

Field Date: November 13-14, 2024



This survey was conducted online within the United States on November 13-14, 2024 among 1,732 **registered voters** by The Harris Poll and HarrisX.

Respondents for this poll are recruited through opt-in, web-panel recruitment sampling. Recruitment occurs though a broad variety of professional, validated respondent panels to expand the sampling frame as wide as possible and minimize the impact of any given panel on recruiting methods.

Results are weighted for age within gender, region, race/ethnicity, marital status, household size, income, employment, education, political party, and political ideology where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Propensity score weighting was also used to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online. The margin of error for the total sample is +/- 2.3 pts on a 95% confidence level.






% Who Say "Right Track"





PERCEPTION OF THE ECONOMY IS UP SLIGHTLY, WITH 42% SAYING IT IS STRONG TODAY





Do you think your personal economics right now are excellent, good, fair or poor?







Do you approve or disapprove the job that Donald Trump is doing as presidentelect?













HARRIS WON WITH MAIL-IN VOTERS, BUT TRUMP WON WITH IN-PERSON VOTERS AND INDEPENDENTS




How did you vote in the 2024 presidential election: by mail, in person before Election Day, or in person on Election Day?





When did you make up your mind on who you were voting for?
















Do you think Donald Trump has been trying to unify the country since the election or has he been acting to divide the country?














How closely did you follow the 2024 Presidential Election?



ALMOST HALF OF THE VOTERS PRIMARILY USED TV NEWS CHANNELS TO FOLLOW ELECTION NEWS




Which of the following channels, platforms, or mediums did you primarily use to follow news leading into and coming out of Tuesday's 2024 Presidential Election?















Do you think the mainstream news media is giving you fair coverage of issues or is tilting coverage for political ends?





Which, if any, of the following celebratory endorsements were you aware of heading into the 2024 Presidential Election?




