

This survey was conducted online within the United States from March 20-21 among 2,111 **registered voters** by The Harris Poll and HarrisX.

Results were weighted for age within gender, region, race/ethnicity, marital status, household size, income, employment, education, political party, and political ideology where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Propensity score weighting was also used to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online.







PERCEPTION OF THE U.S. ECONOMY ALSO SLIGHTLY UP, WITH 44% SAYING IT IS STRONG TODAY




How strong do you think the U.S. economy is today?












































Did you have the opportunity to watch President Biden's State of the Union address this year or not?








Was President Biden's speech appropriately focused on the key issues facing the country and possible solutions, or was it too political and not solutions focused?






Is Joe Biden mentally fit to serve as President of the United States or do you have doubts about his fitness for office? (Split sample)



Do you think Joe Biden is improving as a president, getting worse or staying the same?






Do President Biden's public appearances give credibility to the fears about his age and memory or are his public appearances just fine?






Is electing a President who raises questions about age, failing memory or lapsed concentration potentially dangerous for the country or are such fears being overblown politically?

























































































We need to focus on incentivizing and expanding access to innovative, preventative medicines, that stop diseases before they take hold.

Elected officials should ensure health insurance companies and other middlemen are held accountable for their role in keeping patients from the medicines they need.

We need to encourage pharmaceutical companies to continue investing in research and development by strengthening the incentives for creating new medicines and treatments.

Require health insurance companies and their middlemen to pass the rebates and discounts they receive to patients, so no patient has to pay more for their prescription medicines than their insurance company.


Require all health insurance plans to cover certain medications used to treat chronic conditions from day one of the plan year, instead of making people patients wait until they get through their deductible.

Require health insurance companies to count patient assistance, such as copay coupons and cost sharing assistance, toward the people's the patient's deductibles

Require health insurance companies to cover medicines from day one by offering at least some health plan options that exclude medicines from deductibles and only charge set copay amounts

Cap the amount of cost sharing, such as deductibles and coinsurance, that patients must pay out-of-pocket to get their medicines

Require health insurance companies and their middlemen to determine people's out-of-pocket costs at the pharmacy counter based on the discounted price that they negotiate for themselves, not the full price
