

Field Dates: January 15-16, 2025



This survey was conducted online within the United States on January 15-16, 2025 among 2,650 **registered voters** by The Harris Poll and HarrisX.

Respondents for this poll are recruited through opt-in, web-panel recruitment sampling. Recruitment occurs though a broad variety of professional, validated respondent panels to expand the sampling frame as wide as possible and minimize the impact of any given panel on recruiting methods.

Results are weighted for age within gender, region, race/ethnicity, marital status, household size, income, employment, education, political party, and political ideology where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Propensity score weighting was also used to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online. The margin of error for the total sample is +/- 1.9 pts on a 95% confidence level.





PERCEPTION OF THE ECONOMY STEADY, WITH 2 IN 5 SAYING IT IS STRONG TODAY




How strong do you think the U.S. economy is today?

Do you think your personal economics right now are excellent, good, fair or poor?







Do you approve or disapprove the job that Donald Trump is doing as president-elect?







Do you approve or disapprove of the way Congress is doing its job?




TRUMP AND JD VANCE HAVE A NET POSITIVE FAVORABILITY HEADING INTO THE WHITE HOUSE








INFLATION REMAINS THE MOST IMPORTANT PERSONAL ISSUE TO VOTERS ACROSS PARTY LINES



Which of these issues is most important to you personally?








Do you think Donald Trump has been trying to unify the country since the election or has he been acting to divide the country?

Do you think the Biden administration has been trying to unify the country since the election or has he been acting to divide the country?






Do you support or oppose the dropping of all criminal charges against Donald Trump?

Do you think he will overturn the case against him in New York on appeal or not?










Do you approve or disapprove of the way Joe Biden is handling the transition process as outgoing president?





Do you favor or oppose Joe Biden's commutation of the sentences of 37 convicted murderers from the death penalty to life in prison?














Do you think the LA fires are an event that authorities could have been prepared for or is it an unavoidable natural disaster?






Do you think the State of California acted appropriately in its response to the LA fires, or has it been inadequate in its response?






Do you think Governor Newsom of California is guilty of mismanaging resources and making the fires worse, or he did everything he could?







Do you think TikTok presents a national security threat or not to the United States because the app is currently owned by the China-based parent company ByteDance?
















Who do you trust the most to regulate AI systems effectively?



















Agree/Disagree: The news media provided fair and balanced coverage of the election


