
# HARVARD CAPS HARRIS

This survey was conducted online within the United States from February 21-22 among **2,022 registered voters** by The Harris Poll and HarrisX.

Results were weighted for age within gender, region, race/ethnicity, marital status, household size, income, employment, education, political party, and political ideology where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Propensity score weighting was also used to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online.










#### How strong do you think the U.S. economy is today?




















































Is Joe Biden mentally fit to serve as President of the United States or do you have doubts about his fitness for office? (Split sample)














































Do you think Donald Trump has committed crimes for which he should be convicted, or has he not committed any crimes?






Do you think Donald Trump has committed crimes for which he will be convicted, or do you think he will not be convicted of any crimes?
























#### MOST VOTERS AGREE THAT THE COUNTRY NEEDS BIPARTISAN LEGISLATION AND A NEW PRESIDENT




































