

Field Dates: May 15-16, 2024



This survey was conducted online within the United States from May 15-16, 2024 among 1,660 **registered voters** by The Harris Poll and HarrisX.

Respondents for this poll are recruited through opt-in, web-panel recruitment sampling. Recruitment occurs though a broad variety of professional, validated respondent panels to expand the sampling frame as wide as possible and minimize the impact of any given panel on recruiting methods.

Results are weighted for age within gender, region, race/ethnicity, marital status, household size, income, employment, education, political party, and political ideology where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Propensity score weighting was also used to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online. The margin of error for the total sample is +/- 2%.







PERCEPTION OF THE U.S. ECONOMY IS STEADY, WITH 42% SAYING IT IS STRONG TODAY




How strong do you think the U.S. economy is today?













Do you approve or disapprove of the way Congress is doing its job?






























Do you want Joe Biden and Donald Trump to debate each other in the lead up to the Presidential election?









MOST VOTERS CONTINUE TO SAY THEY HAVE CONCERNS ABOUT BIDEN'S AGE AND MENTAL FITNESS




Is Joe Biden mentally fit to serve as President of the United States or do you have doubts about his fitness for office? (Split sample)



Do you think Joe Biden is improving as a president, getting worse or staying the same?




























Do you think Donald Trump has committed crimes for which he will be convicted, or do you think he will not be convicted of any crimes?




























































