#### **SURVEY METHOD**

This survey was conducted online within the United States from November 16-17, 2022 among 2,212 registered voters by The Harris Poll and HarrisX.

Results were weighted for age within gender, region, race/ethnicity, marital status, household size, income, employment, education, political party, and political ideology where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Propensity score weighting was also used to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online.







#### **U.S. Economy: Right Track / Wrong Track**



## How strong do you think the U.S. economy is today?




## MOST AMERICANS STILL SAY THEIR FINANCIAL SITUATION IS WORSENING



## In general, are you feeling optimistic or pessimistic about your life over the next year?




# Do you think the U.S. is in a recession now, will be in a recession in the next year or most likely will avoid a recession?

#### **President Biden Overall Approval**









#### What would you say are the most important issues facing the country today?
























Are the results of the midterm elections that happened last week legitimate or not legitimate?



































Do you support or oppose letting people vote early in advance of election day?



















If the Republican presidential primary for the 2024 election was held today, who would you vote for? (GOP voters)




If former President Donald Trump does not run for president in 2024, who would you vote for in the GOP primary? (GOP voters)



If the Democratic presidential primary for the 2024 election was held today, who would you vote for? (DEM voters)




















