
HARVARD CAPS HARRIS







Field Dates: June 11-12, 2025



This survey was conducted online within the United States on June 11-12, 2025, among **2,097 registered voters** by The Harris Poll and HarrisX.

Respondents for this poll are recruited through opt-in, web-panel recruitment sampling. Recruitment occurs though a broad variety of professional, validated respondent panels to expand the sampling frame as wide as possible and minimize the impact of any given panel on recruiting methods.

Results are weighted for age within gender, region, race/ethnicity, marital status, household size, income, employment, education, political party, and political ideology where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Propensity score weighting was also used to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online. The margin of error for the total sample is +/- 2.2 pts on a 95% confidence level.








How strong do you think the U.S. economy is today?

Would you say that your personal financial situation is improving or getting worse?










DEMOCRATIC PARTY APPROVAL HOLDS STEADY AT 42%






Do you approve or disapprove of the way Congress is doing its job?














Is Donald Trump doing better than you expected as president, worse or about what you expected?














Do you think the Trump administration making the 2017 tax cuts permanent will lead to more money in your pocket and economic growth or will it not make a difference?








Do you think President Trump is making good deals on behalf of the country or do you think he is making bad deals just to appear successful?






Do you think Trump will solve the Ukraine war or not?










Do you support or oppose the administration's actions to close the southern border?


Do you support or oppose the administration's efforts to deport criminals who are here illegally?










Is it appropriate or not appropriate to call for challenging and resisting federal agents carrying out deportation raids?






Should sanctuary cities and states which oppose the administration's immigration policies deploy their police force to stop violence towards federal agents or should they not involve themselves?






Do you support or oppose the decision to bring in the national guard to help suppress anti-ICE riots?




















Do you believe the current level of U.S. federal government debt is sustainable or unsustainable?




















What do you think about the amount of taxes you pay?



Should any changes to the current tax system be revenue neutral, be designed to raise more revenue, or be designed to raise less revenue?
































Do you think Donald Trump's policies are making the U.S. economy stronger or weaker?






Are Donald Trump's policies leading to more or less investment in the country?
























Should Iran be allowed to obtain a nuclear weapon or not?


















Do you think Donald Trump has been too tough, not tough enough, or about right when dealing with Vladimir Putin and the Russians?




