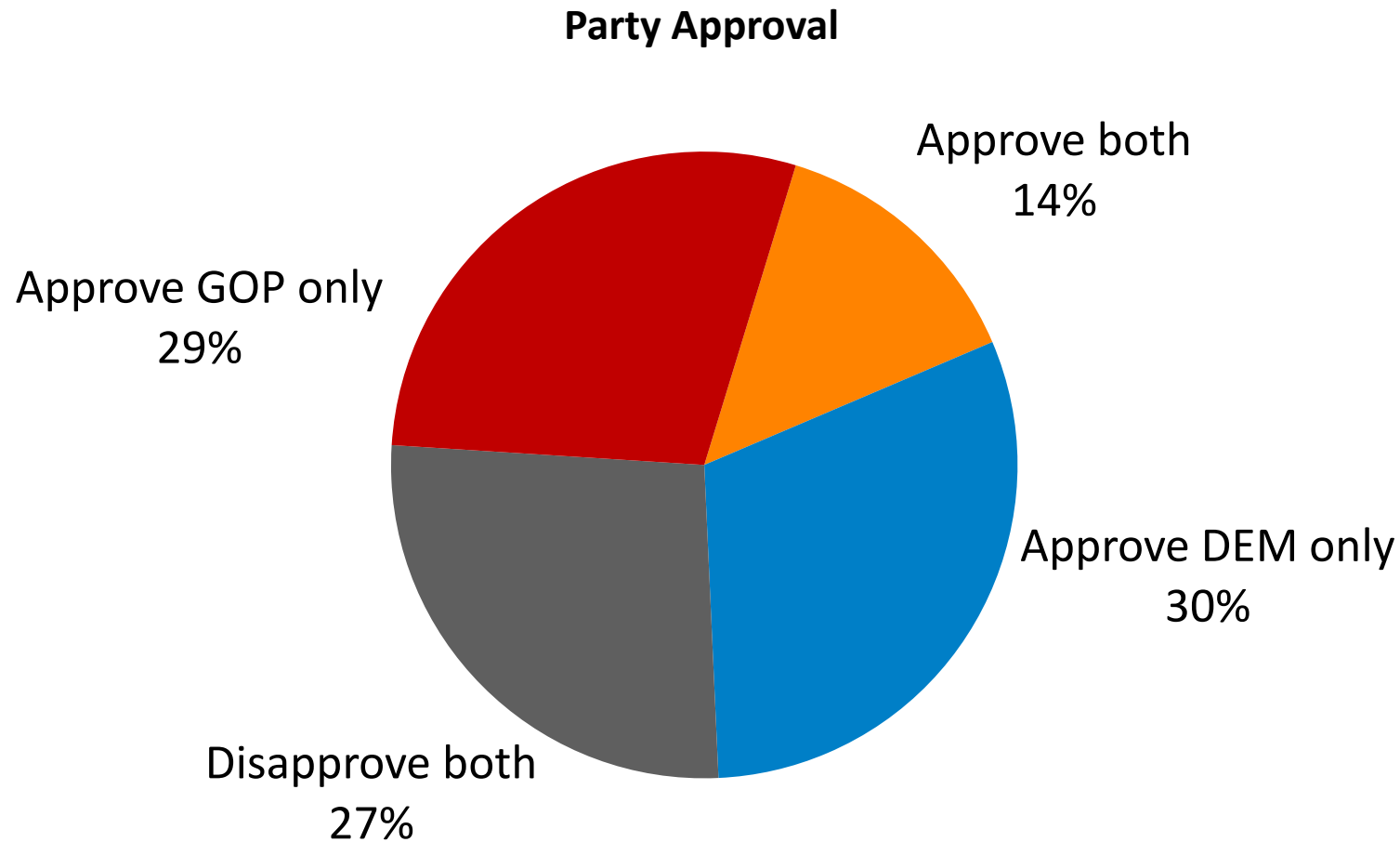

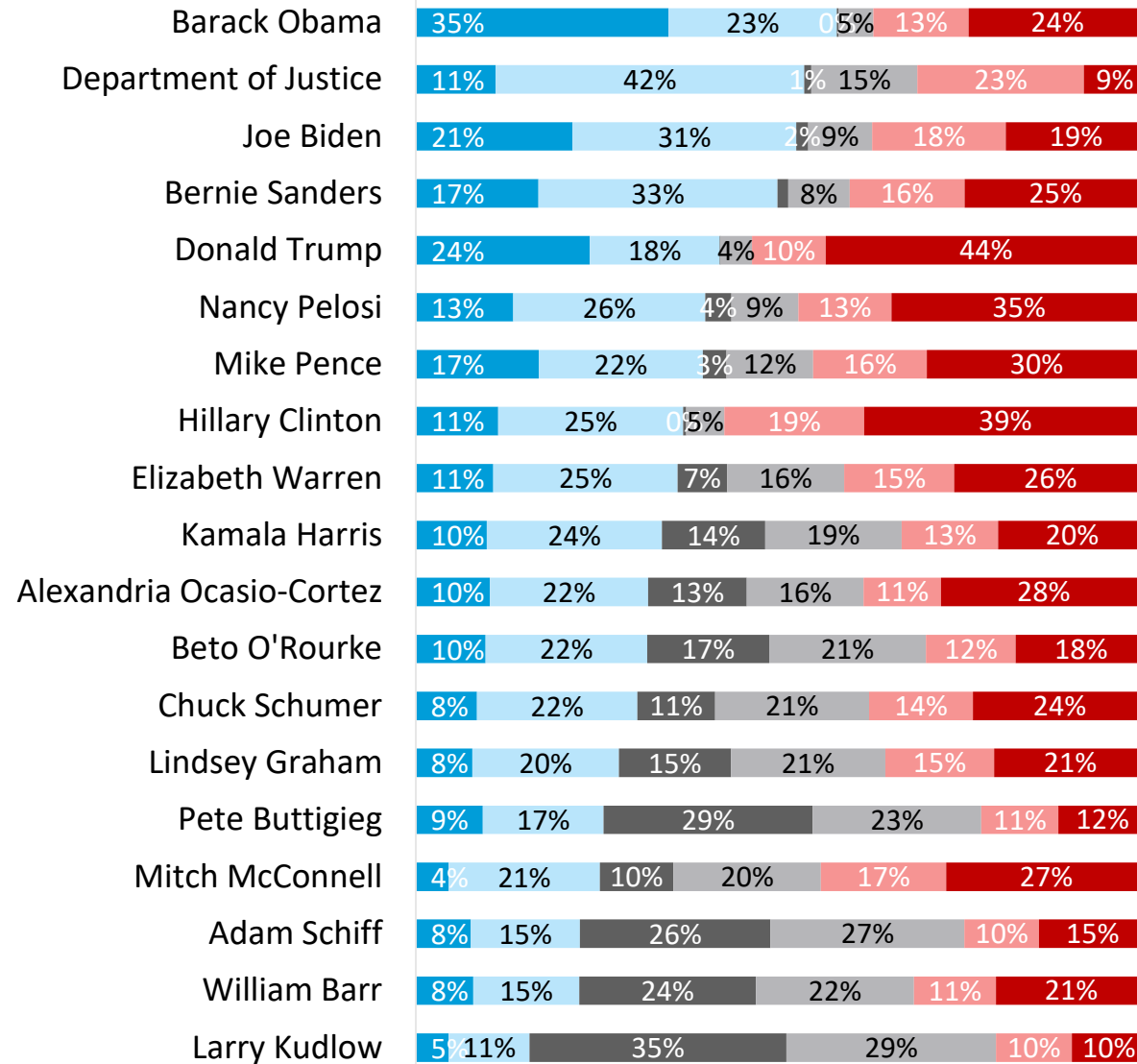

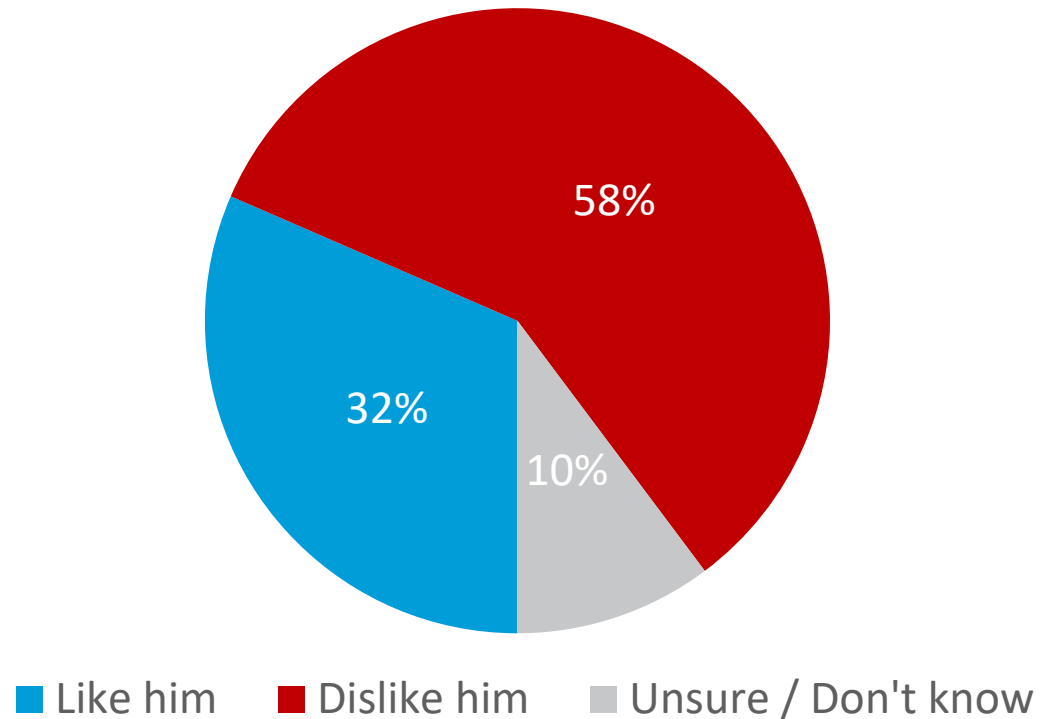

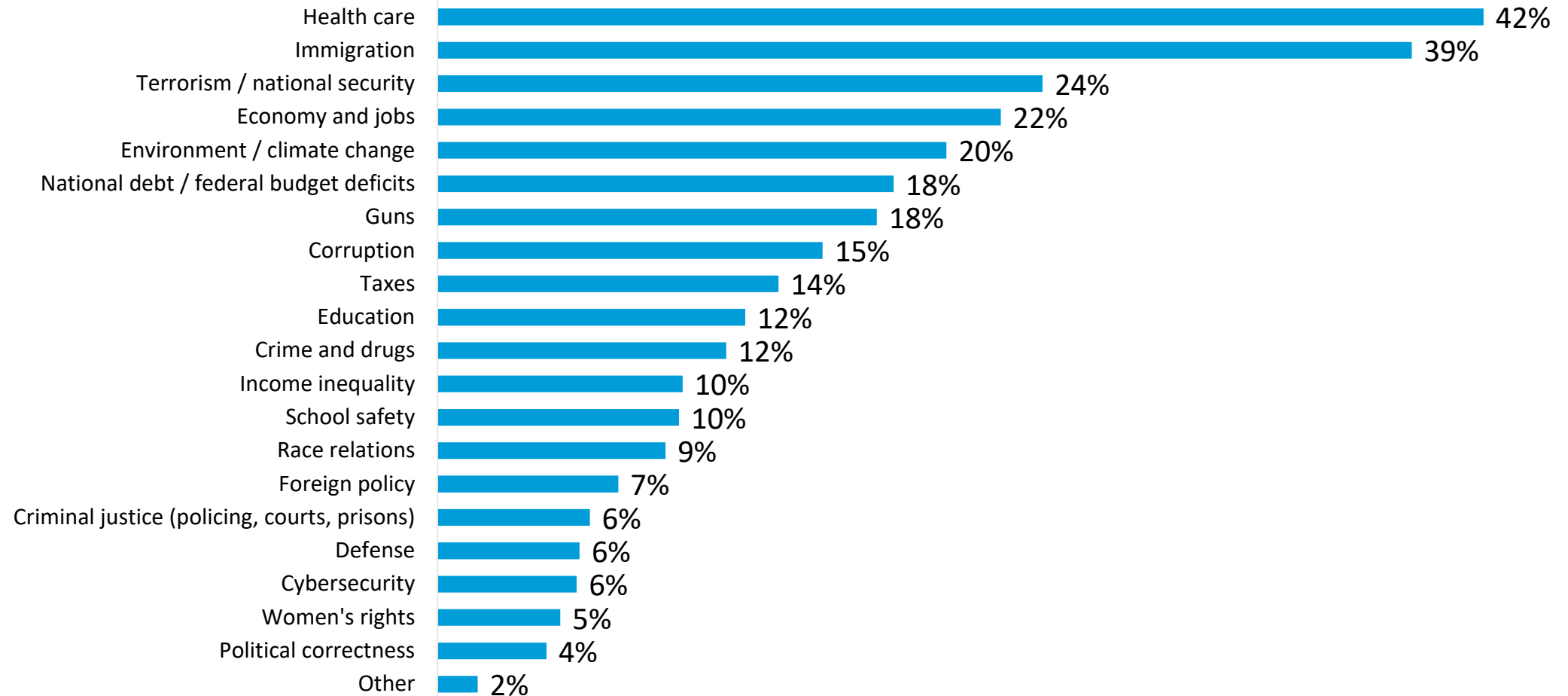

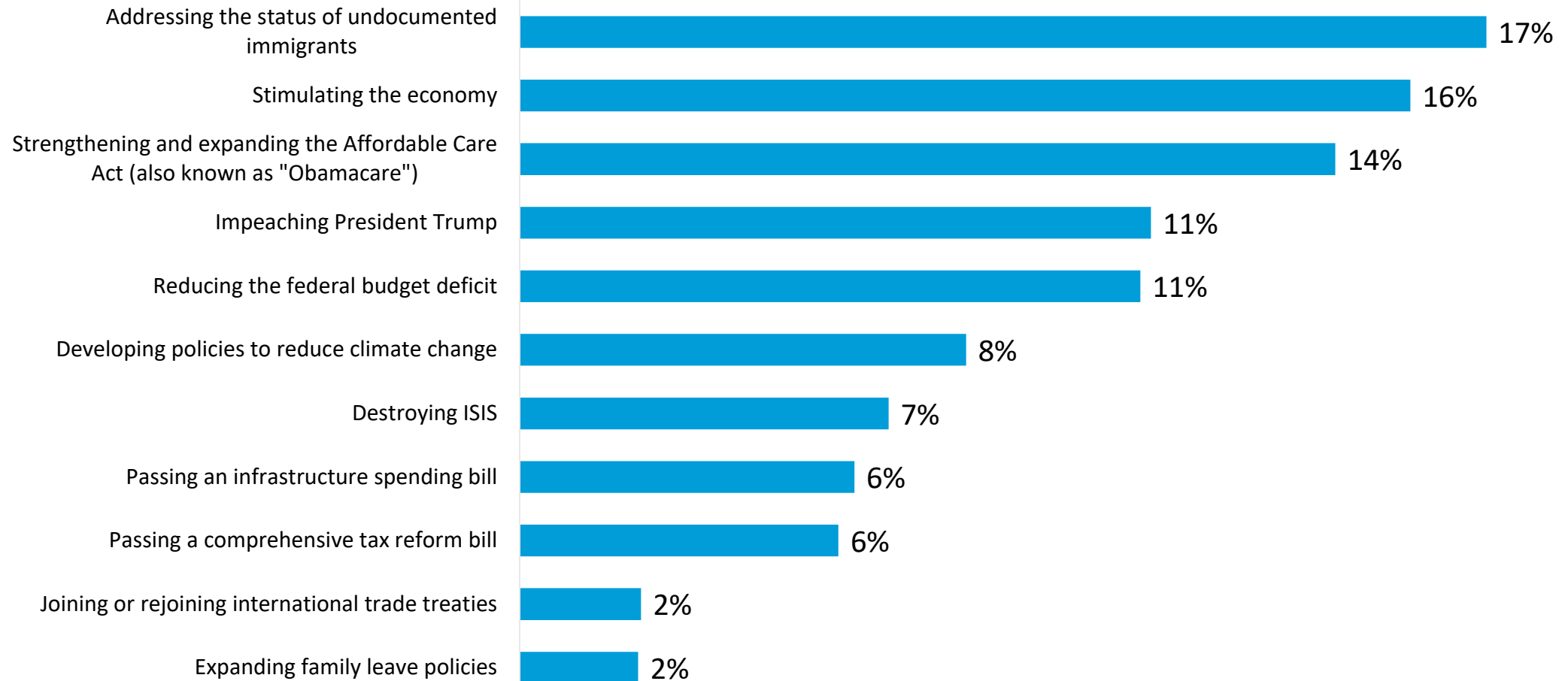

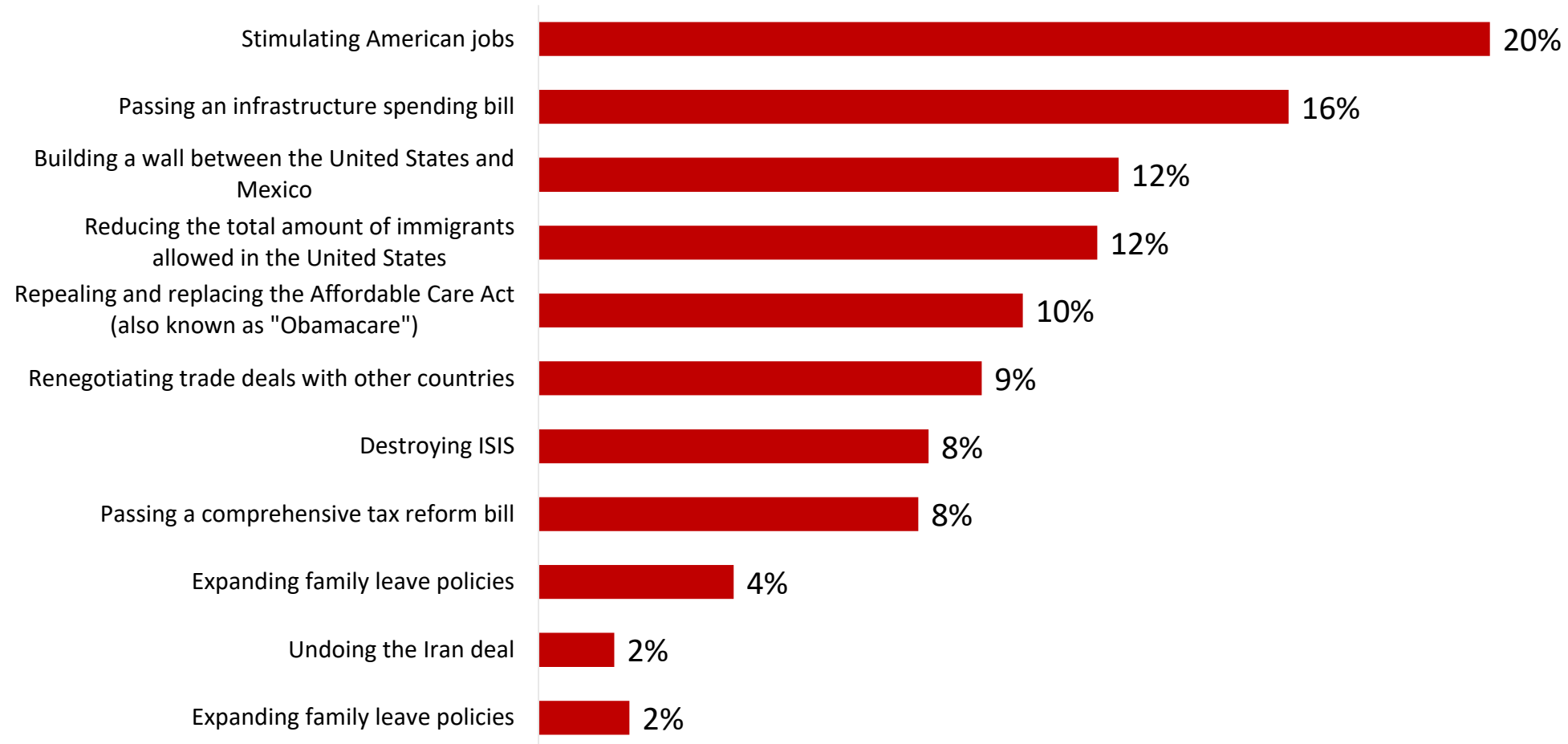

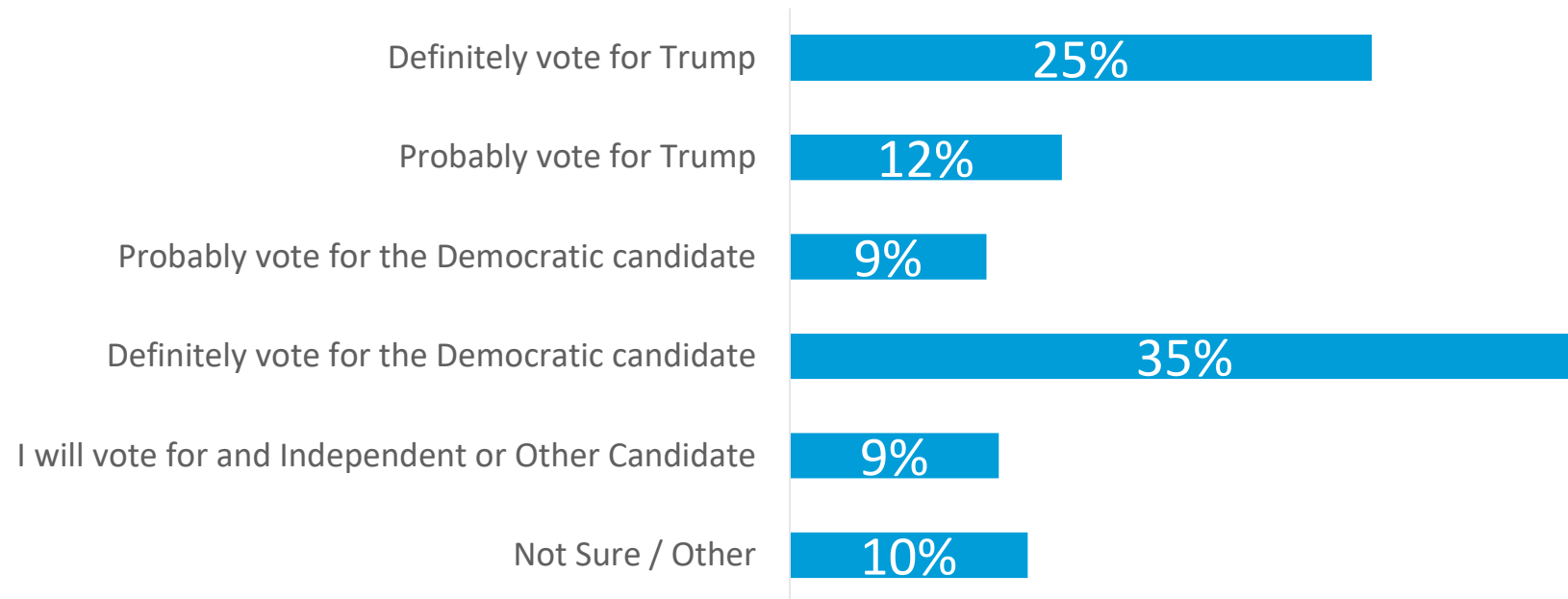

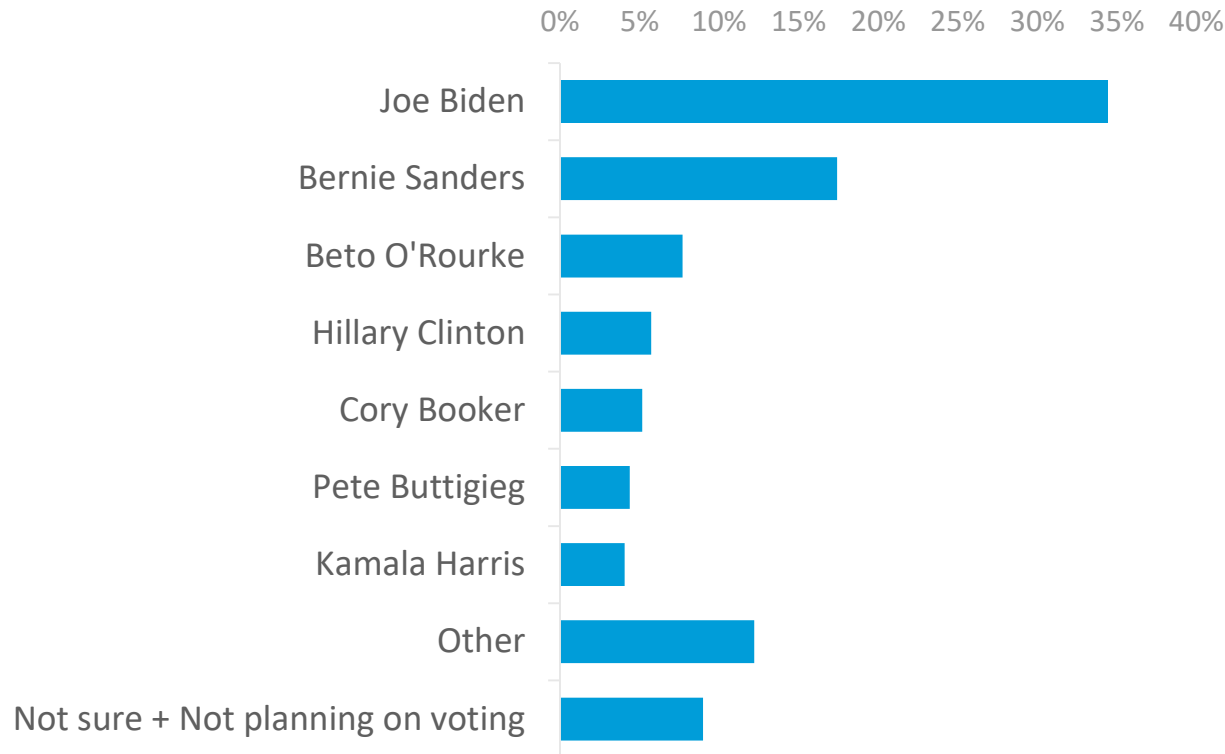

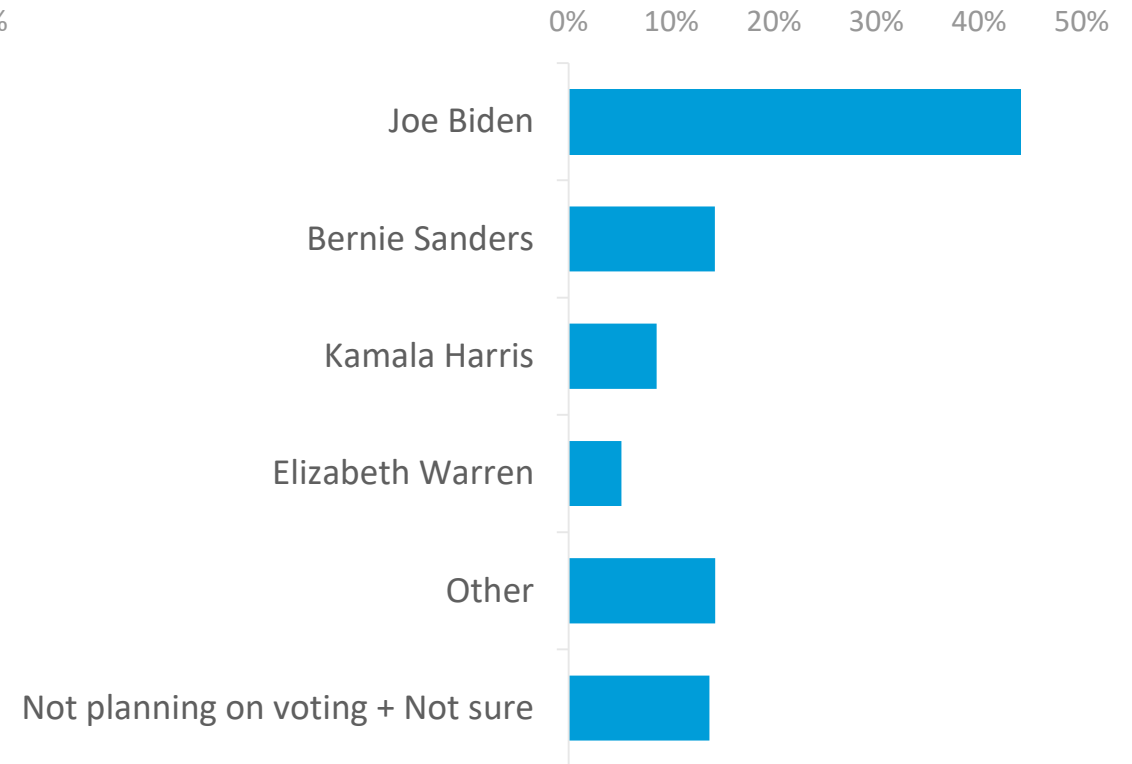

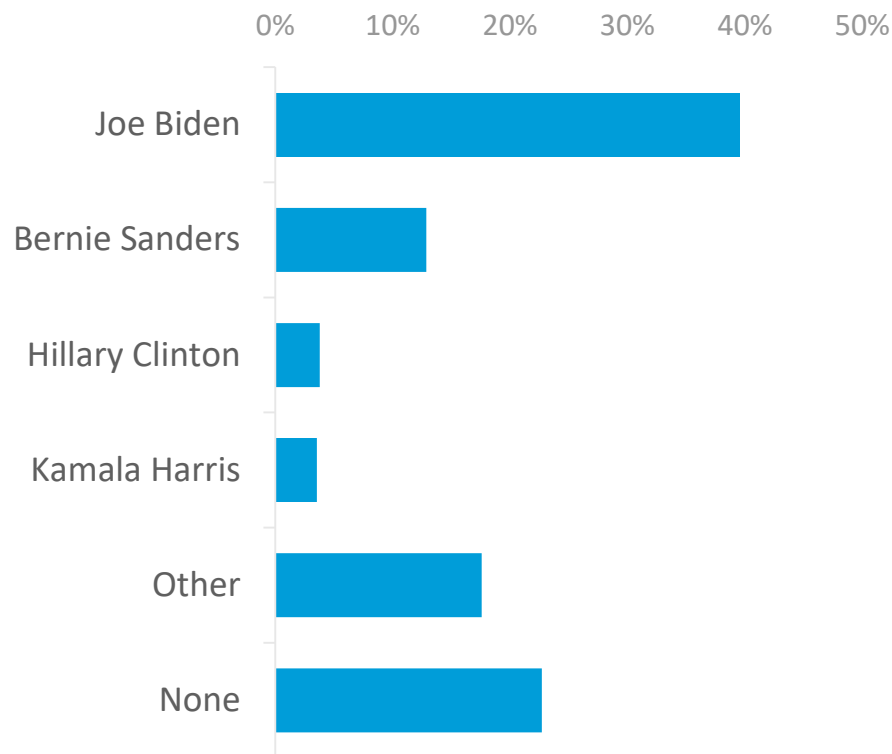

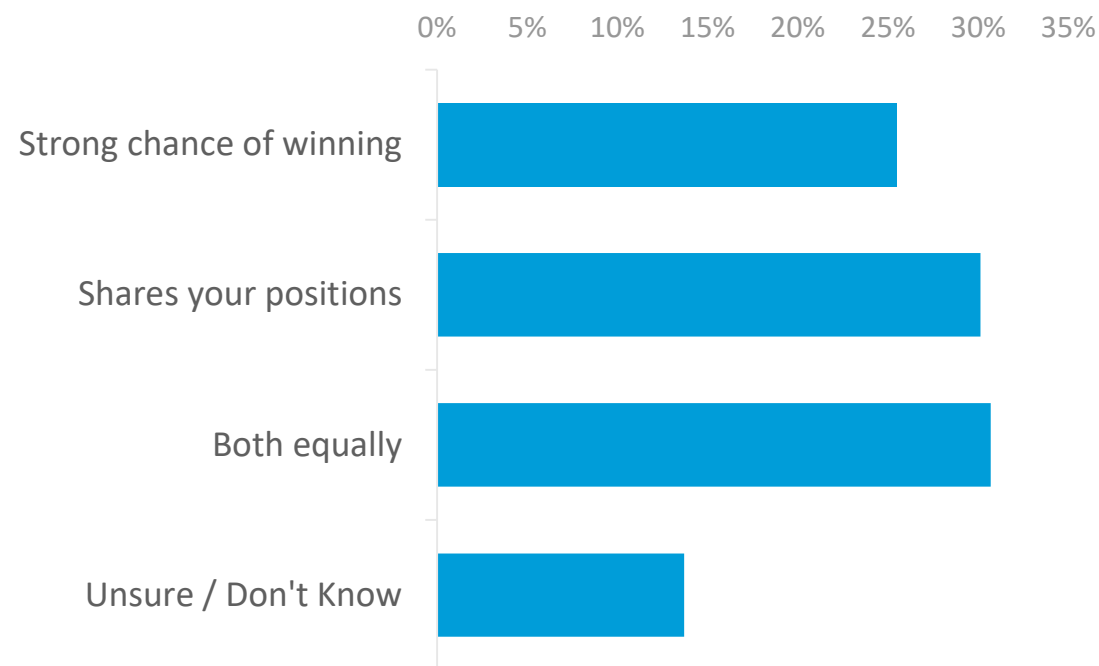

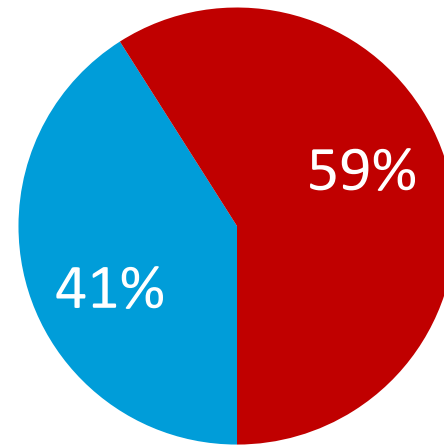

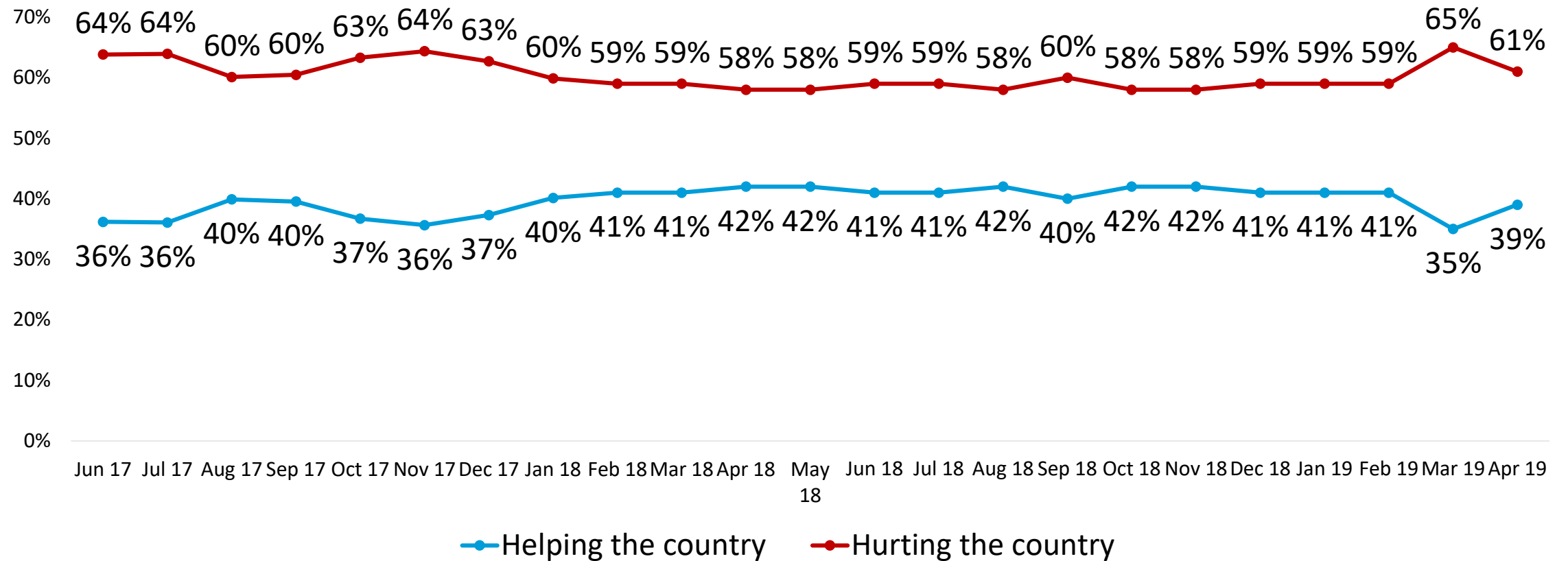

Russia Investigations: Hurting or Helping the Country

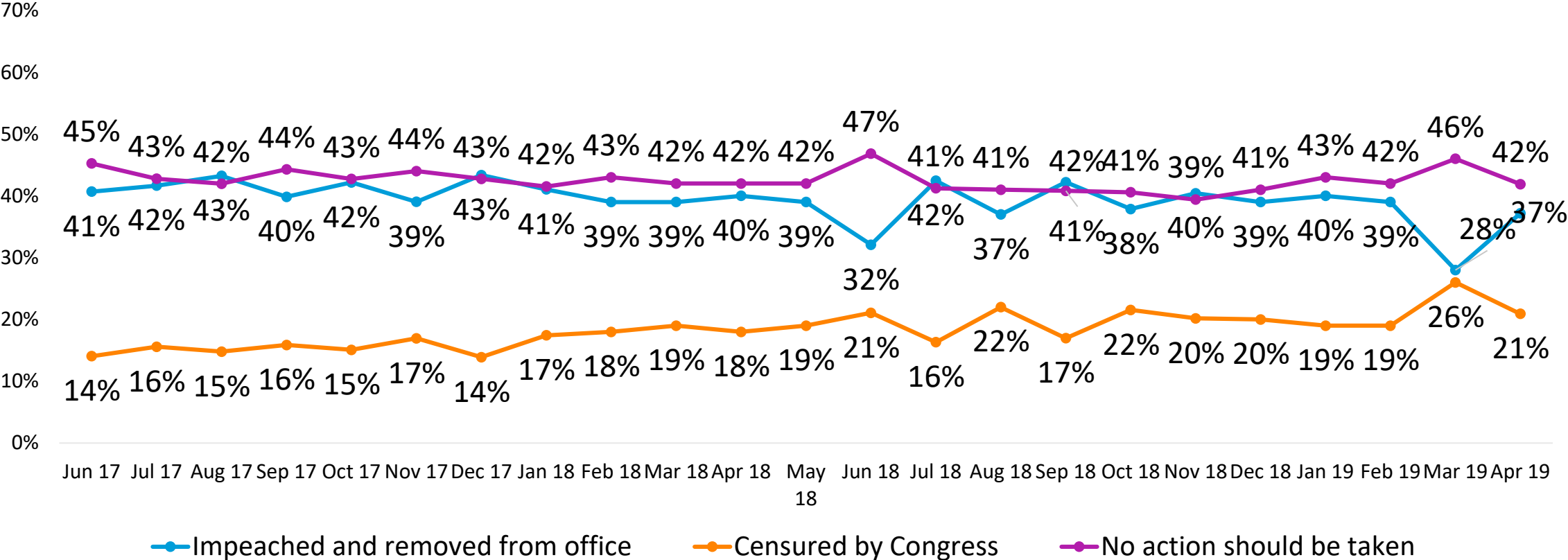

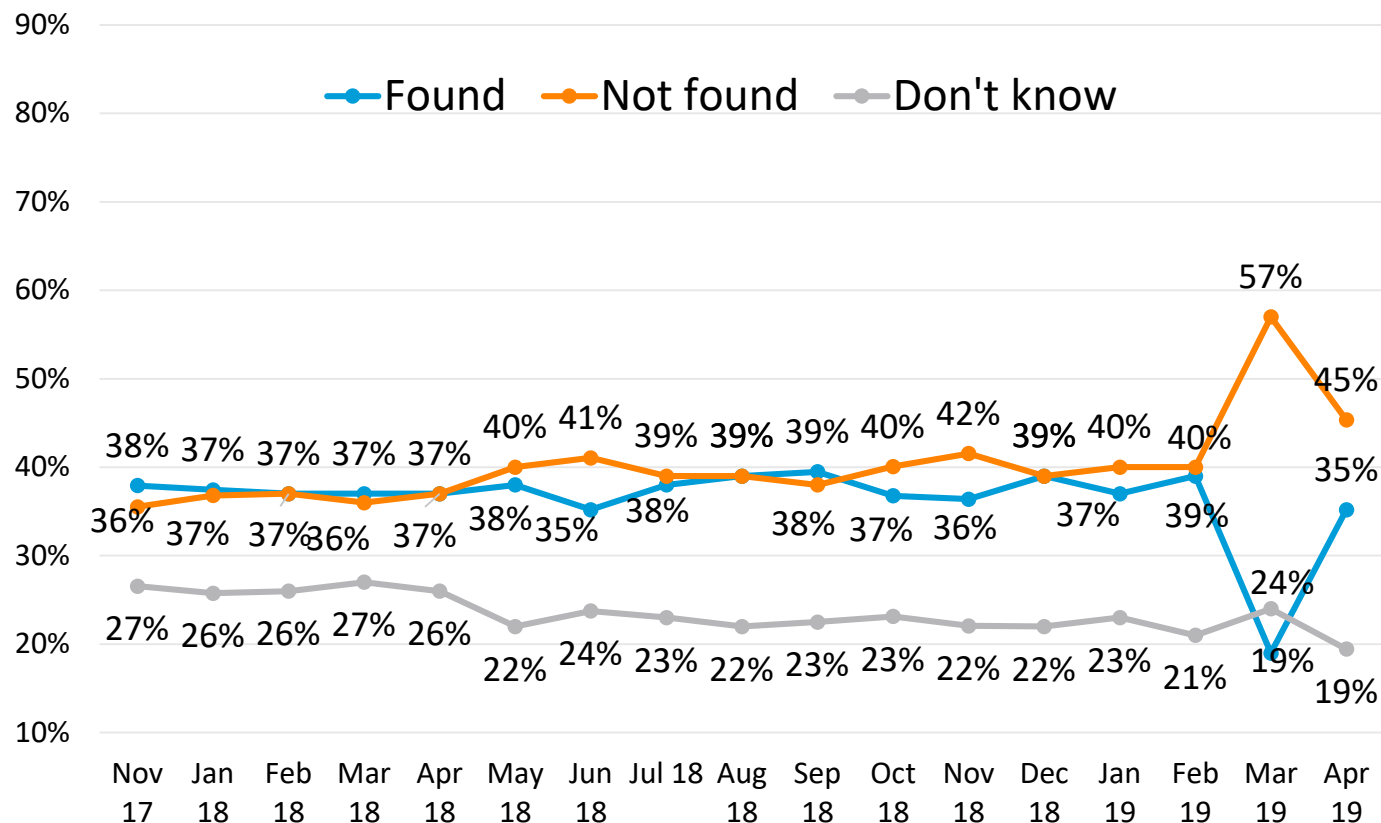

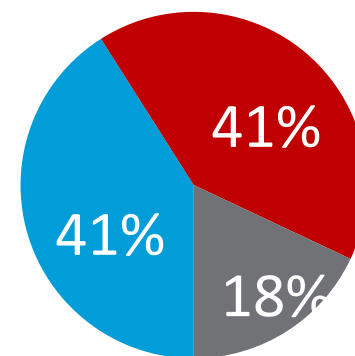

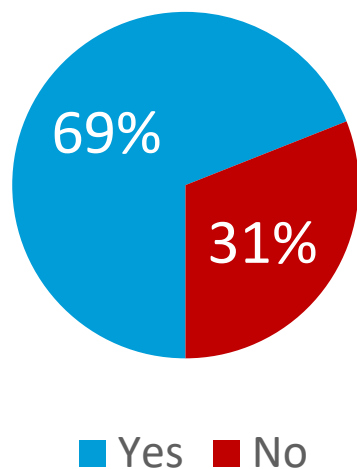

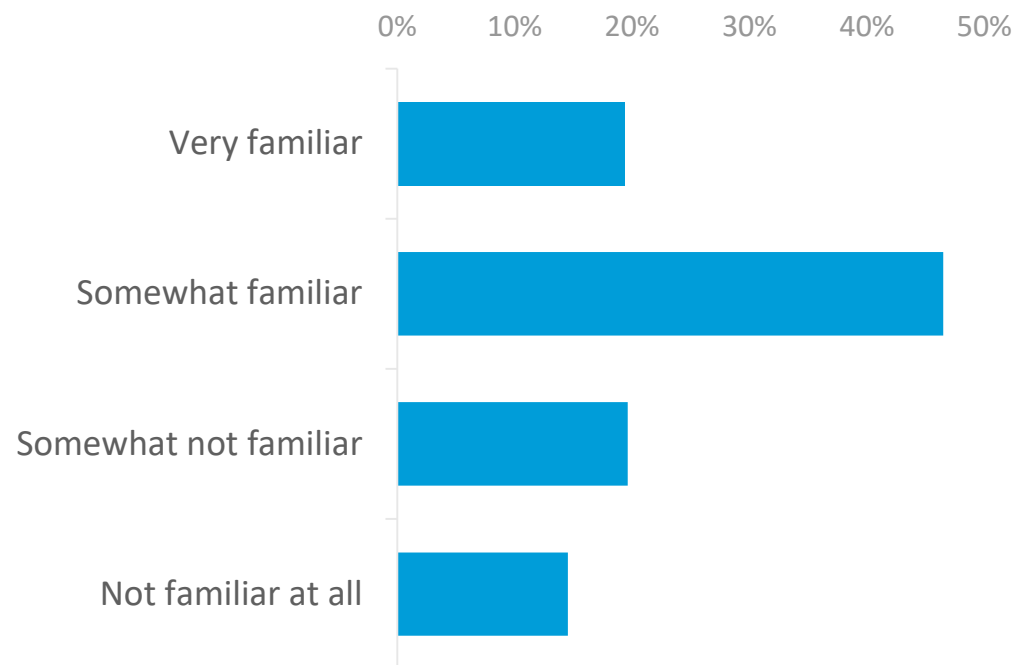

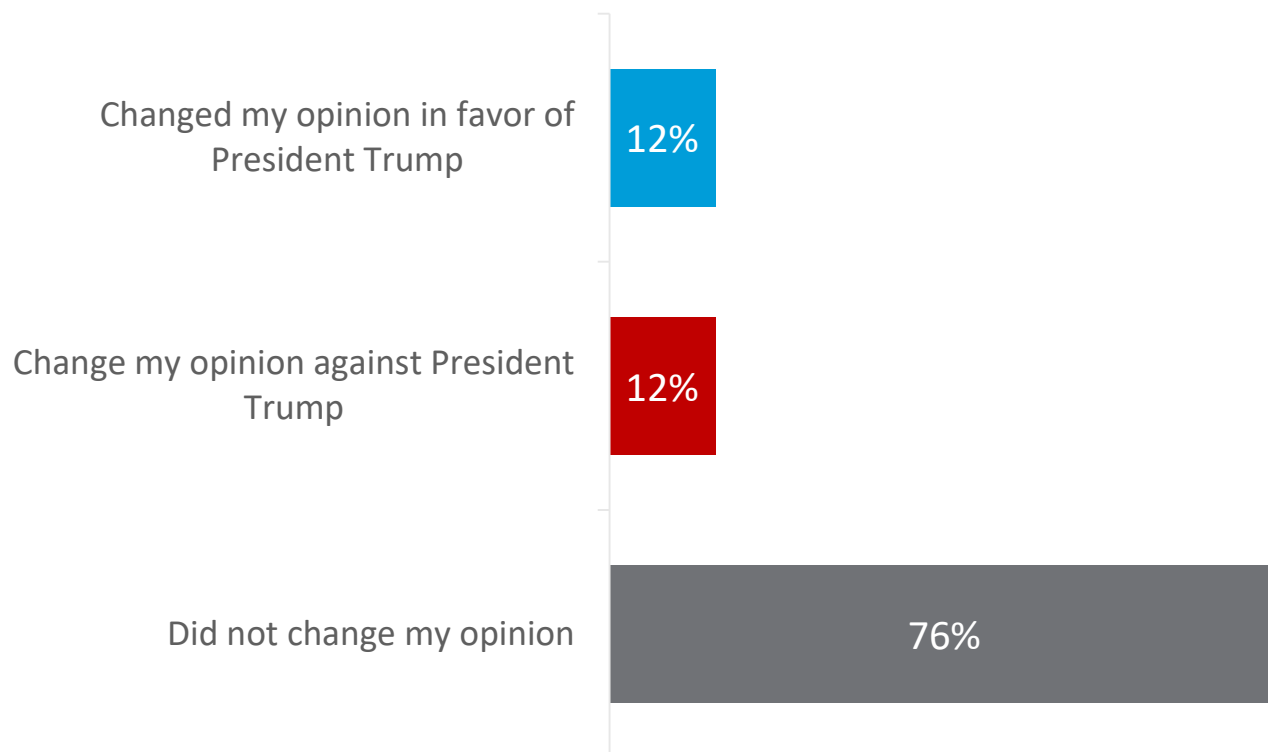

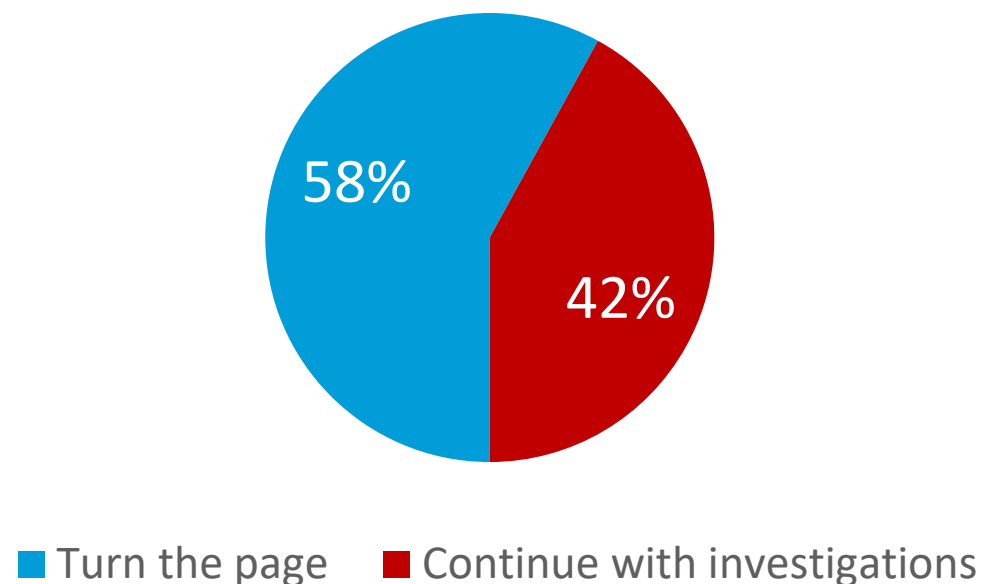

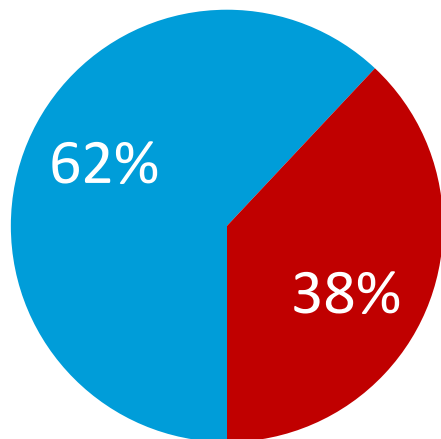

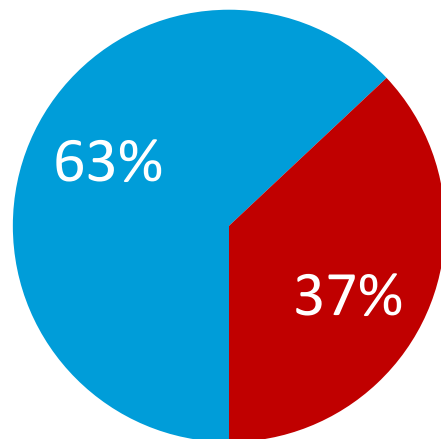

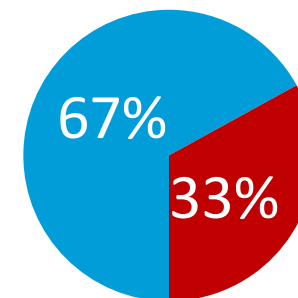

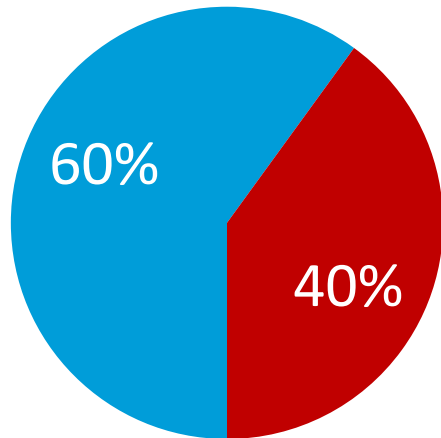

ON LEAVING OPEN THE POSSIBILITY OF OBSTRUCTION: VOTERS ALSO AGREE AND ACCEPT THIS FINDING

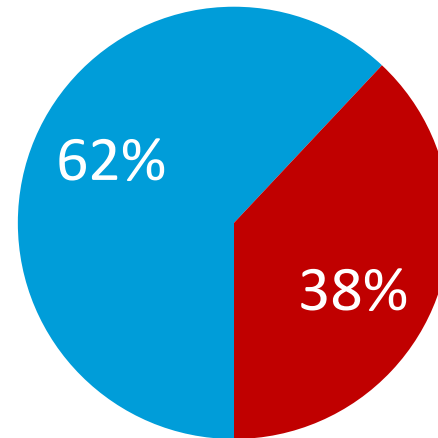
The special counsel did not reach a conclusion on the issue of possible obstruction of justice by the President when he fired former FBI director James Comey, and left the decision to the Attorney General, who, along with deputy attorney general Rod Rosenstein, determined the facts and public actions of President Trump did not amount to obstruction of justice, especially since there was no underlying collusion.

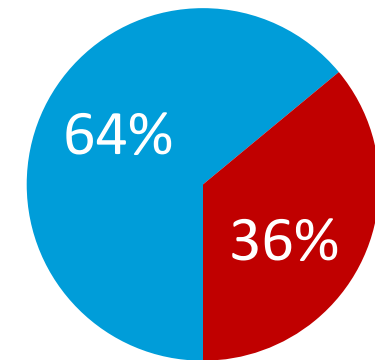

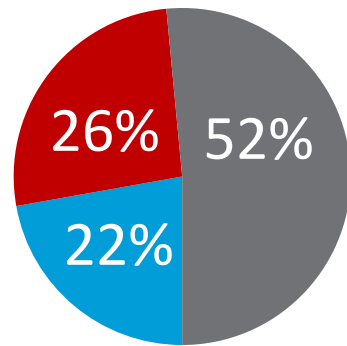

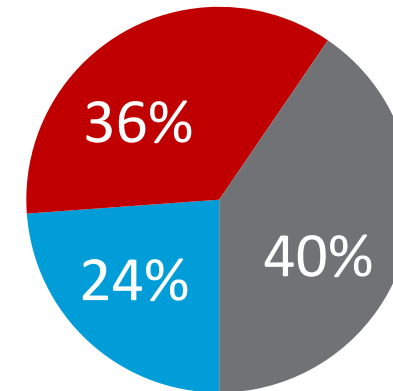

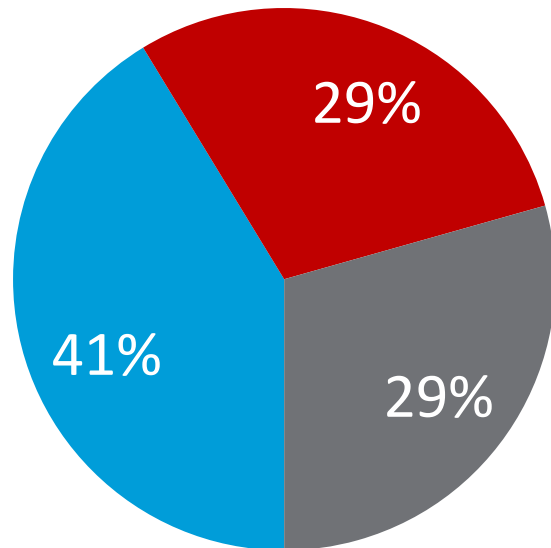

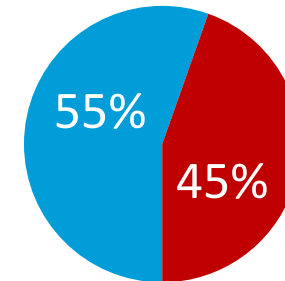

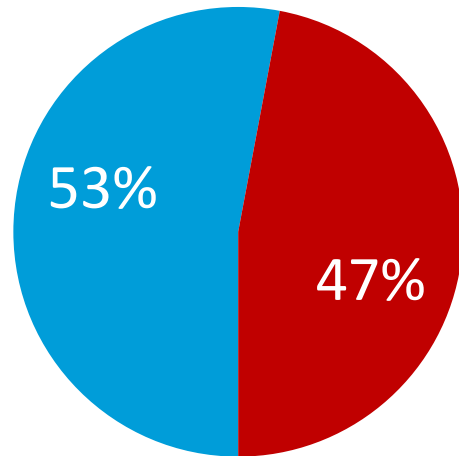

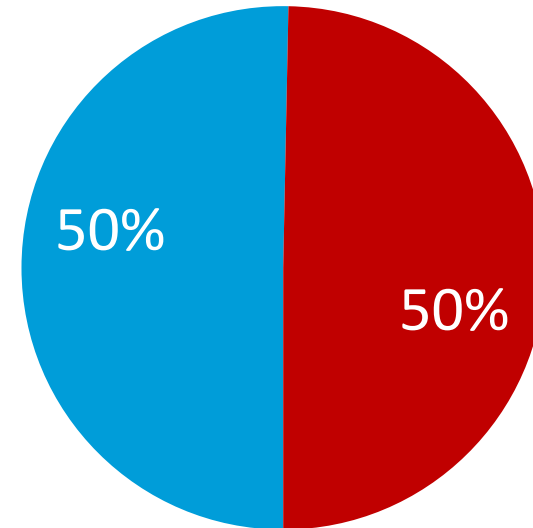

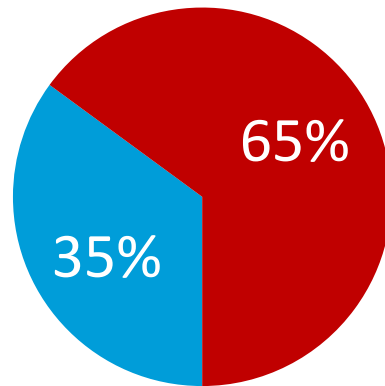

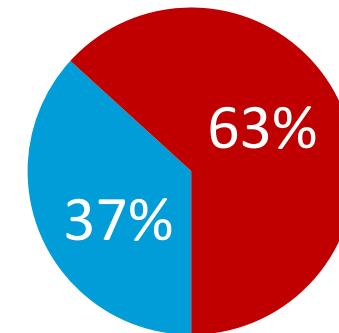

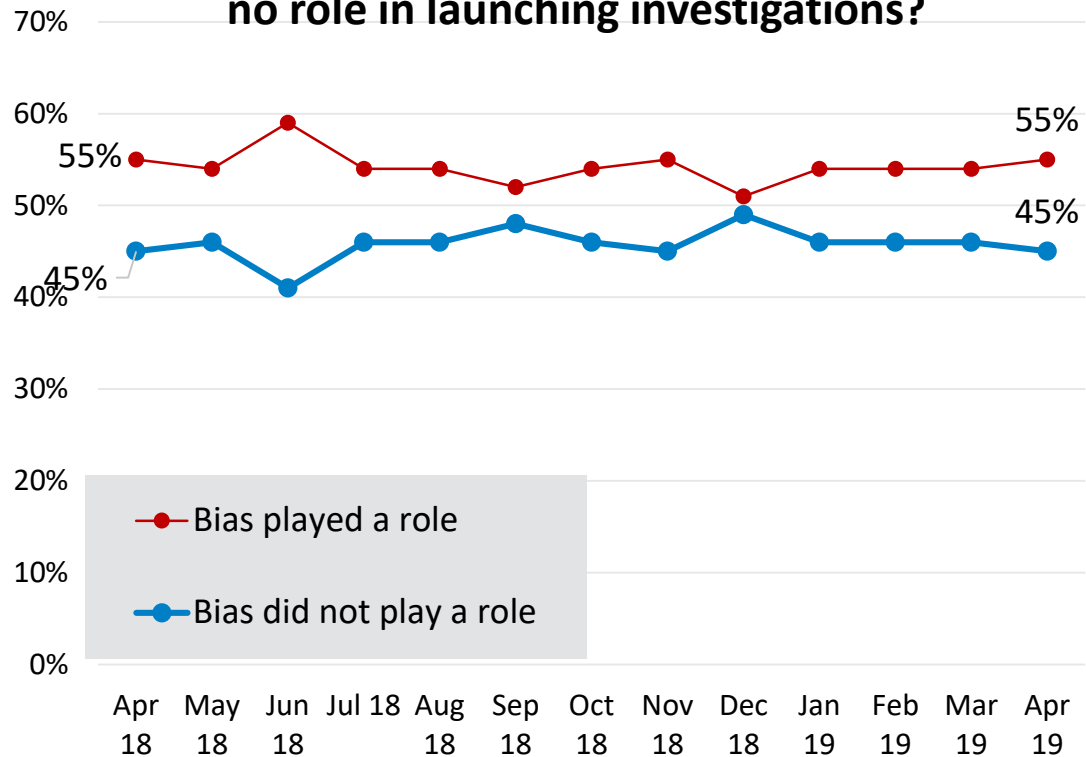

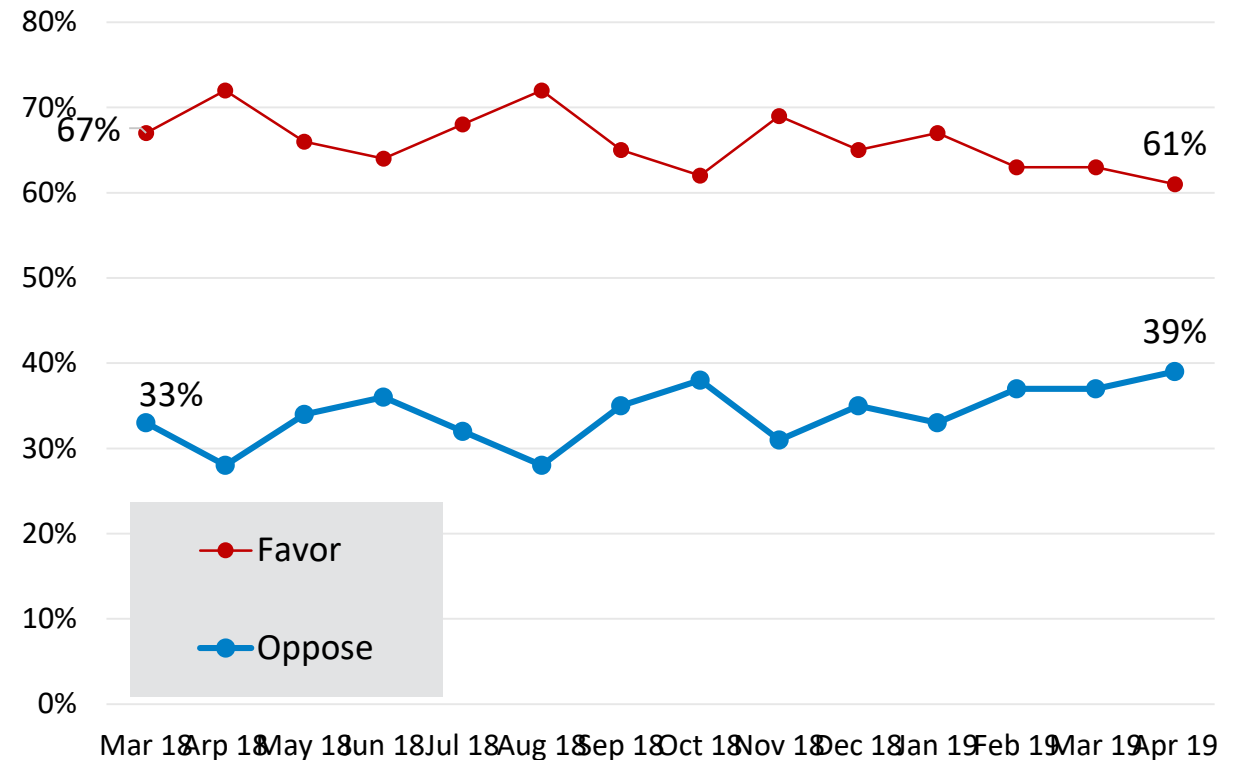

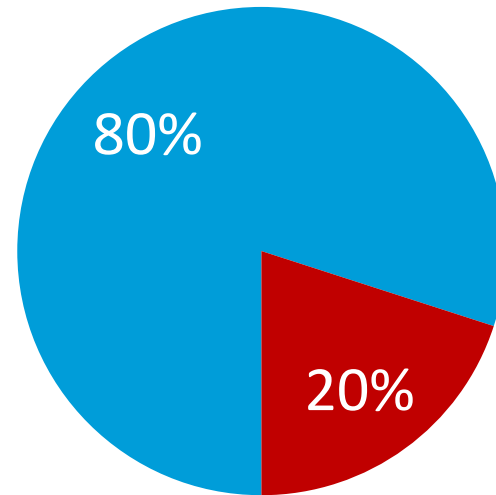

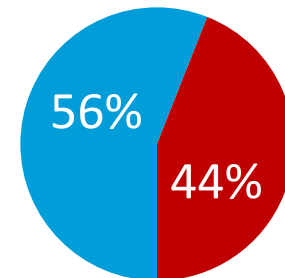

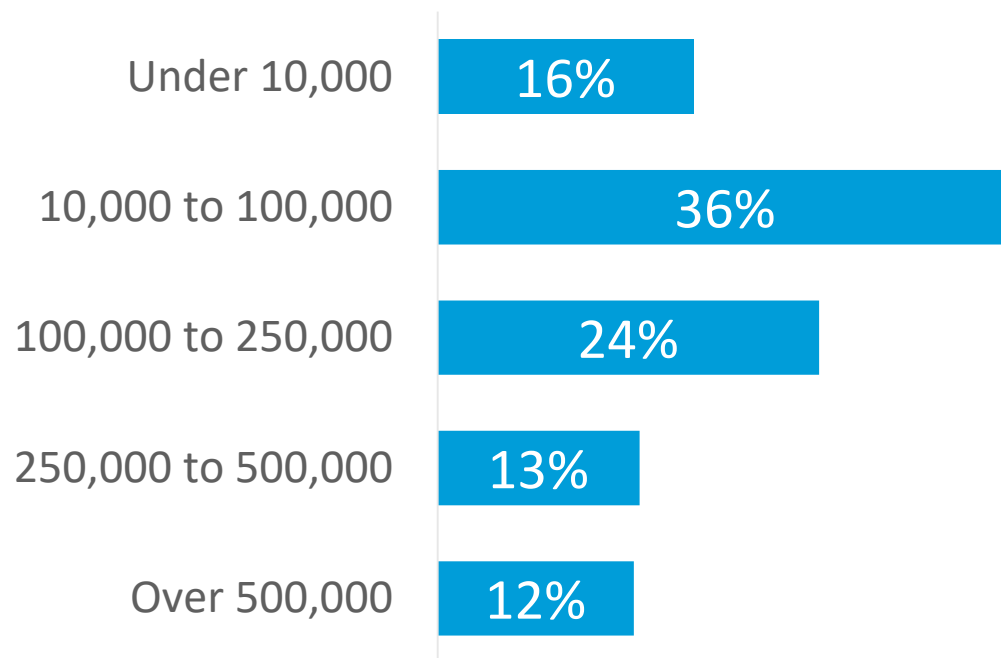
Do you think there is a growing humanitarian and security crisis at our border with Mexico, or is this mainly a manufactured political crisis ahead of the 2020 elections?



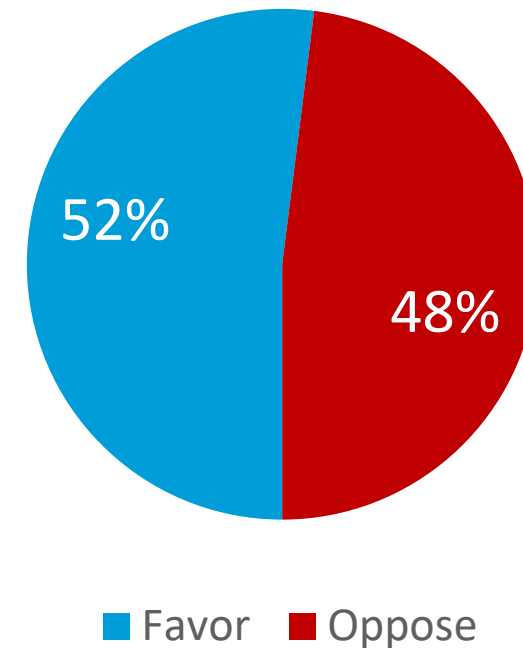

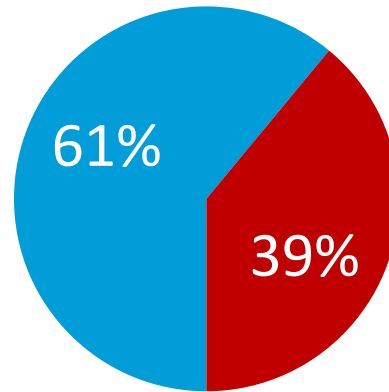

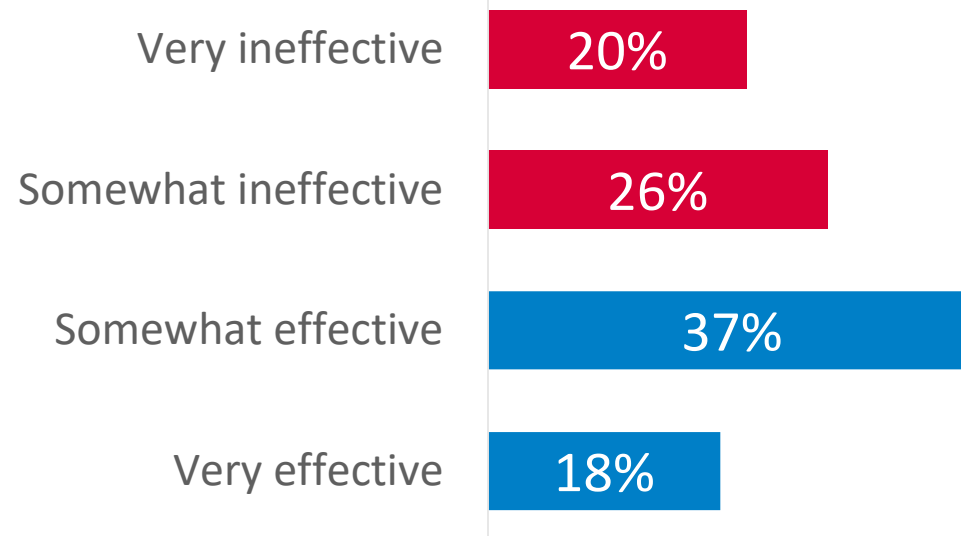

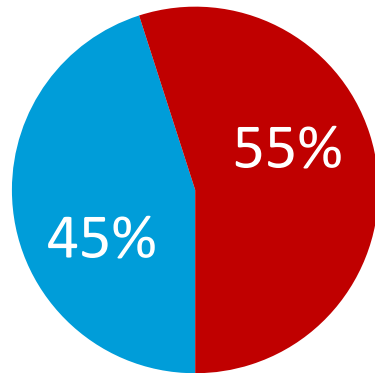

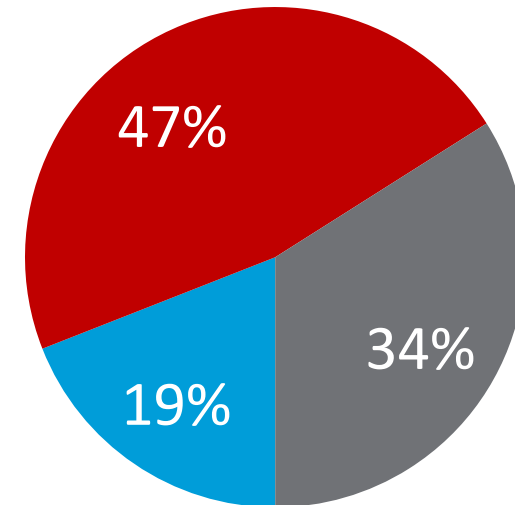

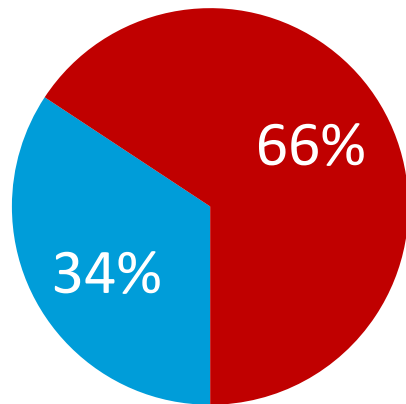

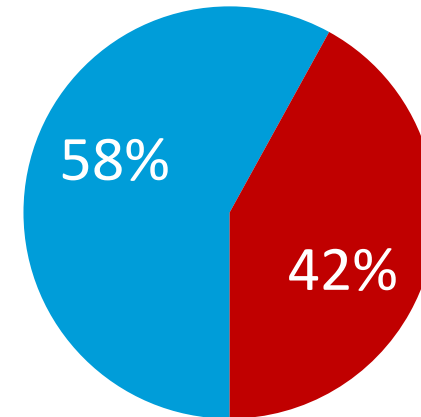

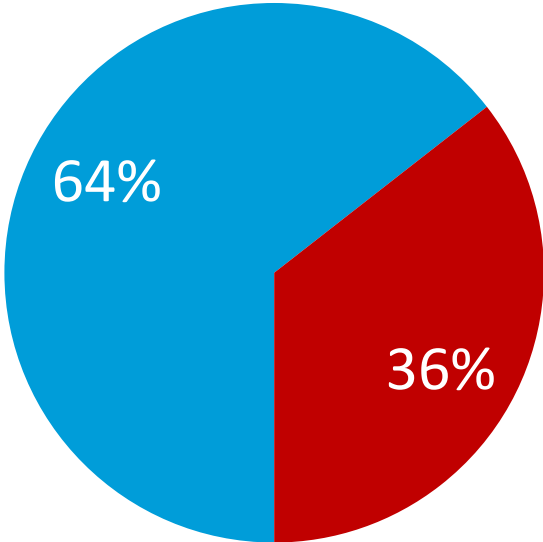

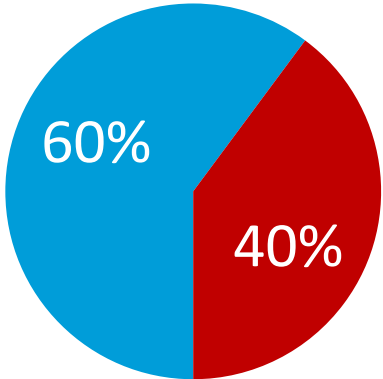

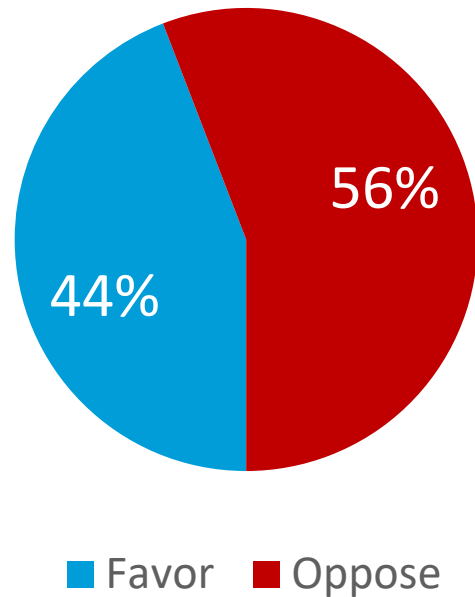

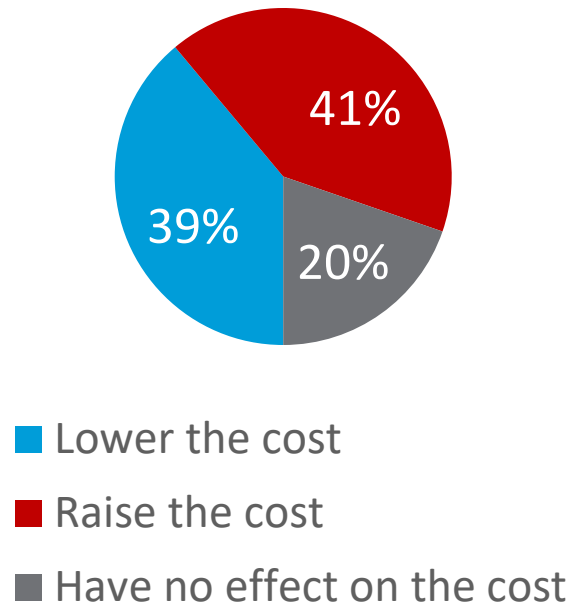

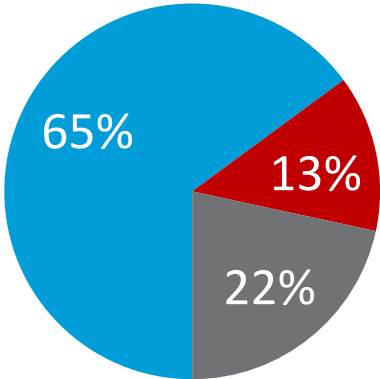

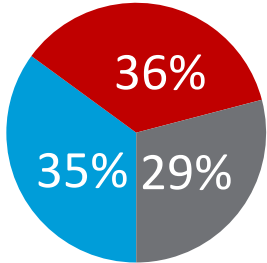

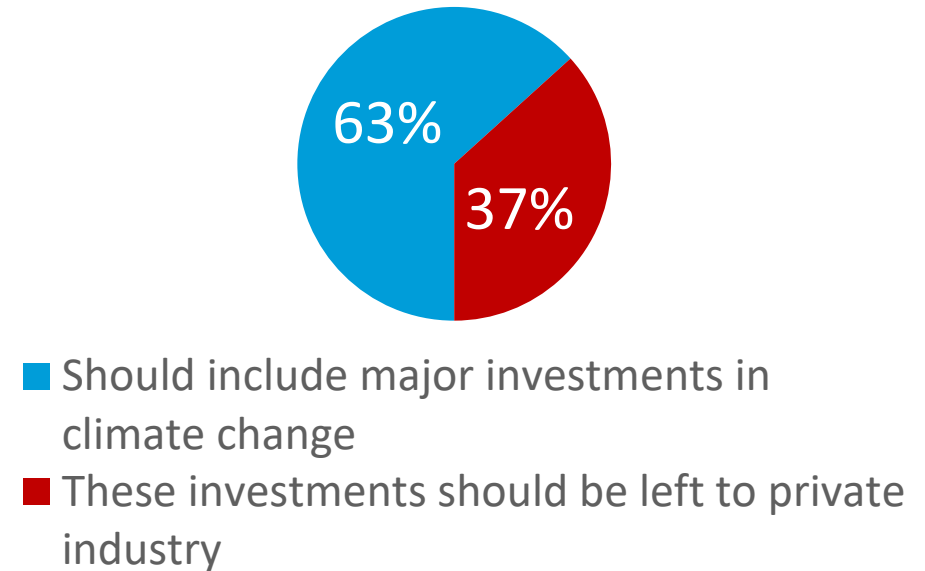

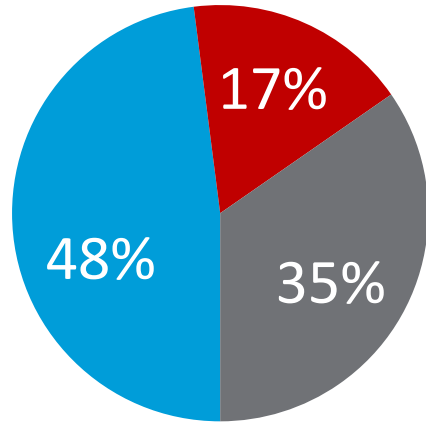

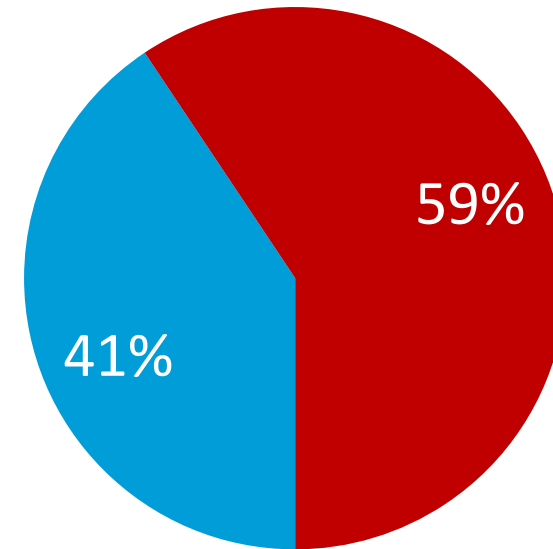

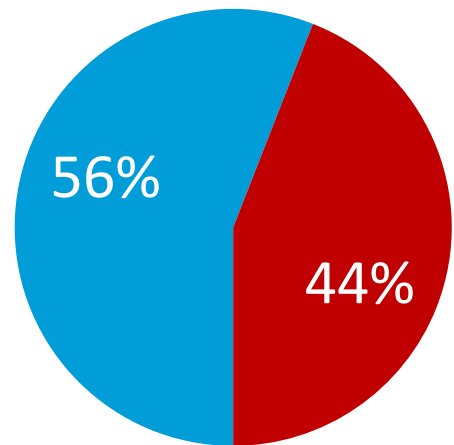

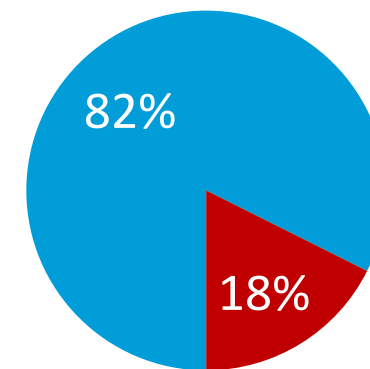

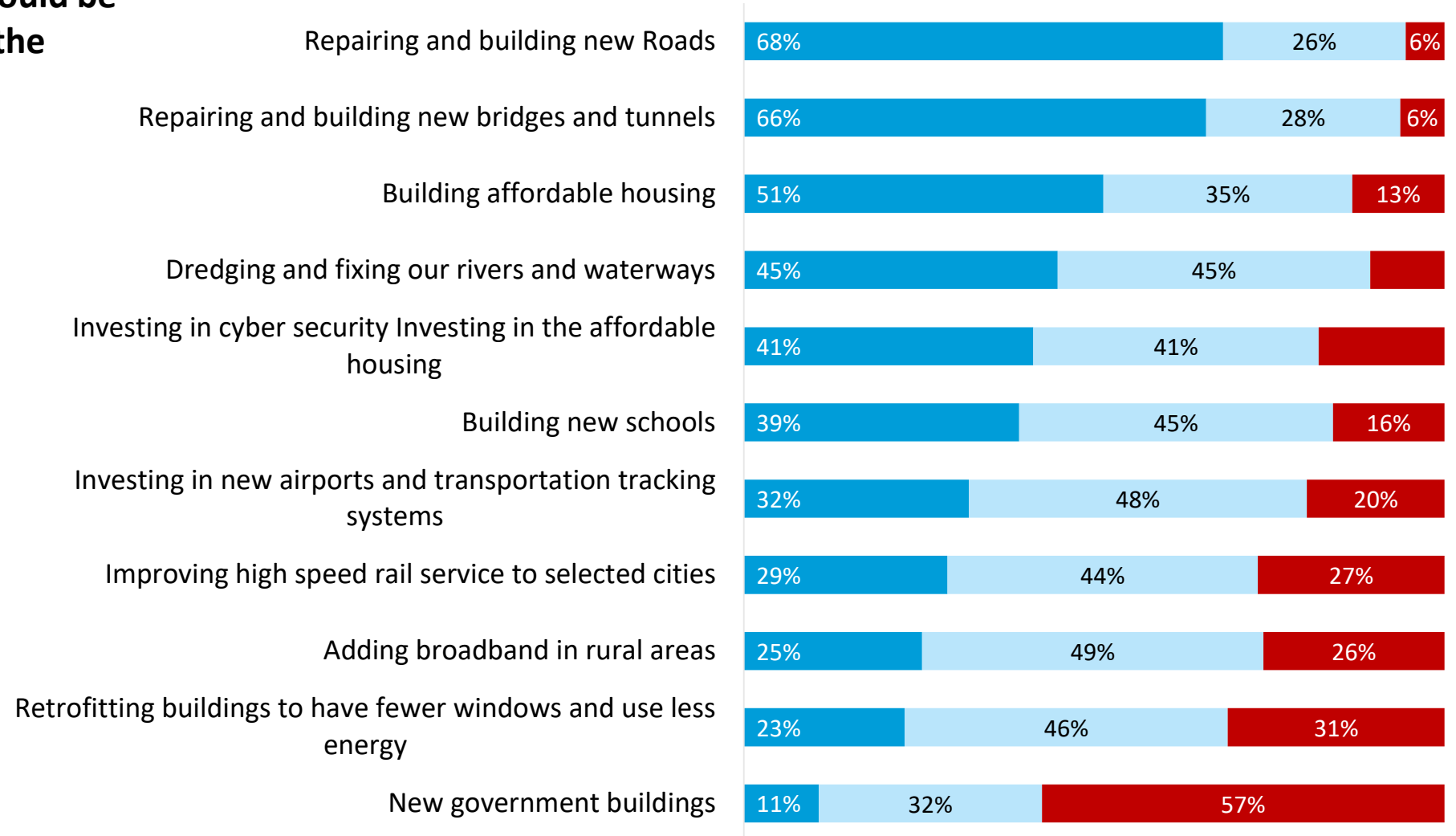

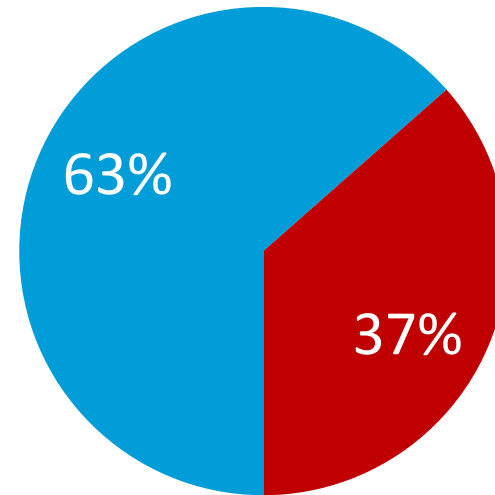

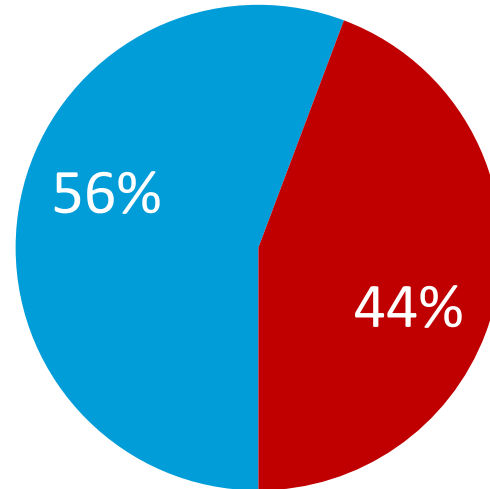
Should we build infrastructure projects in anticipation of climate change effects like dams for rising water on the coasts or is it too early to invest in such projects?

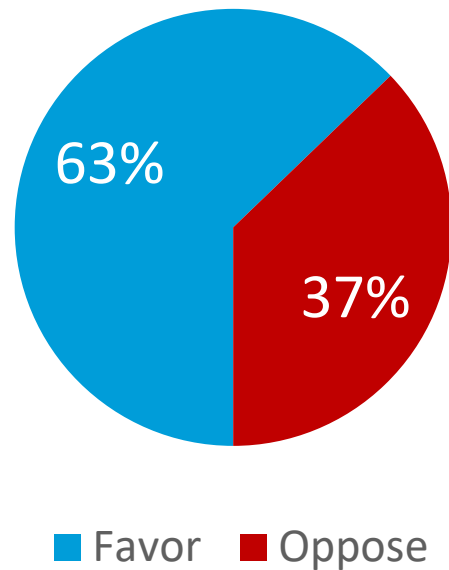

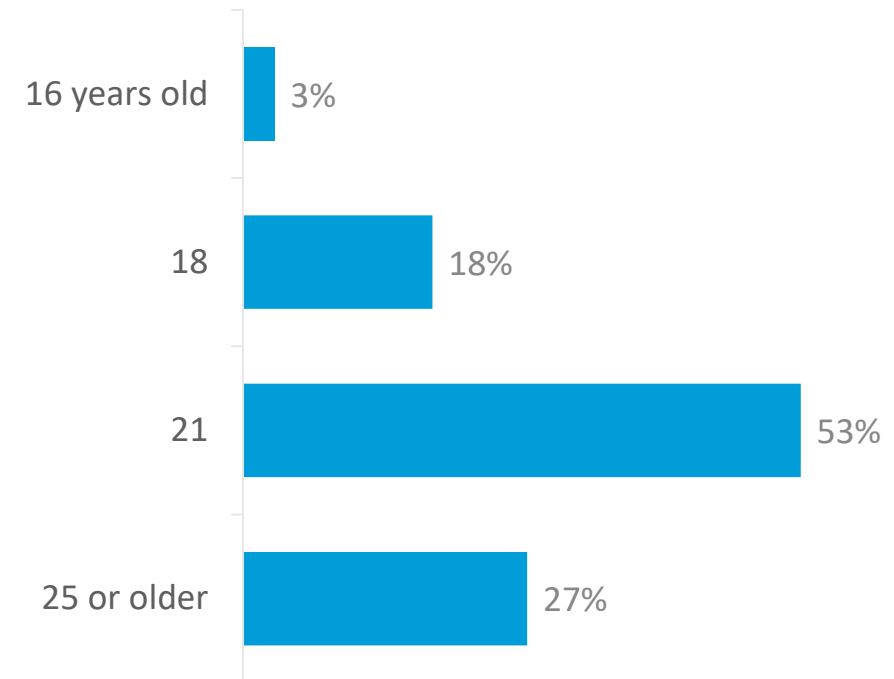

If marijuana were legalized, at what age do you think people should be allowed to purchase it?



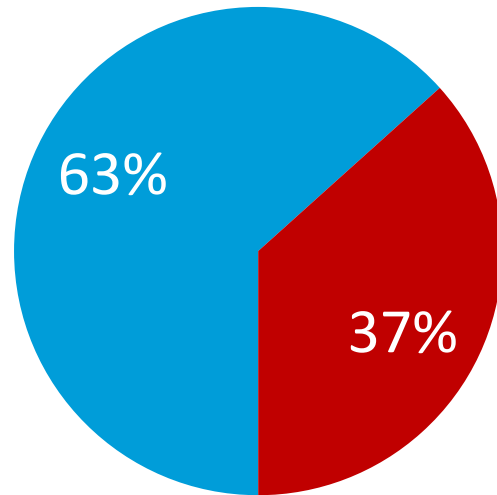

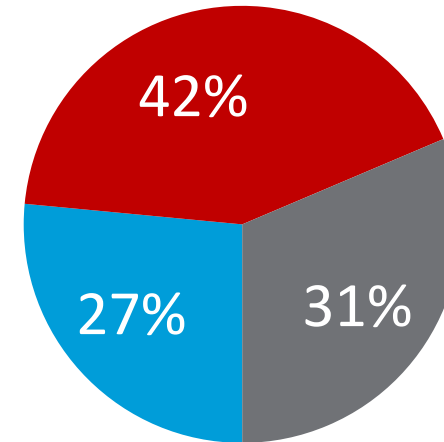

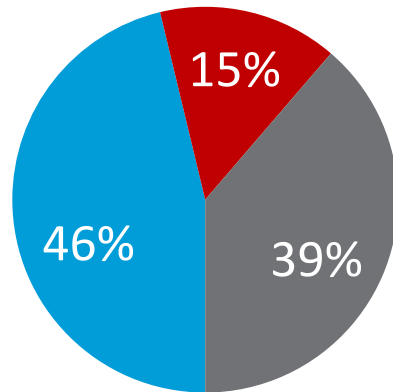

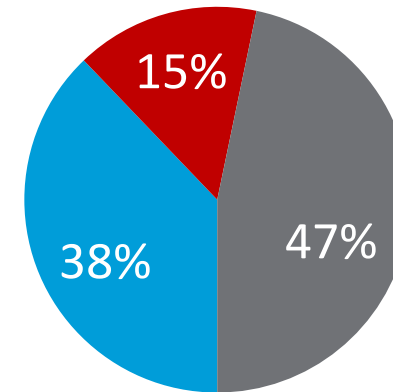

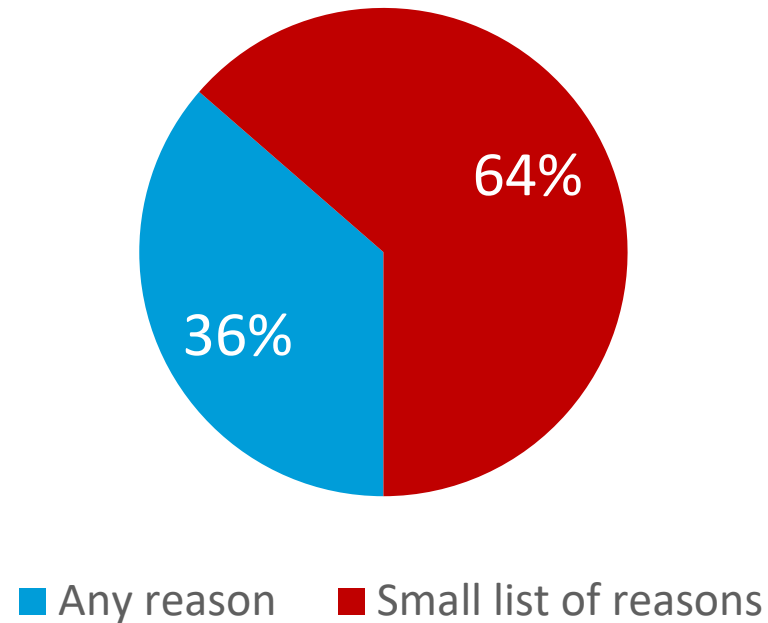

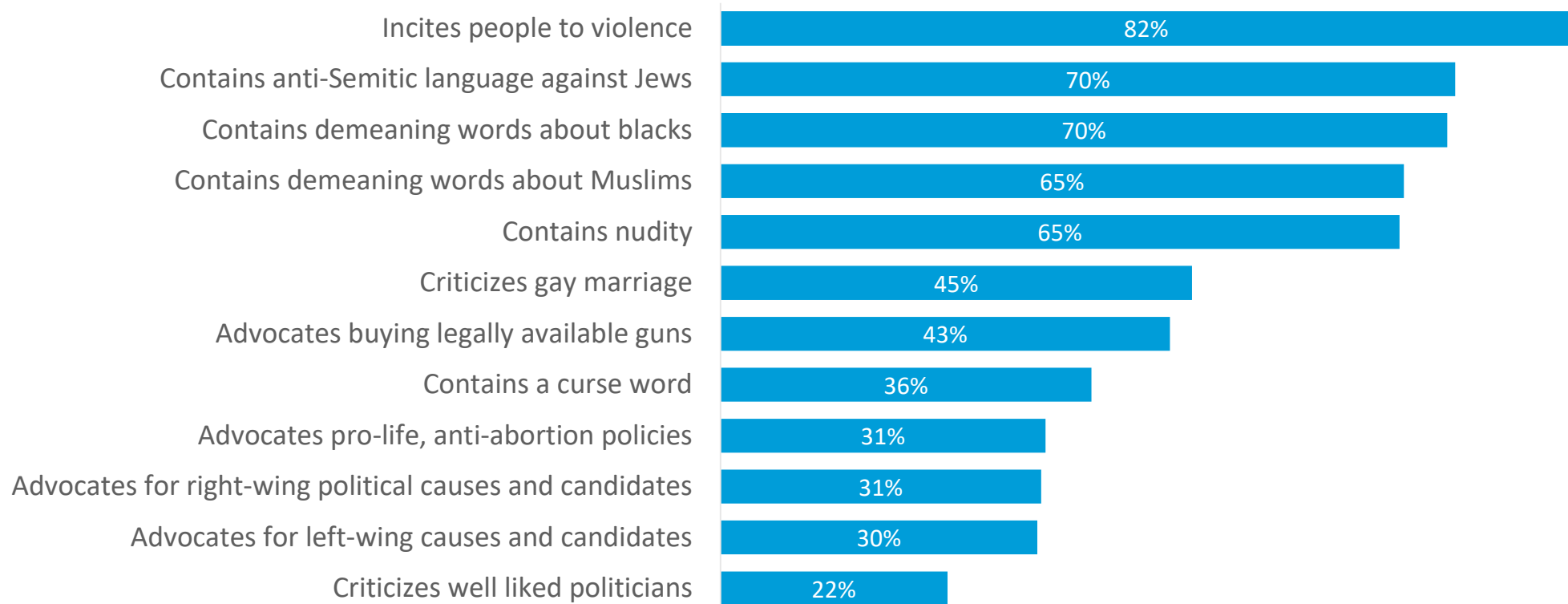

Do you think that internet platforms like Facebook, Google and others should have the right to censor posts from their networks for any reason or only a small list of reasons?



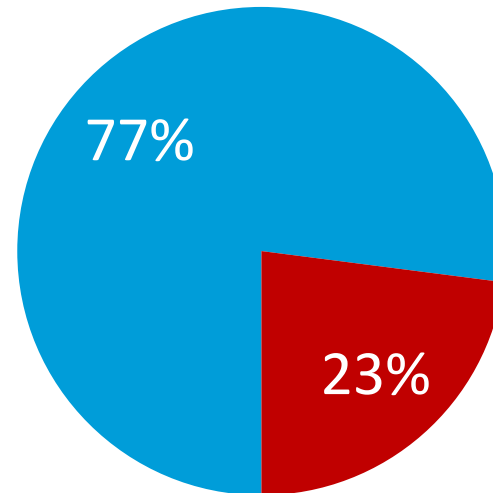

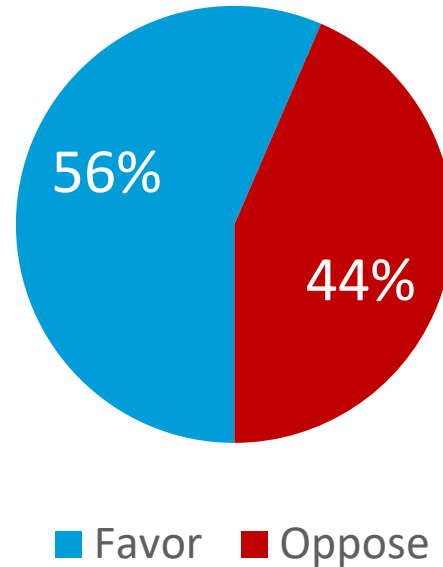

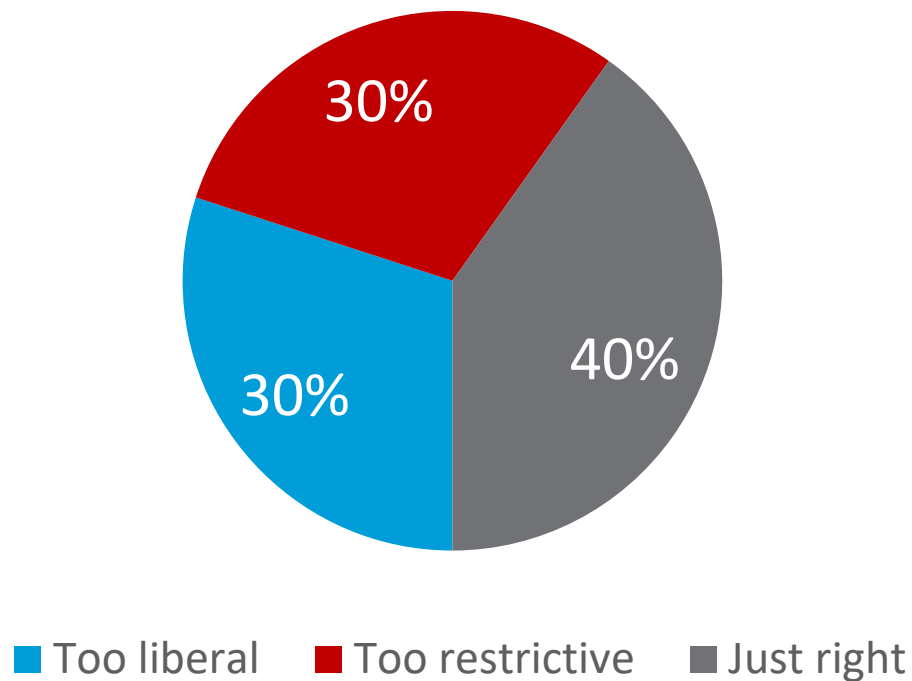

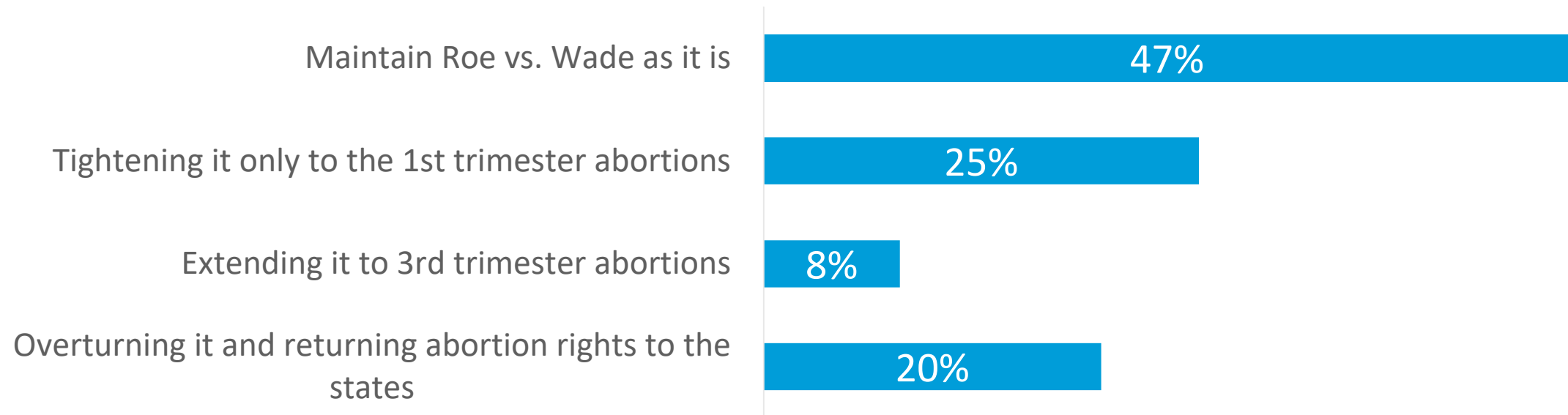
VOTERS SPLIT ON WHETHER CURRENT ABORTION LAWS ARE TOO LIBERAL OR TOO RESTRICTIVE

Do you think our current abortion laws are too liberal, too restrictive or just right?



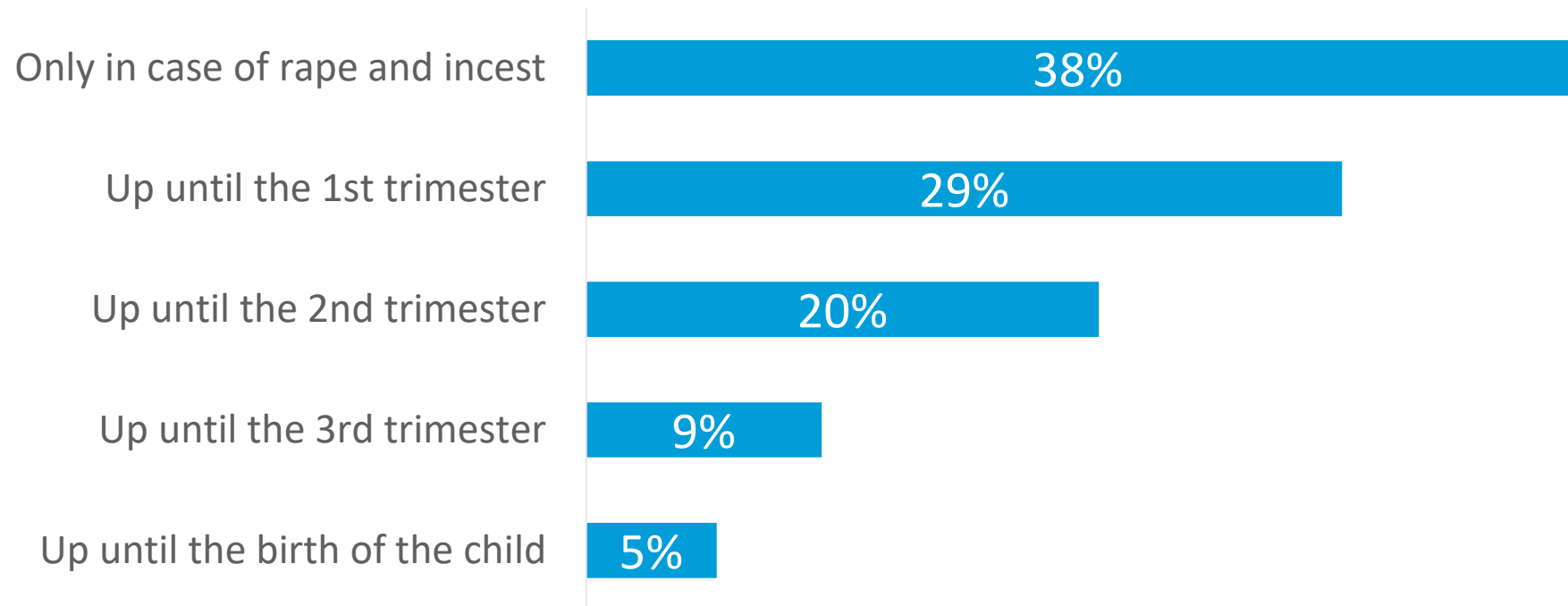
