

This survey was conducted online within the United States from November 15-16 among 2,851 registered voters by The Harris Poll and HarrisX.

Results were weighted for age within gender, region, race/ethnicity, marital status, household size, income, employment, education, political party, and political ideology where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Propensity score weighting was also used to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online.






How strong do you think the U.S. economy is today?


Would you say that your personal financial situation is improving or getting worse?



Do you think the U.S. is in a recession now, will be in a recession in the next year or most likely will avoid a recession?
















Do you approve or disapprove of the way Congress is doing its job?










Is Joe Biden mentally fit to serve as President of the United States or do you have doubts about his fitness for office? (Split sample)








Who would be your second choice for the Republican nomination for president?



Do you think Donald Trump will win or lose the Republican primary for president?









Would you say there is a strong chance, some chance, or not really any chance that you support a candidate other than Donald Trump in the Republican presidential primary?


Would you still vote for Donald Trump for president if he was convicted of any crimes or would you not vote for him if that was the case?



If President Biden decides not to run again in 2024, who would you prefer to be the Democratic candidate?












































Do you think Joe Biden can run an effective campaign for president or is he unable to run an effective campaign?






Do you think the prosecutions of Donald Trump are fair and unbiased or are they politically motivated?






























Do you think that the increase in crime is the fault of woke politicians or other factors?










Would you favor or oppose the justice department intervening in cities where local District Attorneys have reduced their prosecution of violent offenders?






























































Who is primarily responsible for putting civilians in Gaza in harm's way - Hamas or Israel?


































Which of the following is a bigger problem in the country today - antisemitism/ hatred of Jews or Islamophobia/ hatred of Muslims?

Do you think antisemitism is prevalent in university campuses today or not?






