
HARVARD CAPS HARRIS







Field Dates: November 4-6, 2025



This survey was conducted online within the United States on November 4-6, 2025, among **2,000 registered voters** by The Harris Poll and HarrisX.

Respondents for this poll are recruited through opt-in, web-panel recruitment sampling. Recruitment occurs though a broad variety of professional, validated respondent panels to expand the sampling frame as wide as possible and minimize the impact of any given panel on recruiting methods.

Results are weighted for age within gender, region, race/ethnicity, marital status, household size, income, employment, education, political party, and political ideology where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Propensity score weighting was also used to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online. The margin of error for the total sample is +/- 1.99 pts on a 95% confidence level.








How strong do you think the U.S. economy is today?

Would you say that your personal financial situation is improving or getting worse?


















INFLATION JUMPED +5PTS AS THE ISSUE MOST IMPORTANT TO VOTERS PERSONALLY



Which of these issues is most important to you personally?








Is Donald Trump doing better than you expected as president, worse or about what you expected?

Do you think that Donald Trump is doing a better or worse job as Joe Biden did as President?










Do you think Donald Trump's policies will make you:






Do you think President Trump is making good deals on behalf of the country or do you think he is making bad deals just to appear successful?






Do you think Trump will solve the Ukraine war or not?





Do you think that President Trump has exceeded his authority as president or is operating within his authority as president?







Does the government today mostly promote free speech and dissent, it is acting to stifle it, or is it behaving about the same as past administrations?








Compared to past administrations, do you think the government today has mainly reduced the use of law enforcement against political opponents, increased it, or is behaving about the same?






Do you support or oppose President Trump's construction of a new ballroom at the White House which is being funded by private donations instead of taxpayer funds?



Would you say President Trump is operating like a fascist dictator or is he just a strong president?








Do you support or oppose the government shutdown?

Who would you say is more to blame for the current government shutdown - Republicans or Democrats?










Do you think the Democrats behind the shutdown are just trying to please their base or have good reasons to shut the government down?










Do you support or oppose Republican leaders to scrap the filibuster rule in order to end the Government shutdown?

Do you think ending a government shutdown should require 51 or 60 votes in the Senate?






















Thinking about the challenges and worries you face, how well do you think the <u>Democratic</u> Party understands and prioritizes these issues that are most important to you?


















Do you think that Zohran Mamdani represents the Democratic party today or not really?






Has the Democratic Party moved too far to the left for you or are its policies still acceptable to you?
































Are Donald Trump's policies leading to more or less investment in the country?



Are Donald Trump's tariff policies boosting or harming the economy?


























Do you support or oppose additional economic sanctions on Russia to try to force it to end the war?

Do you support or oppose the Trump administration providing offensive military weapons to Ukraine to even the scales of war and force Russia to abandon the war?




Do you think that governments that buy oil and gas from Russia should be punished with tariffs or should they not be punished for buying that oil?

Do you think Europe should stop buying oil from Russia and buy it from the United States instead if it were practical?





- Not continue for fear of antagonizing








Do you think the actions of the Maduro regime in Venezuela threaten U.S. national security or do they not do so?
